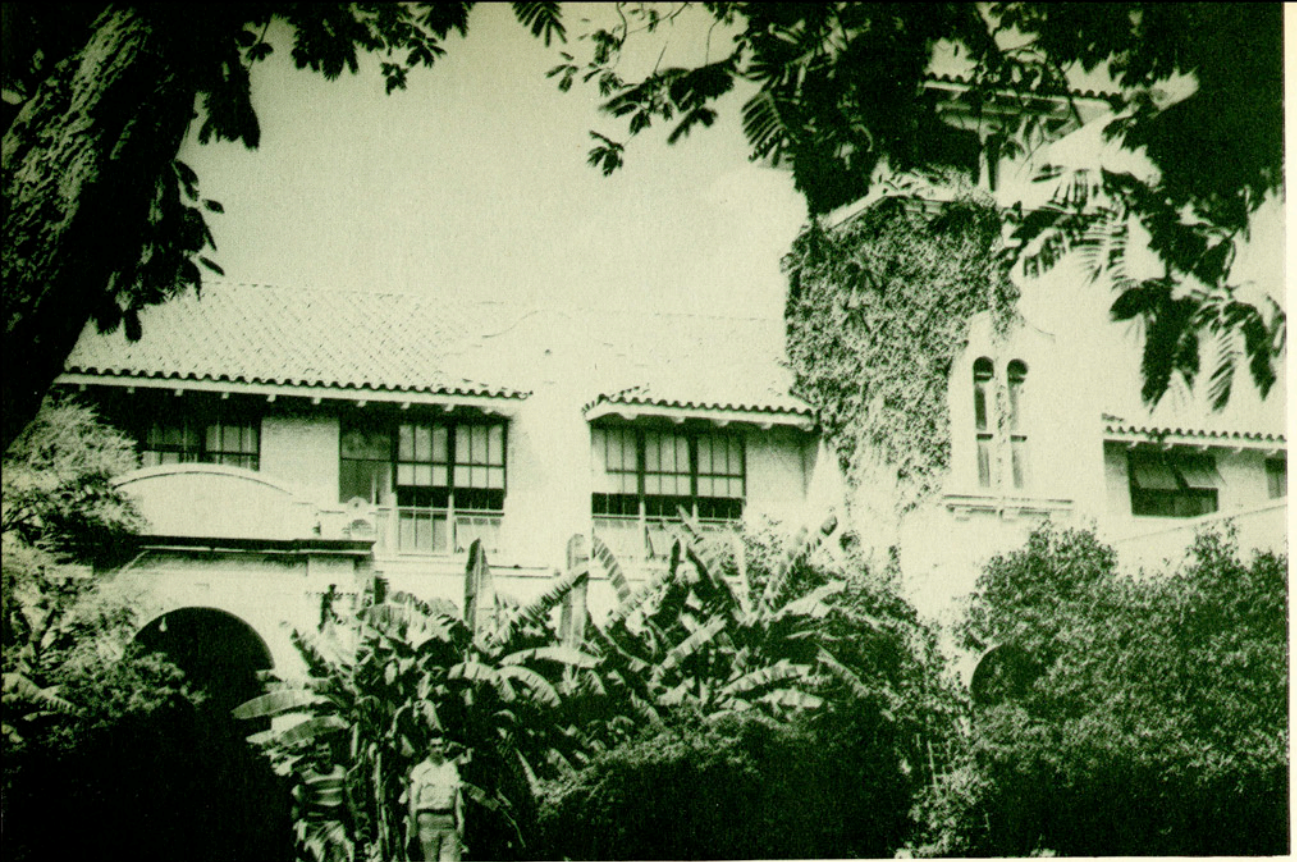




# Kingdom

Red Rucker played guard, center, quarterback, and fullback for the Javelinas from 1939-41 so he is no stranger to the school. A. & I. 19 AUSTIN COLLEGE 20

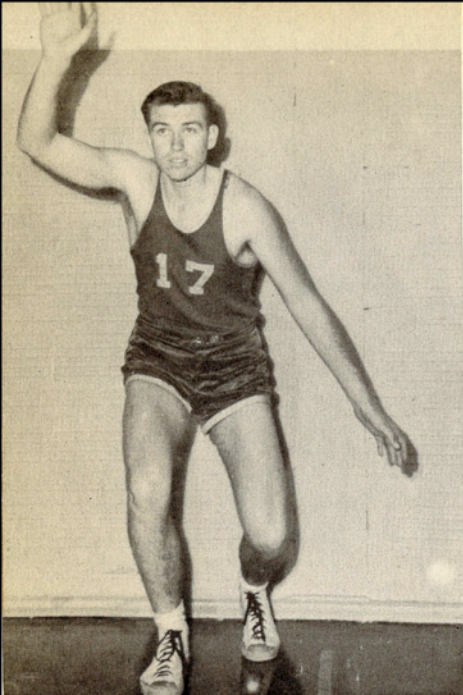

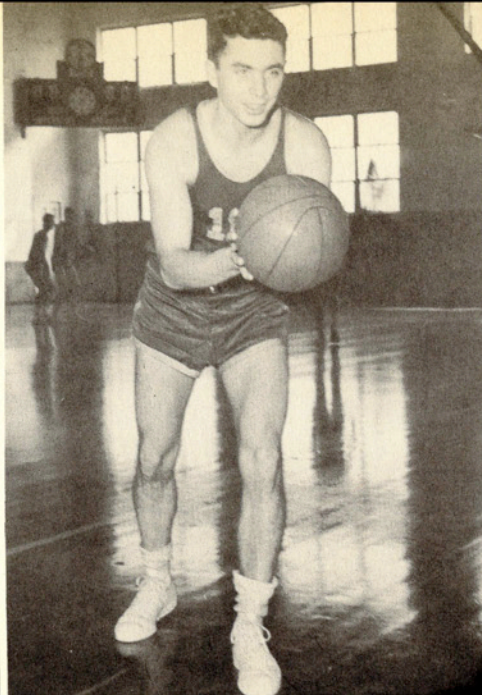
A. & I. 27 U. C. C. 12

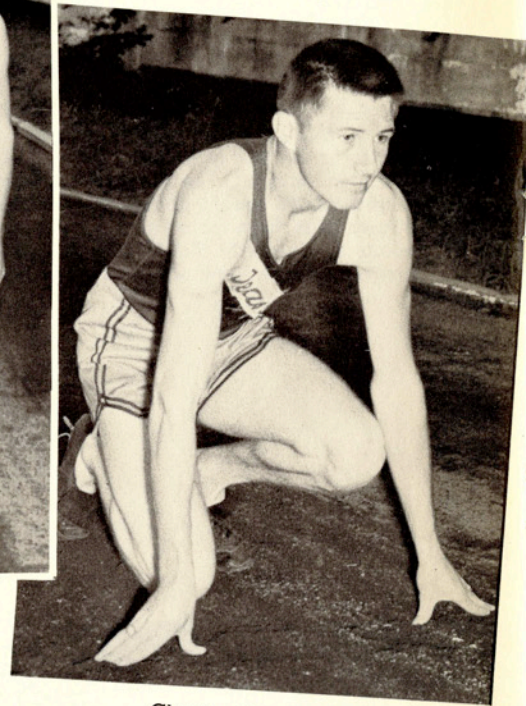

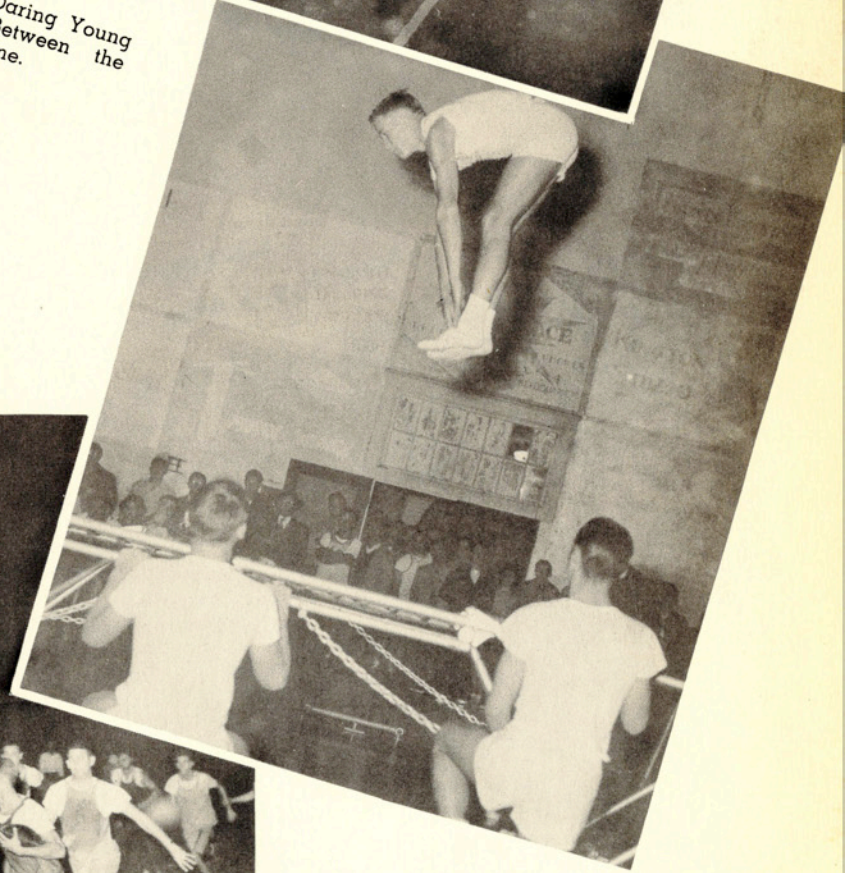

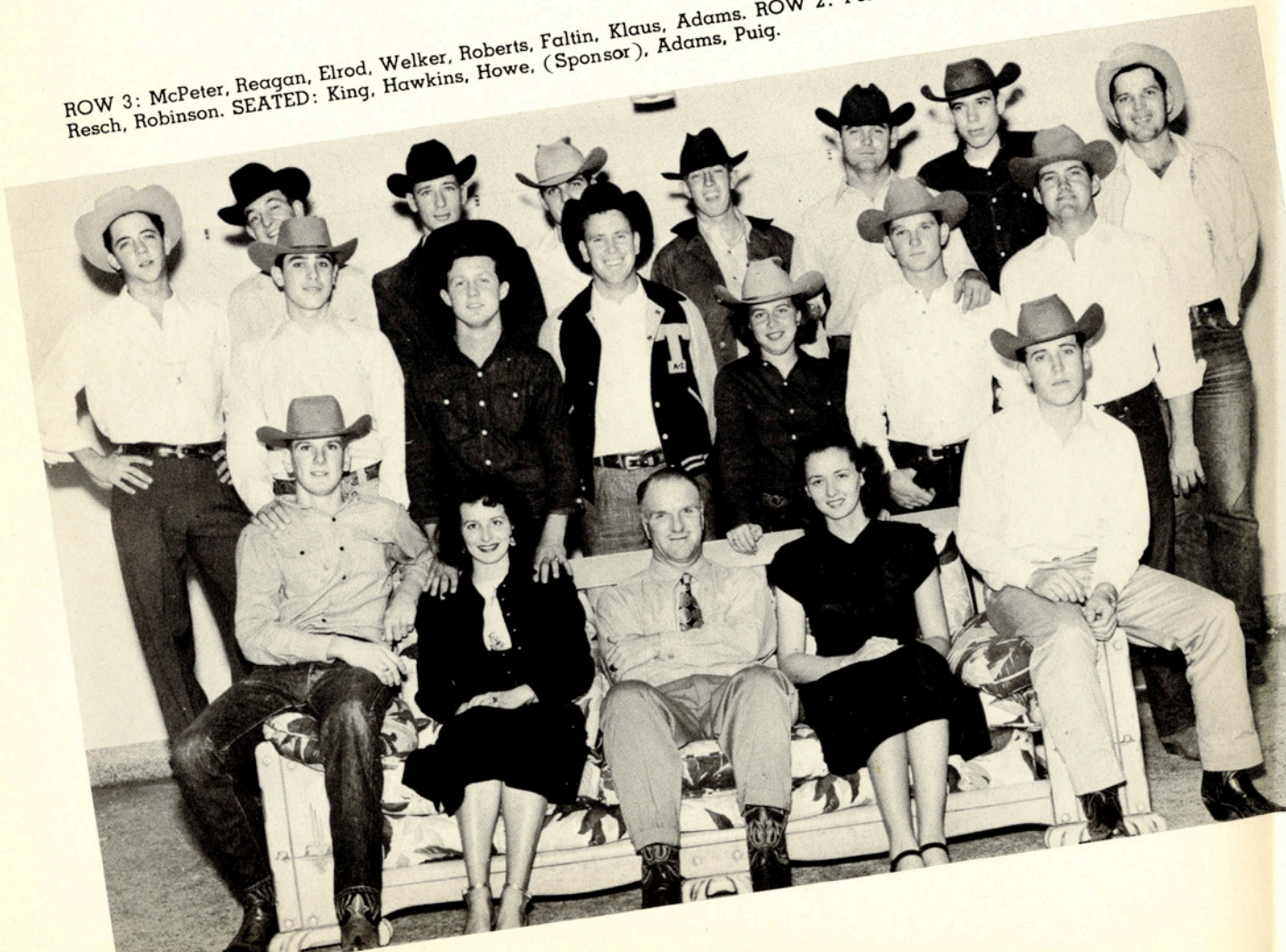


# Rodeo Club

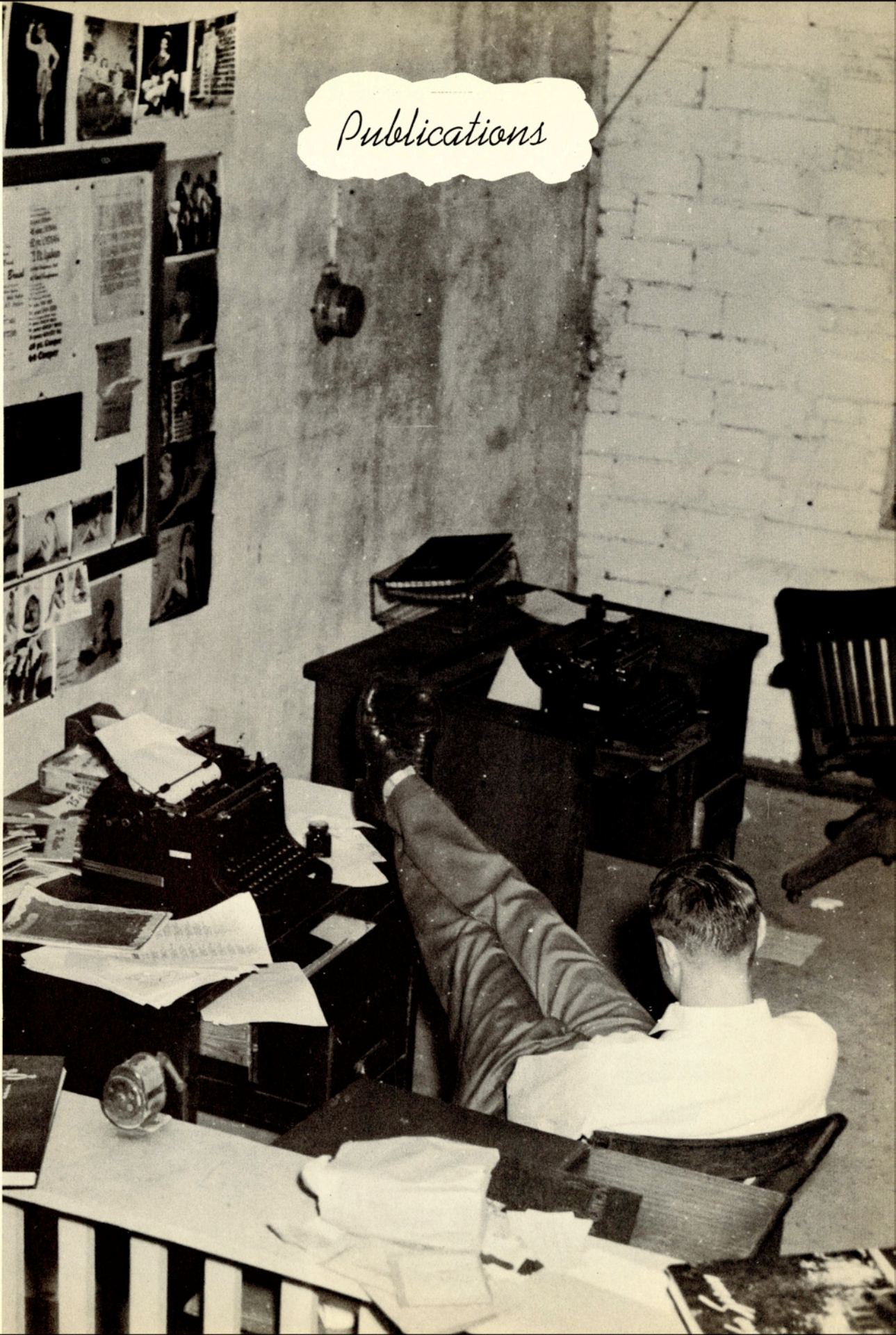

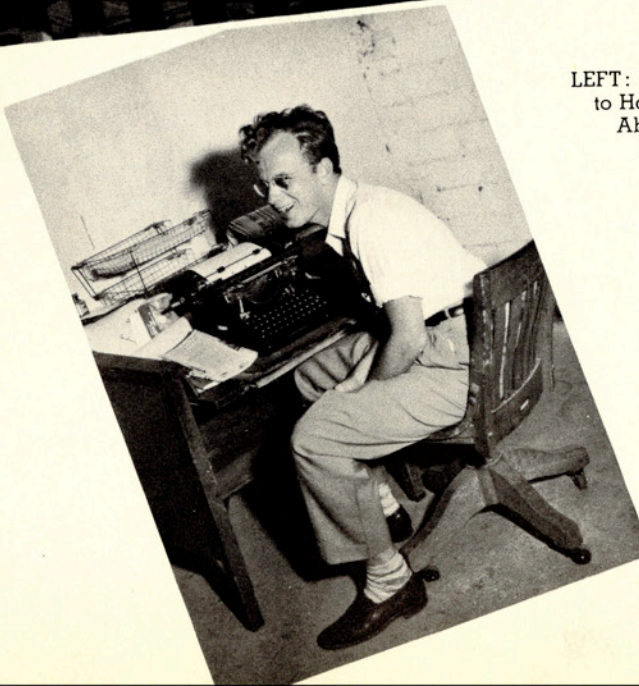

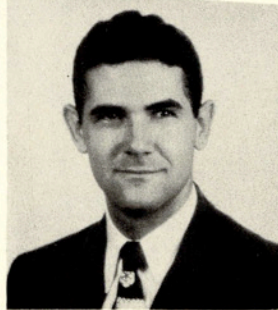
