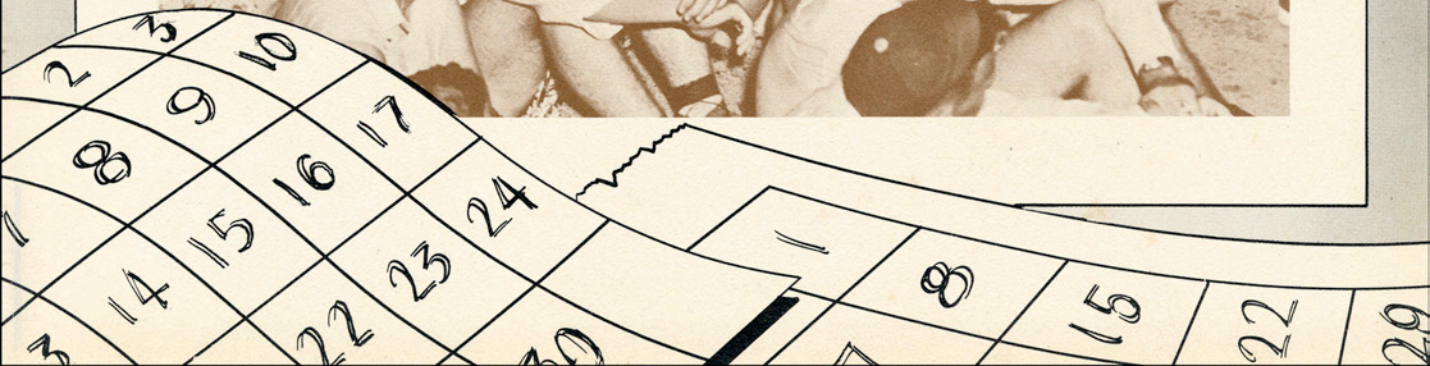
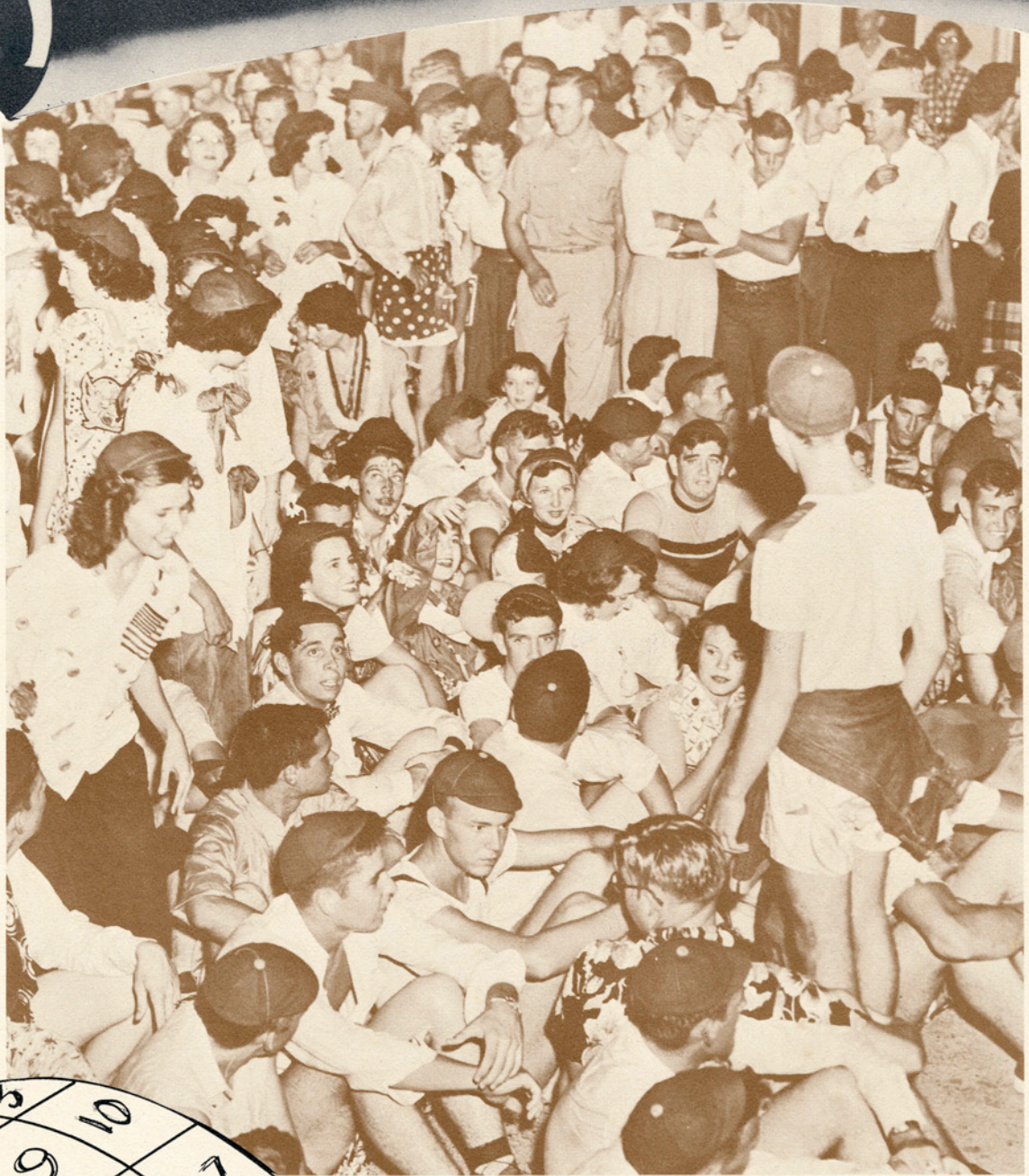
It is to all persons who have made gifts such as these toward the development of human lives through a greater A&I that we dedicate this 1952 issue of El Rancho.

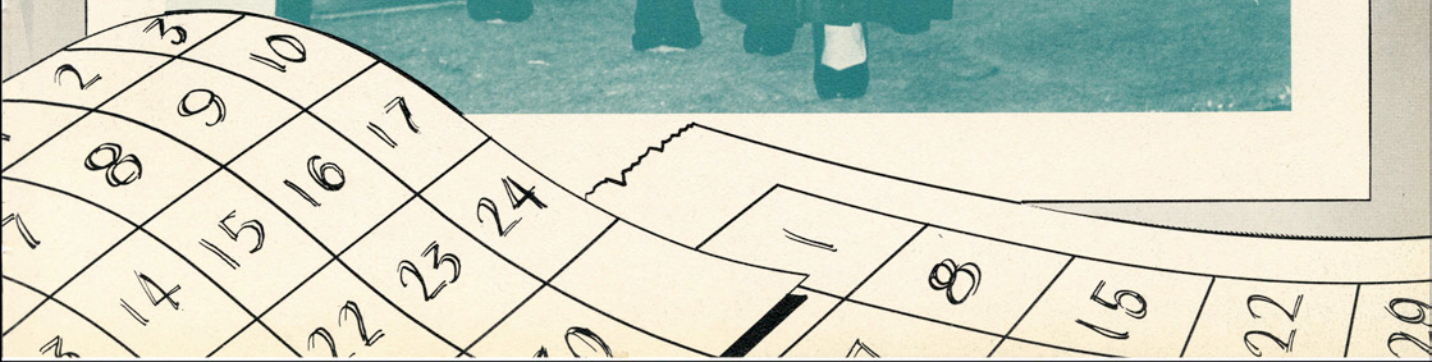




To the Students of A & I

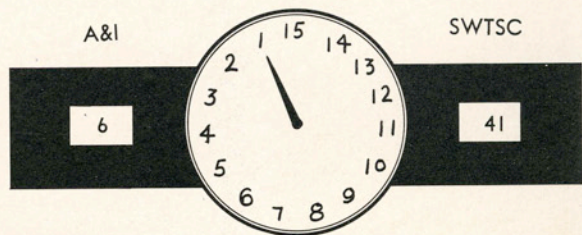

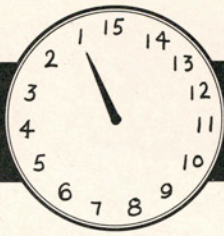

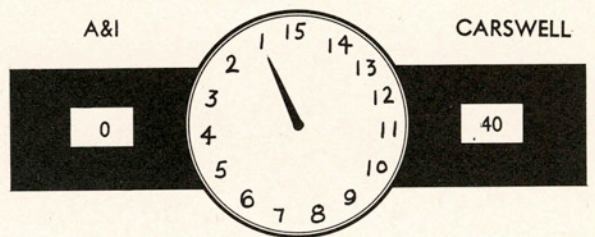

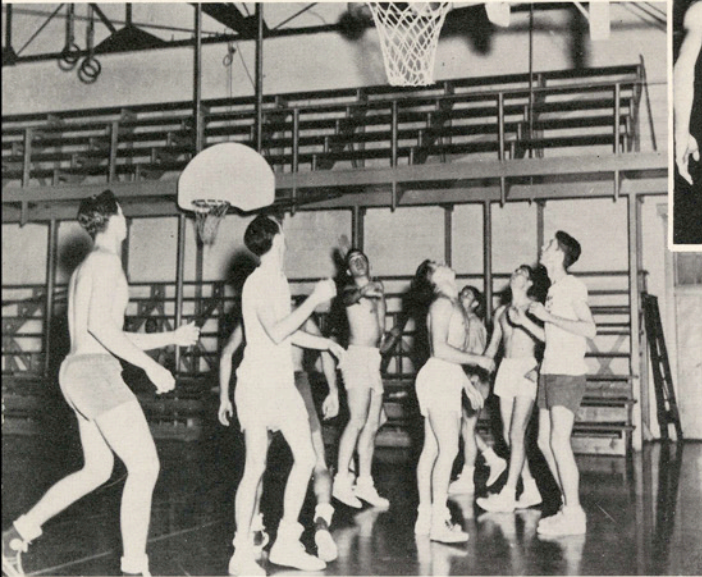

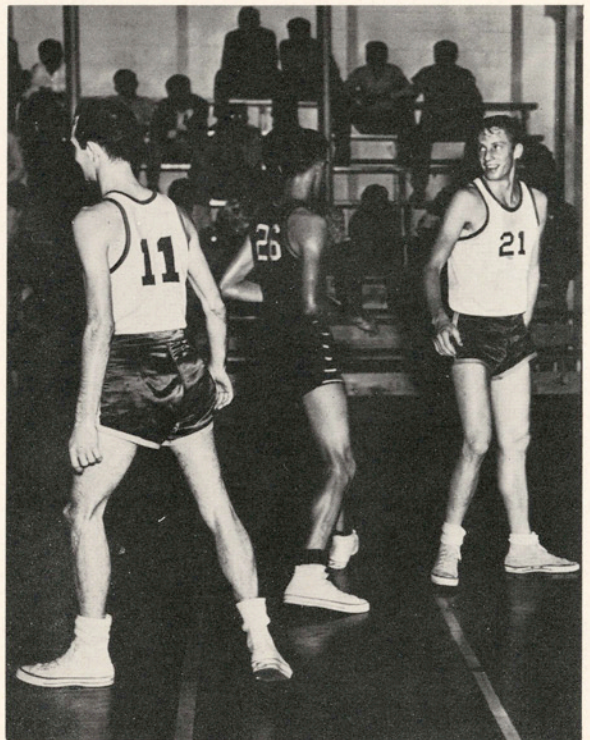

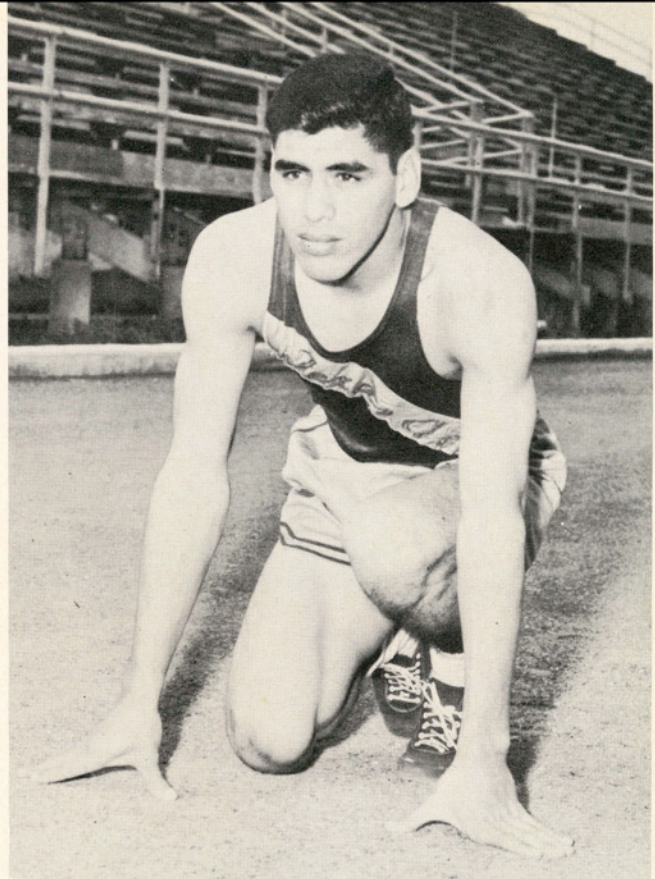

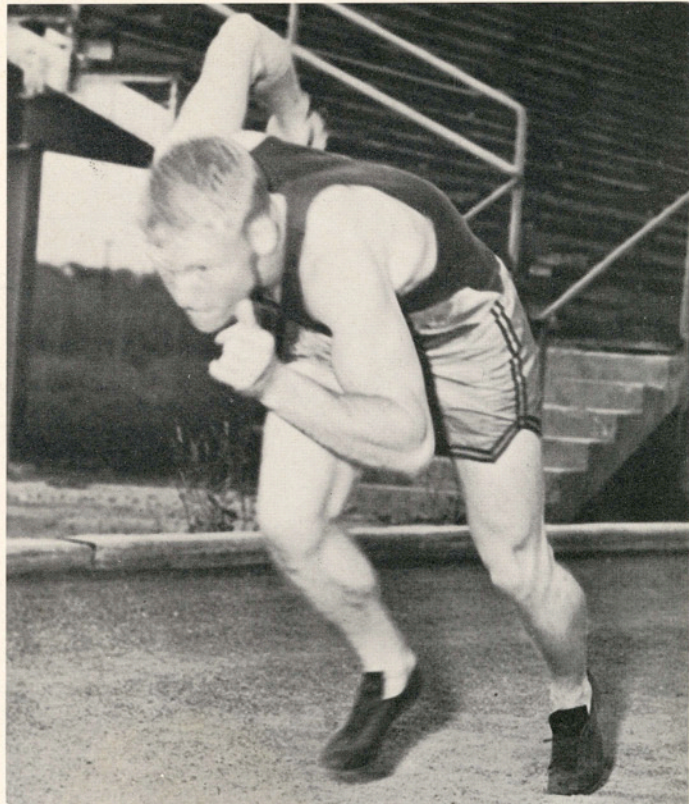

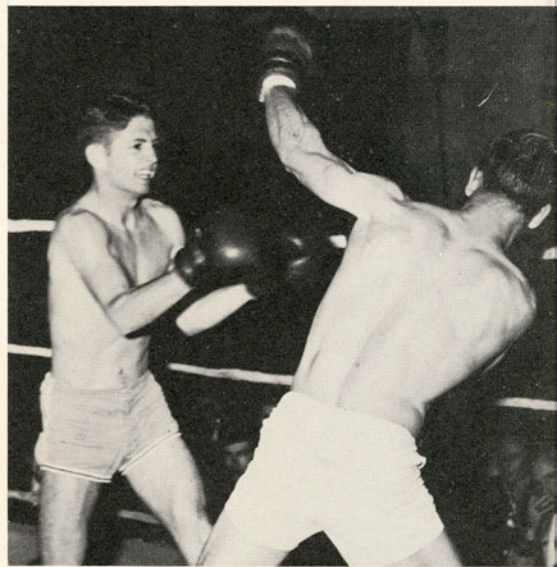

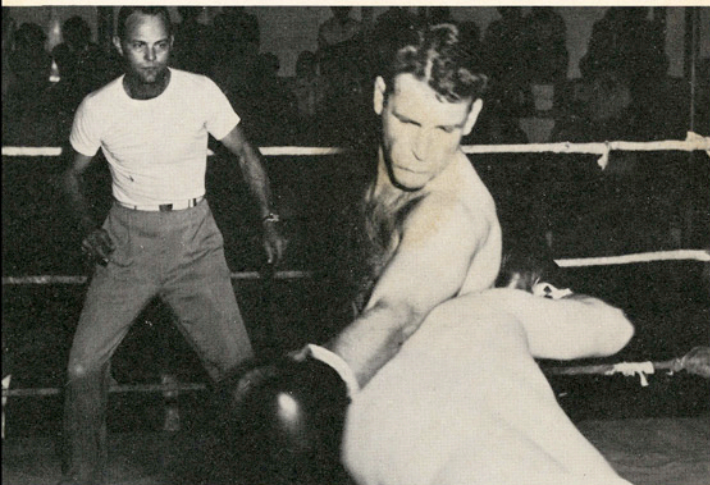

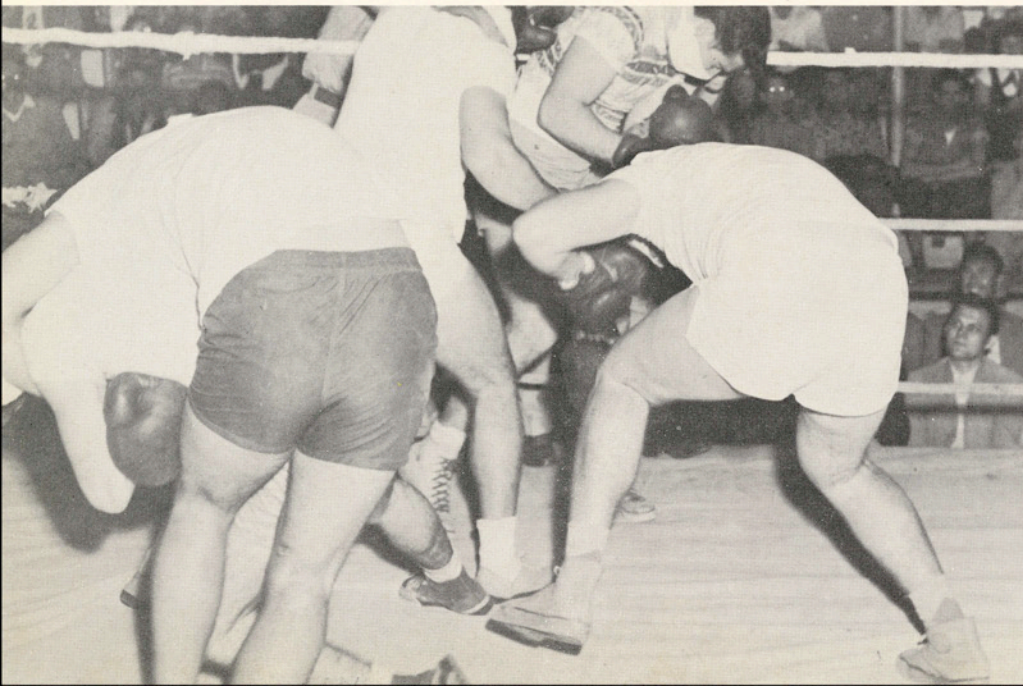

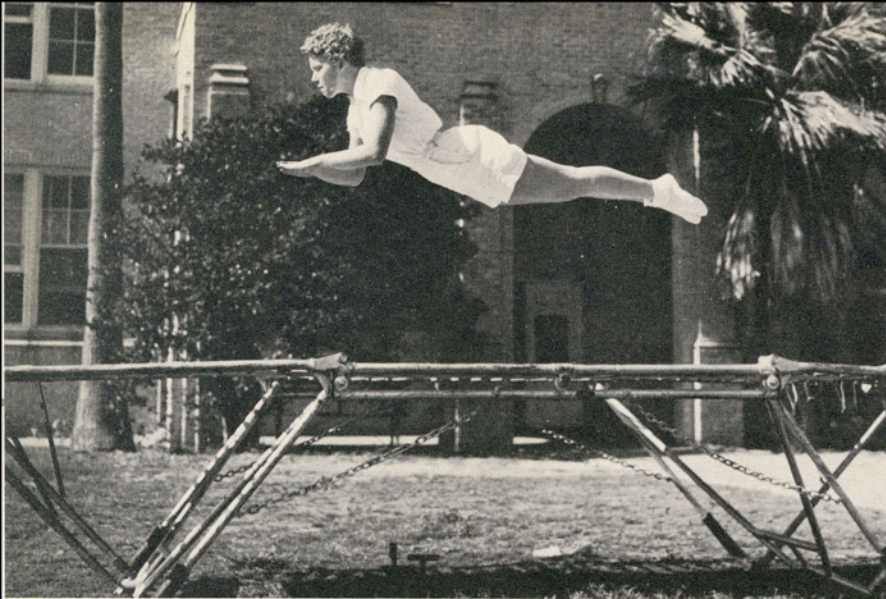

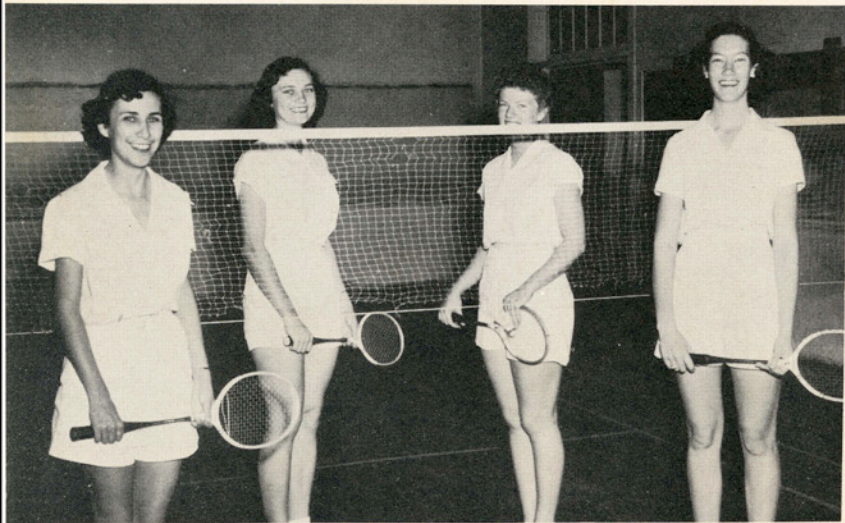

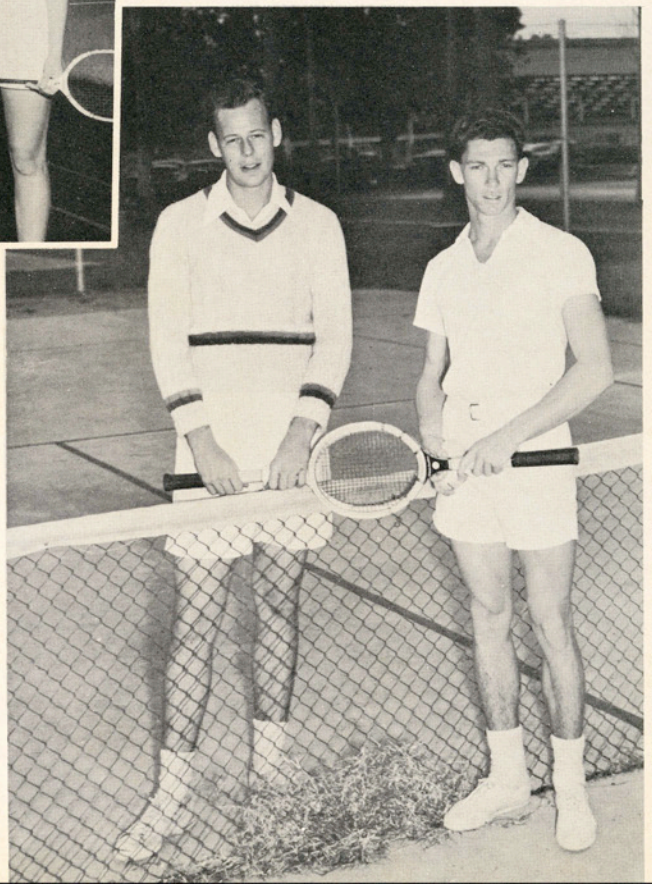
