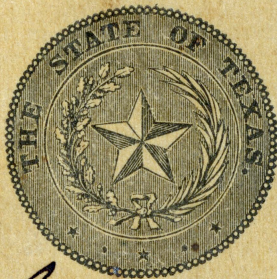

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO TEACHER

1. (a) When a pupil is admitted to your room or section, **place E** in the square for that day and fill the blanks calling for **personal data**, viz: his name, date of birth, age, information about parent or guardian, number of years in this grade and in school previous to this year, and **source of pupil**. If this pupil is an **Original Entry in the public schools of this State**, he must be coded either B1 or B2. If this pupil is not an Original Entry, he is a **Re-entry**, and must be coded C1, C2, . . . or C8. See **Explanation of Terms**.

(b) When this pupil withdraws or drops out, **place W** in the square for that day. By proper code, D1, D2, D3, or D4, indicate the **cause** of his withdrawal or leaving school. This pupil is either **present** or **absent** from the date of his admission to the date of his withdrawal. (A pupil is to be considered dropped or withdrawn only when he **permanently** severs his connection with your room or section.) The former practice of dropping a pupil after 3, 5, or 10 days' absence is to be discontinued. See **Explanation of Terms**.

(c) Should this pupil come back to your room or section, after previous withdrawal or discharge, **place R** in the square for the day he is re-admitted. Since his name already appears on your roll, the personal data will be found in the appropriate blanks.

2. A **scholastic** for the year 1932-33 is any person who was six, and not eighteen years of age, on the 1st day of September 1932.

3. (a) Blank squares indicate present and not tardy.

(b) If a pupil is absent all day, indicate by writing an **a** in proper square \boxed{a} ; if absent in forenoon only, indicate with an **a** in upper left corner of square $\boxed{a/}$; likewise for afternoon, $\boxed{/a}$. In a similar manner use letter "**t**" to indicate when pupil is tardy.

4. A Teacher's Monthly Report form is based upon information found in Table 1A of this register.

5. The law requires that all monthly and term reports shall be made under oath, and county superintendents are empowered to administer oaths for such purposes. County superintendents and county judges shall receive no compensation for administering oaths in transacting business relating to school affairs.

6. The law requires that the county superintendent **not approve** a teacher's voucher for the last month until this Register and all other reports due from the teacher are received and approved by him.

7. Provision is made in this Register for a system of coding pupils that will permit you as teacher, to account accurately for all pupils and to report reliable data on enrollment and attendance.

8. To find the length of your school year in days, legal holidays and all days allowed for attending Teachers' Institute must be added to the number of days the school has actually been taught. In other words, the length of the school year is the number of days for which the teacher has been paid.

Enrollment is defined as the total number of different pupils admitted (enrolled in) to the schools of the school unit in question. It is readily recognized that the enrollment in an individual teacher's room will include pupils previously counted in the enrollment of another teacher in the same or other schools in the same system or county, or in the State. In order that a uniform procedure may be used by all schools in the State in the future, the following formulas must be used:

*ENROLLMENT FORMULAS for

I. A CLASSROOM IN

(a) Common School District: $B3 + C1 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C7$.

(b) Independent School District: $B3 + C1 + C2 + C5 + C6 + C7$.

This formula is used by a teacher of a room, grade, or section of a grade. In one-teacher schools this would also be the school enrollment.

II. A SCHOOL IN

(a) Common School District: $B3 + C2 + C3 + C4 + C7$.

(b) Independent School District: $B3 + C2 + C5 + C6 + C7$.

This formula is used by head teacher, or principal of any school with two or more teachers. (See I above.)

III. SYSTEM OF SCHOOLS IN

(a) Common School District: $B3 + C3 + C4 + C7$.

(b) Independent School District: $B3 + C5 + C6 + C7$.

(c) A County (by County Supt.): $B3 + C4 + C7$.

This formula is used by principals or superintendents in systems containing 2 or more schools.

IV. COUNTY AS A WHOLE (C. S. D.+Ind. Dists.): $B3 + C7$.

This formula is used by the State in determining the enrollment in a county, including C. S. D. and Ind. Dists. within its boundaries.

V. STATE: $B3$.

This formula is used by the State in determining the enrollment in all the public schools in all C. S. D. and in all Ind. Dists. within its boundaries.

**RULES AND DIRECTIONS FOR REQUISITIONING, CARING FOR, AND DISTRIBUTING
FREE TEXT BOOKS.**

The text book law provides that the books adopted by the Board under the provisions of that act shall be used as text books, to the exclusion of all others, in the public schools provided that nothing shall be construed to prevent the use of supplementary books. "When supplementary books other than those selected by the Text Book Board are used they shall be furnished at prices fixed by the trustees of the school in which they are used and approved by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction."

1. Responsibility—

A. The Texas State Board of Education has ruled that each teacher in a one-room school or in a system of schools is responsible for the care and distribution of textbooks loaned to the children in the school room over which she presides or the texts in the subject or subjects she teaches.

B. It shall be the duty of the teacher to inspect not less than twice each month the books loaned by the State to her pupils in order to stimulate proper interest in keeping the books covered as required by law and in safeguarding the books against unnecessary wear.

C. Each teacher shall be required to make accurate reports as required by law to the superintendent of schools, and the last month's salary shall not be paid to the teacher who fails to make a reasonable accounting for all textbooks for which she is held responsible.

2. Book Sales—

Article 2876 d. of the State Free Text Book Law provides that textbooks may be bought from local boards of trustees by pupils or parents of pupils attending the public schools of the State, the boards to furnish the books at the net price. Teachers shall not, in any case, sell text books belonging to the State. Pupils or parents of pupils desiring to purchase text books may do so from the superintendent, or the custodian. The sale of books must be confined to new books only, and no discount is allowed on books sold.

3. Book Fines—

A. Fines Collected on Lost Books: If a child loses a new book he should be required to pay the full retail price. A book is considered new until it has been used one full year. If a child loses a used book, he should be required to pay for the book, allowing a 20 per cent discount for each year used.

B. Fines Collected on Damaged Books: If a child damages a new book beyond use, he should be required to pay the full net price.

If a child damages a used book beyond use, he should be required to pay for the book, allowing 20 per cent discount for each year used.

If a book is damaged, but not sufficiently to cause it to be discarded, the pupil should be fined in proportion to the damage done. The book, in this case, would remain the property of the State.

Superintendents, principals and teachers should use discretion in assessing fines. A pupil should not be charged for books that health officers require destroyed because of contagious disease, or for those burned in the loss of a home by fire, or for those lost in other non-preventable accidents.

If a pupil or his parent or guardian refuses to pay the fine on a lost or damaged book, the pupil should be deprived of the benefits of free text books until the fine is paid. Reasonable wear is to be expected and should not be penalized.

All moneys collected as fines from the pupils or parents of pupils on account of lost or damaged books shall be immediately turned over to the superintendent of schools who shall forward the same to the State Department of Education, Text Book Division. Failure on the part of the superintendent, principals or teachers to make such report promptly shall be sufficient ground for forfeiture of the last month's salary.

4. Text Book Custodian—

District boards of trustees may designate one of the trustees, the superintendent, principal, teacher, or other employee as the proper person to enter into bond in the sum of fifty per cent in excess of the value of the books consigned to them by the State. It is not the intention of the law that a trustee or his representative giving bond should be required to replace books lost or damaged by pupils. The purpose of the bond is to make sure that all boards will see that responsible persons are selected as consignees of the books. The bond may be an individual bond, and need not be executed by a surety company. The custodian to whom the books are to be shipped must be under bond before requisition for books will be honored.

5. Book Covers—

Under Article 2876 c. teachers must require pupils to cover all books consigned to them. Covers of heavy paper are preferable to those of cloth. Patent book covers may be used if desired, or paper book covers supplied by merchants as advertisements, or the teacher may require the pupils to make their own book covers out of good grade Kraft paper. The teacher must require the pupil to remove the book covers when the books are returned. If a pupil refuses to cover his books, he should be deprived of them until he is willing to comply with the rules.

6. Book Cards—

Duplicate book cards for all pupils are supplied by the State Text Book Division. The law requires that teachers must enter on these cards the name of the child, the name and residence of his parent or guardian, and fill in the proper blanks designating the school attended. On these cards the number of each book issued to the pupil must be entered opposite the name of the book. When a book is returned its number must be cancelled by drawing a line on the card through the number. When all books are returned, both cards are receipted by the teacher, and one card given to the pupil. The duplicate card must be filed with the principal, superintendent or school trustee. The pupil's card receipt must also be signed as approved by the principal or superintendent, except in the case of one-teacher schools. Book cards given as receipts to pupils in rural schools must also show the name and address of the trustees to whom the books are consigned, or the name of some responsible person to whom application can be made for a duplicate card in case of loss. In rural schools the trustee should assume charge of the duplicate book cards while the school is closed, these to be turned over to the teacher on resumption of the work. In case of loss of a book card, the child should be given a copy of the card in the possession of the school, unless there is evidence that fraud is intended.

7. Requisitions—

An original requisition for books for each session must be made by the head teacher, principal or superintendent near the close of the preceding session. All requisitions for common school districts must be sent to the county superintendent. County superintendents and superintendents of independent school districts and all common school districts classified as first class four year high schools are required to send an original requisition to the State Text Book Division. This requisition must conform to all of the instructions contained on the blank. It must give the total number of usable copies of each of the books listed on the blank on hand, and the enrollment by grades. If there is nothing to report in some of the spaces, that fact should be indicated by drawing a line therein. The number of additional copies of each basal text requisitioned should not exceed the difference between the total enrollment in the grade or grades to which the book is assigned and the number of usable copies of the book on hand. The total enrollment for any grade is the sum of the maximum number of pupils enrolled and an additional 10 per cent to allow for increased attendance and the number of teachers for the grade.

Only the number of copies of the text on each of the optional high school subjects needed to supply the students taking the subject and the teachers teaching it should be requisitioned.

8. Invoices for Books Distributed and Collected by County Superintendents—

Form VII is furnished by this department for the use of county superintendents when they supply books to the schools under their jurisdiction and when they receive books from such schools. Whenever books are transferred to a school, the county superintendent should list the books on Form VII and make two copies of the form, one of which he should give to the custodian receiving the books, and the other he should retain for his files. Whenever the county superintendent receives books from a school he should list them on Form VII and make two copies of the form, one of which he should give to the custodian transferring the books, and the other he should retain for his files.

9. Surplus Books in Good Condition—

The superintendent should take up all surplus books in good condition in the schools under his jurisdiction and redistribute them to the schools. If more copies of some of the books than will be needed during the current session are on hand, the number of such books as are available for transfer should be reported to the superintendent, and instructions will be given as to their disposition.

10. Transfer of Books—

A superintendent or teacher should not furnish books to any school district not under his jurisdiction unless he receives a request to do so from this department. This ruling is necessary in order that this department may keep an accurate record of all books each district and county depository receives.

11. Text Book Annual Reports—

Form II. The head teacher of each common school district must send to his county superintendent on Form II at the close of the session, or near the close of the session, a combined report on text book transactions during the current session and a requisition for books needed for the following session.

12. Disposition of Text Books—

Teachers must take up all books in the following classes in their white schools and return them to the office of the superintendent who has supervision over the school. City and county superintendents are required to ship such books freight collect to the State Text Book Depository at Austin, Texas.

A. Books that are not yet worn out but that need to be reconditioned on account of their being soiled and so worn as to render them unfit for use.

B. Worn-out books.

C. All surplus books.

D. All displaced books requested by the superintendent.

Books used in other than white schools should not be shipped.

13. Distribution—

The distribution of text books to pupils should not be placed in the hands of any merchant or mercantile establishment dealing in any kind of school supplies. The distribution of books must be made by trustees, superintendents, principals, teachers, or such employees of the board of trustees as they may designate.

14. Storage—

School trustees must provide some secure place of storage for books. In small schools, locked cases of either wood or steel should be provided. In towns or cities, a book room well arranged and clean must be provided.

15. Insurance—

Insurance on State text books should be carried by local school boards when the value of books kept on hand in the school building is as much as \$250. The policy should be made in favor of the State of Texas, and, in the event that insurance is collected, it should be sent to the State Text Book Division for deposit to the credit of the State Text Book Fund. The premiums on insurance should be paid out of local school funds.

16. Wall Cards—

Teachers should post in each classroom a copy of the rules for pupils as to the care of books, should read these rules to the pupils at least once a month and should inspect the books of all pupils each month.

Pupils in the elementary grades should be required to memorize the "Good Citizen ship Book Code," as given in the Rules for Pupils.

17. Books Handled by Children Having Contagious Diseases—

Rules governing the fumigation of books that have been handled by children suffering from serious contagious diseases as given in bulletin No. 278 must be followed. Pupils suffering from any such diseases should be at once excluded from schools until they are fully recovered.

18. Money Deposits on Books—

No trustee, superintendent, principal, or teacher may require pupils to make a money deposit to secure the return of books.

19. Faulty Books—

Books that come to pieces because of poor binding should not be charged against the pupils, but this department should be notified of the names of such texts and the number of years that the books have been in use, in order that the publishers may be held to their contracts.

20. Books for Home Study—

Pupils from the third grade up must be permitted to take books out of school for home study, if they so desire. Each district board of trustees should make a ruling as to whether pupils of the first or second grade shall be permitted to take their books home. By permission of the trustees, books may be issued to pupils for vacation study, a record of these books being kept on book cards as during the school session. Such pupils must return their book card receipts while holding books in their possession.

The law prescribes that "all public schools in the State shall be required to have taught in them orthography, reading in English, penmanship, arithmetic, English grammar, modern geography, composition, physiology and hygiene (including the effect of alcoholic stimulants and narcotics on the human system), mental arithmetic, Texas history, United States history, civil government, elementary agriculture, patriotism, and other branches as may be agreed upon by the trustees or directed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction; provided that the subject of elementary agriculture shall not be required to be taught in independent school districts having a scholastic population of three hundred or more, unless so ordered by the school boards; provided, further, that suitable instruction shall be given in the primary grades once each week regarding kindness to animals of the brute creation and the protection of birds and their nests and eggs."

EXCERPTS FROM SCHOOL LAW.

"The scholastic year is fixed by law and shall commence on the first day of September of each year and end on the thirty-first day of August thereafter."

"Public School shall be taught for five days in each week. School shall not be closed on legal holidays unless so ordered by the trustees. A school month shall consist of not less than twenty school days, inclusive of holidays; and shall be taught for not less than seven hours for each day, including intermission and recesses."

The first day of January, the twenty-second day of February, the second day of March, the twenty-first day of April, the third day of June, the fourth day of July, the first Monday in September, the 12th day of October, the 11th day of November, the 25th day of December of each year, and a day in November appointed by the President of the United States and by the Governor of Texas as a day of thanksgiving, are legal holidays. The teacher should not dismiss her school on any holiday without consent of the trustees.

The twenty-second day of February is further set apart and designated by law as Arbor Day, to be devoted to the planting and cultivating of forest, shade and ornamental trees throughout the State and to be observed for that purpose in such manner as may seem best to the people of each community. The second day of March is designated by law as Texas Flag Day, and the people of Texas are urged to observe it by displaying on all public buildings, including the school houses of the State, the Texas flag.

Teachers' Institutes.—Teachers shall be paid at the rate of their regular monthly salaries for attendance upon the two-day institute, and for attendance upon such additional teachers' meetings as may be authorized by the county board of school trustees; provided, that payment for institute attendance may be made at the close of the last school month of the term; provided further, that the county board of school trustees shall determine whether teachers in their respective counties shall be paid for attendance upon such other teachers' meetings as may be authorized by said board. (Section 68 of the School Laws of Texas, Digest of 1929.)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DISPLAY OF THE FLAG.

It is the wish of the people of Texas, through their Representatives in the Texas Legislature, that the State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall include in instructions to city and county superintendents, provisions requiring the flag of each school-house to be kept within doors, to be displayed on the exterior of the building only in good weather, on suitable occasions, and at such regular intervals as may be desirable, at the same time providing for such regular use of the flag in patriotic exercises as may inspire in the children of the State the proper reverence and enthusiasm for the Star Spangled Banner of the greatest republic of the world.

The teacher is instructed to make a copy of her program in duplicate on separate sheets. Fill in the program both as to periods of study and of recitations, denoting recitation periods with red ink and study periods with black ink. When prepared submit one copy to the county superintendent for his consideration. The county superintendent is instructed to inspect carefully the program, note suggestions as to improvements, if there be any, and return to the teacher at once.

The attention of the teacher is directed to the fact that the program should take account of pupils who are not reciting as well as those in recitations, and should indicate what each class is to do during each period of the day.

If there are a great many grades, classes should be grouped or combined in certain subjects. Authorities all agree that recitation periods should be at least fifteen minutes in length, in the primary grades, twenty-five minutes in the intermediate grades, and thirty-five to forty-five minutes in the high school years.

When all pupils who will probably enroll in the school have entered and been classified, and when your program has been finally adjusted to the needs of your school and approved by the county superintendent, it should be copied in the above space. A copy of it should be mailed to the county superintendent to be filed in his office as part of the records of your school.

It is the duty of the county superintendent to see that this program is properly made and filled in as directed, and he should refuse to approve vouchers for monthly salaries of teachers until the program is made according to instructions. In his visits to the school the county superintendent, by examining the register and his own note book in which he will carry his copy of the program, should see that the program is being followed by the teacher. It is the duty of the county superintendent to require that all records be kept according to law and the instructions of the county superintendent and the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.



Explanation of Terms

- A. **DAYS TAUGHT**—the actual number of days in which instruction was offered. Exclude all legal holidays or days school was closed for *any cause*.
- B. **ORIGINAL ENTRIES**—the *first entry* of a pupil in *any public school* in the State during the current school year. Original Entries represent the *head count* of all pupils who enter Texas public schools; *the State is the unit*. A pupil once coded as an original entry (B1 or B2) by any *public school in Texas* during the current school year, *must not* again be coded as such by any other public school subsequently entered during the *same school year*. Original entries may increase, but they *never decrease*. Original entries fall into two classes:
- (1) First entry of a pupil in any public school in Texas during the current school year, except out-of-state pupils. See B2.

 - (4) " " " an Ind. Dist. *by a C. S. D.* in the same county.
 - (5) " " " a C. S. D. *by an Ind. Dist.* in the same county.
 - (6) " " " another Ind. Dist. *by an Ind. Dist.* in the same county.
 - (7) " " " another school not in the same county but in the State.
 - (8) " " " after withdrawal or discharge.
- D. **LOSSES**—are pupils leaving classes or grades for the following causes:
- (1) Pupils promoted or changed to other rooms in the same school.
 - (2) Pupils promoted or changed to other schools in the same district.
 - (3) Pupils having passed compulsory school age.
 - (4) Due to other causes (death of pupil, work, discharge, etc.).
- E. **MEMBERSHIP** at date of this report. Membership is an ever changing number, increased by *Re-entries* and decreased by *Losses*. (B+C—D)
- F. **AGGREGATE ATTENDANCE**—the sum of all days attended by all pupils who were in Membership *during the period* for which the report is made.
- G. **AGGREGATE ABSENCE**—the sum of all days of absence of all pupils who were in Membership *during the period* for which the report is made.
- H. **AGGREGATE DAYS OF MEMBERSHIP**—the number of days the membership is expected to attend. It is the sum of the **AGGREGATE ATTENDANCE** plus the **AGGREGATE ABSENCE**. (F+G) A pupil admitted on Monday of the second week is in membership for the last 3 weeks and must be counted as present or absent during this period.
- I. **AVERAGE MEMBERSHIP**—the **AGGREGATE DAYS OF MEMBERSHIP** divided by the number of **DAYS TAUGHT**. (H÷A).
- J. **AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE**—the **AGGREGATE ATTENDANCE** divided by the number of **DAYS TAUGHT**. (F÷A).
- K. **PER CENT OF ATTENDANCE**—the **AGGREGATE ATTENDANCE** divided by the **AGGREGATE DAYS OF MEMBERSHIP**. (F÷H).
- L. **NUMBER OF TIMES TARDY**—the sum of all cases of tardiness.
- M. Number of pupils, included in B3, between the ages of 6-17 inclusive.
- N. Number of pupils, included in B3, between the ages of 8-14, inclusive.
