An engineering student who has been active in his fraternity, A.P.O., and his departmental club, John has become well known for his charm and humor. He is junior class representative to the Student Council.



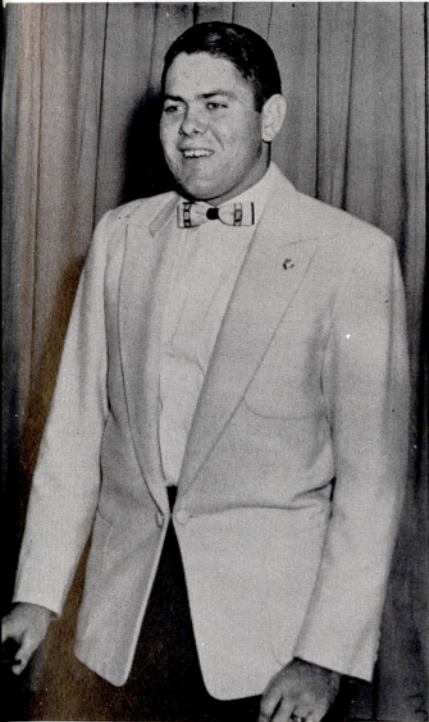
**JOHN LEE CONQUEST . . .**

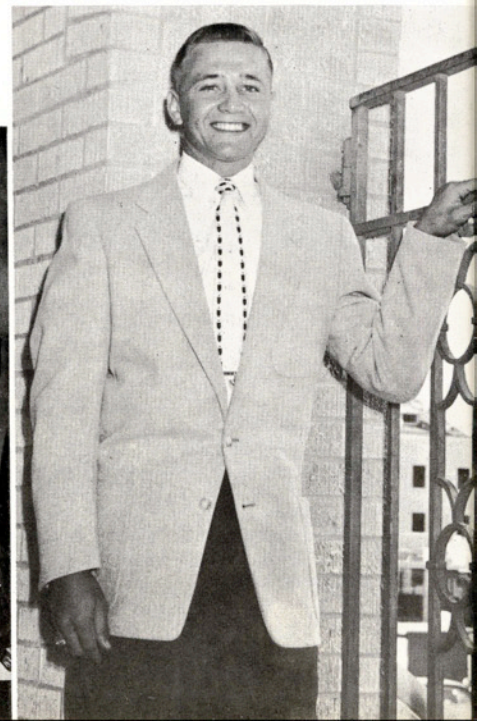


**JACKIE OUALLINE . . .**

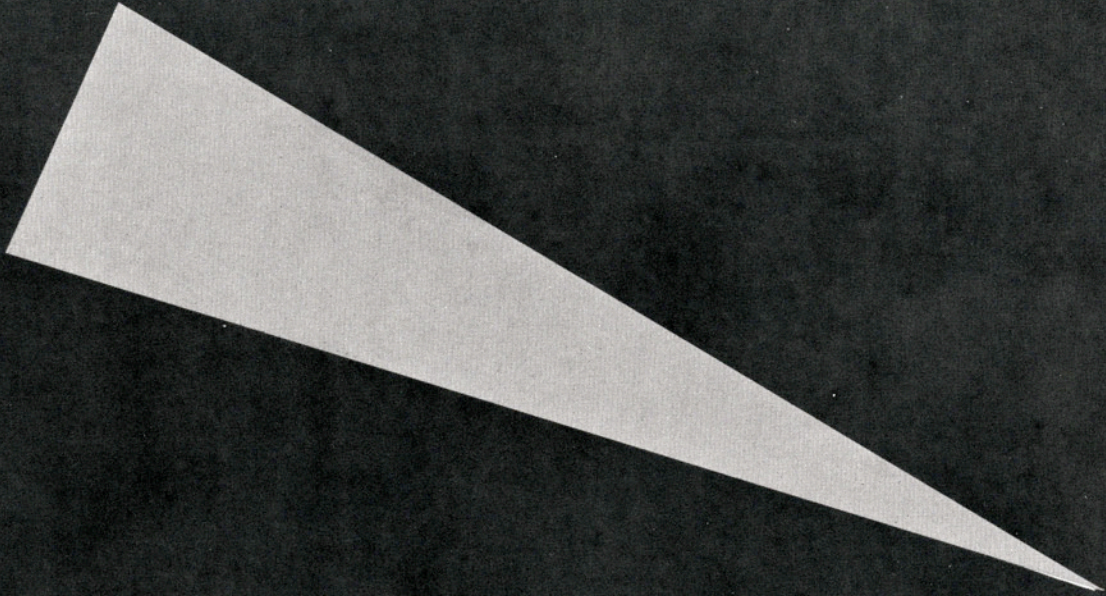

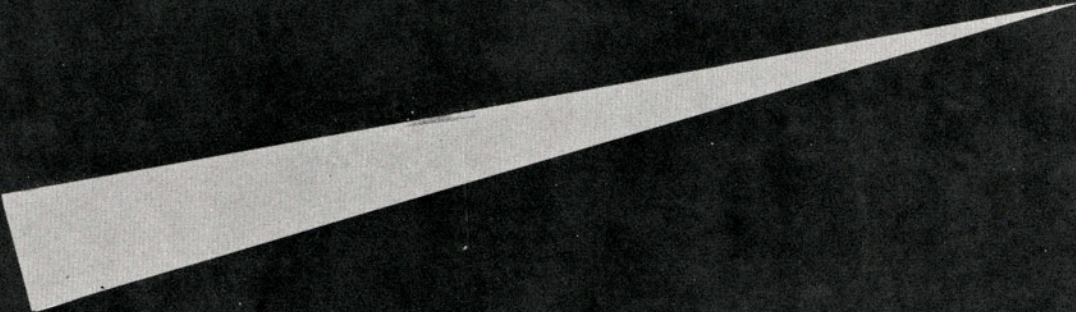

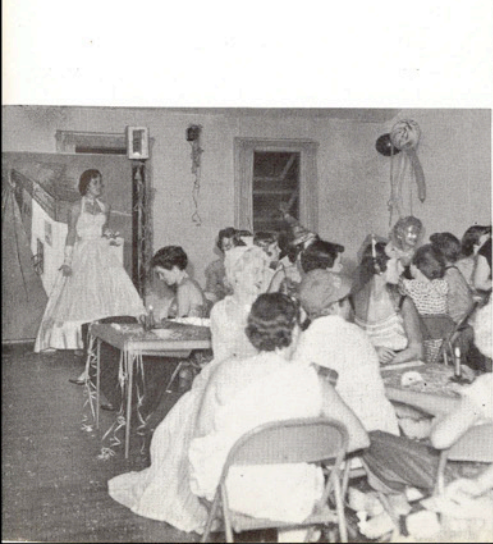

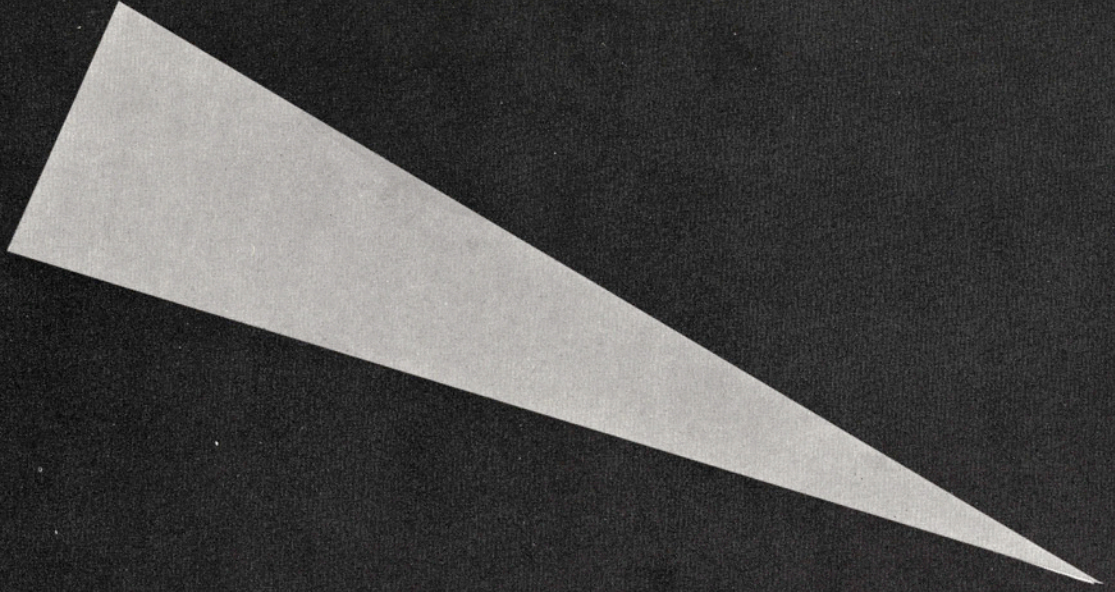

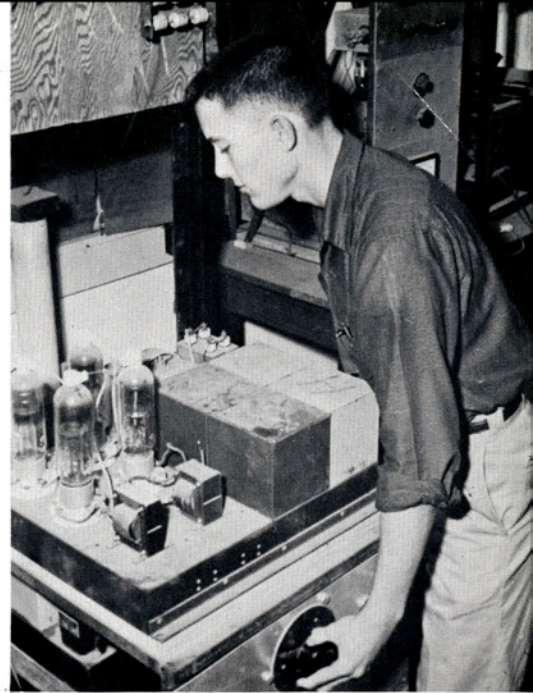

Mexico had scored first in the initial quarter and A&I tied it up early in the second period.

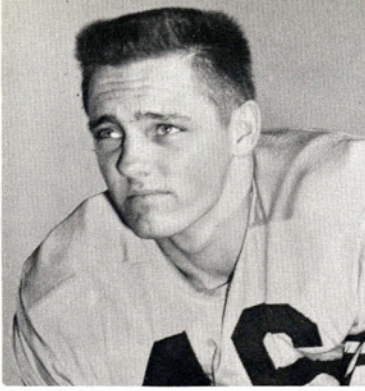

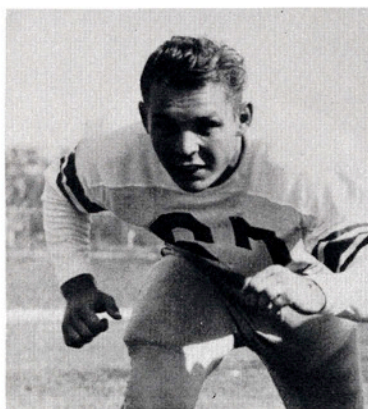
## Javelinas Lose to Bobcats; Last Period Drive Stopped

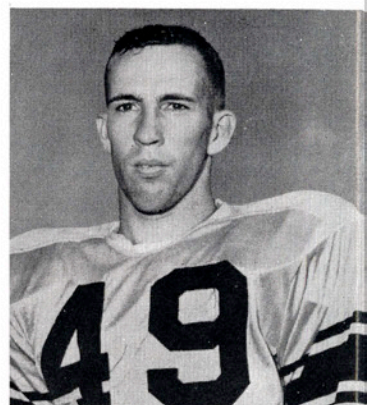

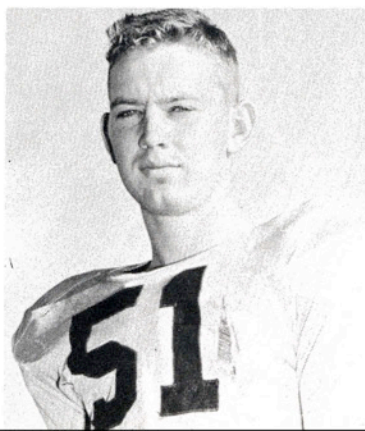

East Texas tied it up early in the fourth quarter on a two yard smash by Halfback Harold Musgrove and Quarterback Jack Pirkey's conversion.



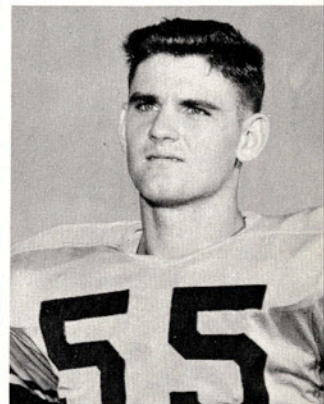

way, taking the ball away from SFA on the A&I 20 yard line just three minutes before the game ended.

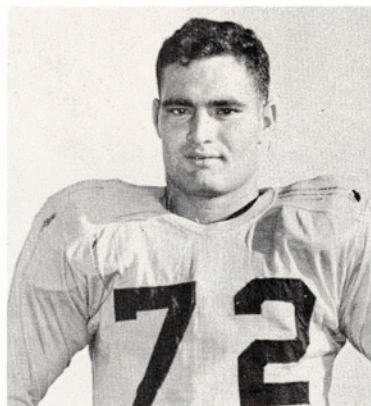

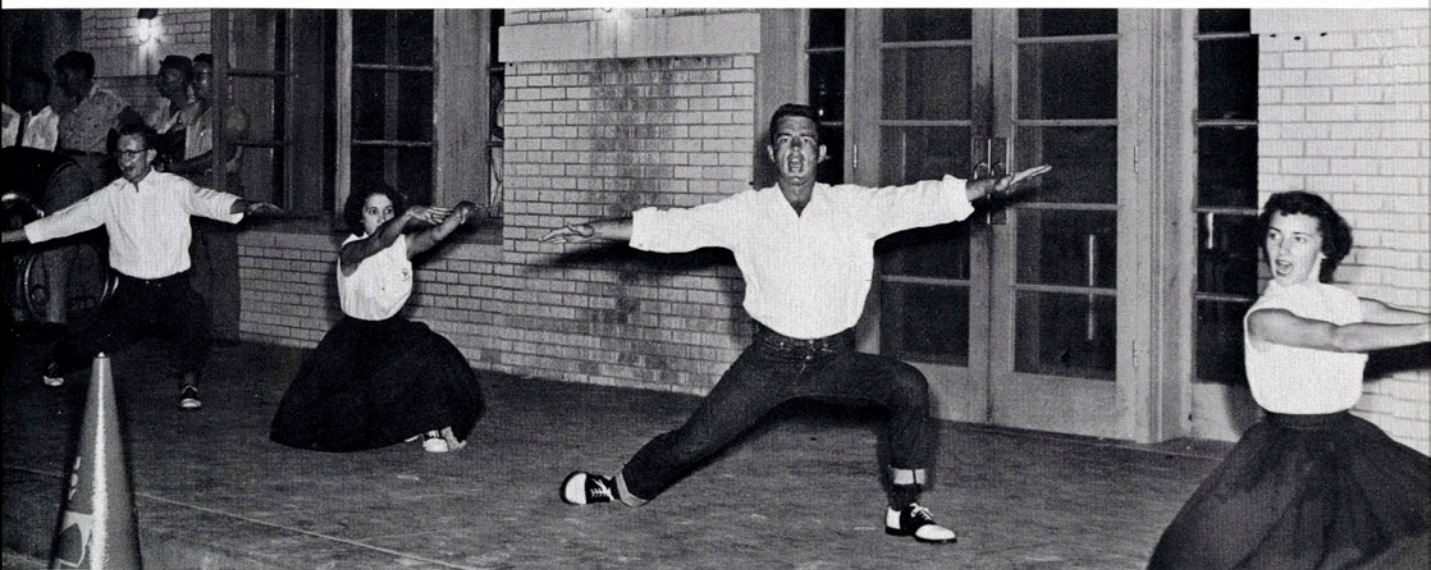
envied the King's Rifles as they went on special duty . . . the Mardi Gras in New Orleans. The drill team led two of the major parades during the celebration.

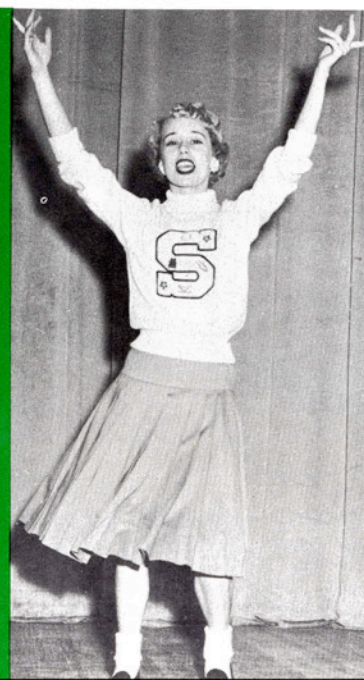

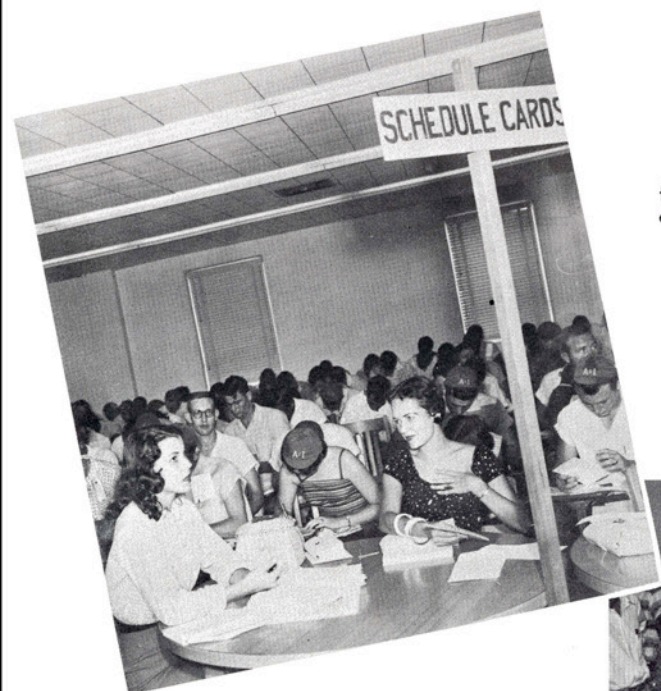

filled out mountains of schedule and information cards.

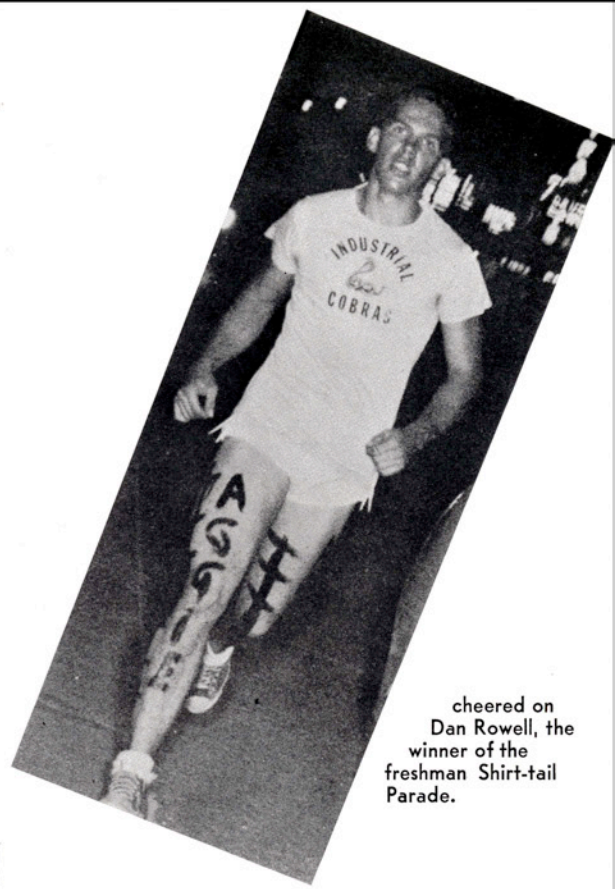


paid our tuition, room and board, miscellaneous fees . . . the most painful part of registration.

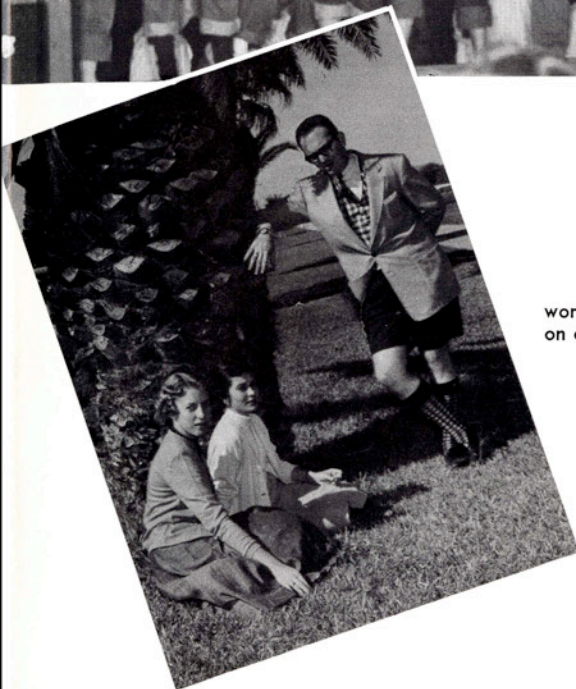

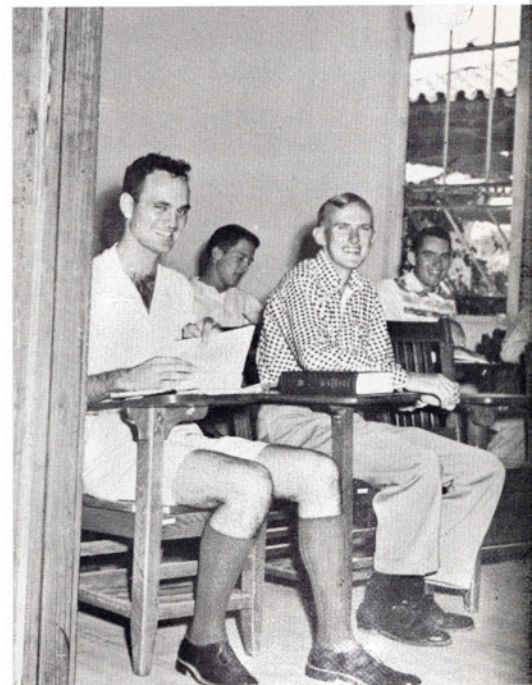
cheered on Dan Rowell, the winner of the freshman Shirt-tail Parade.

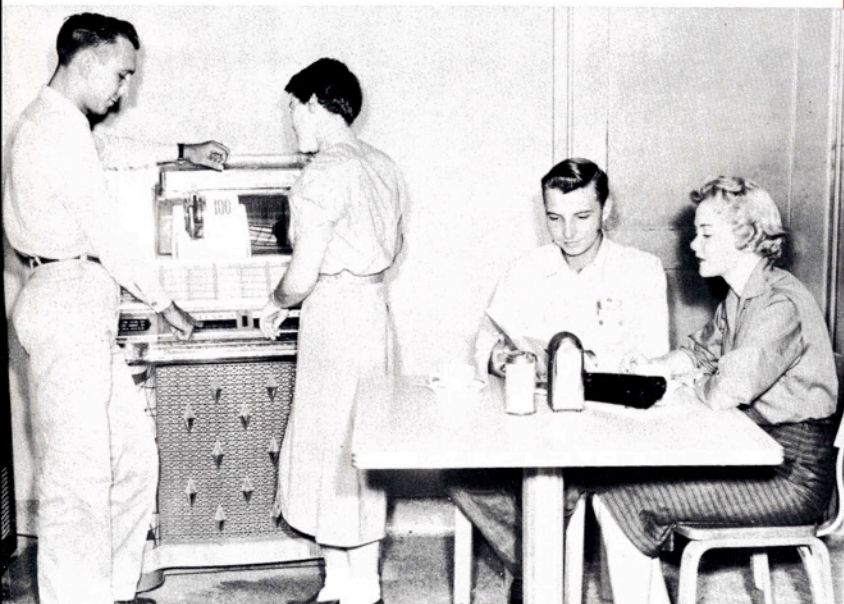

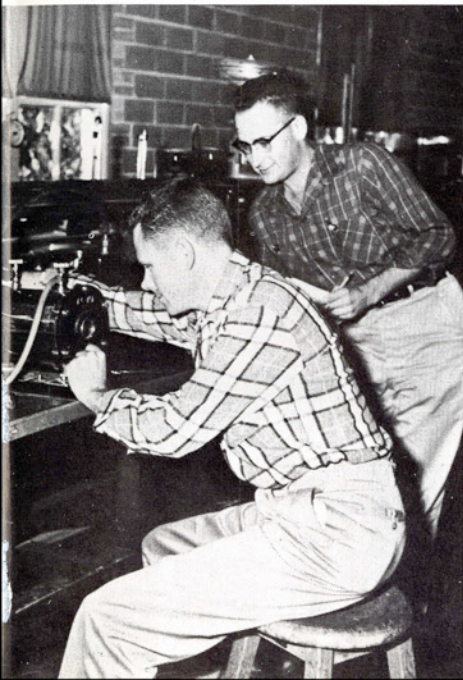

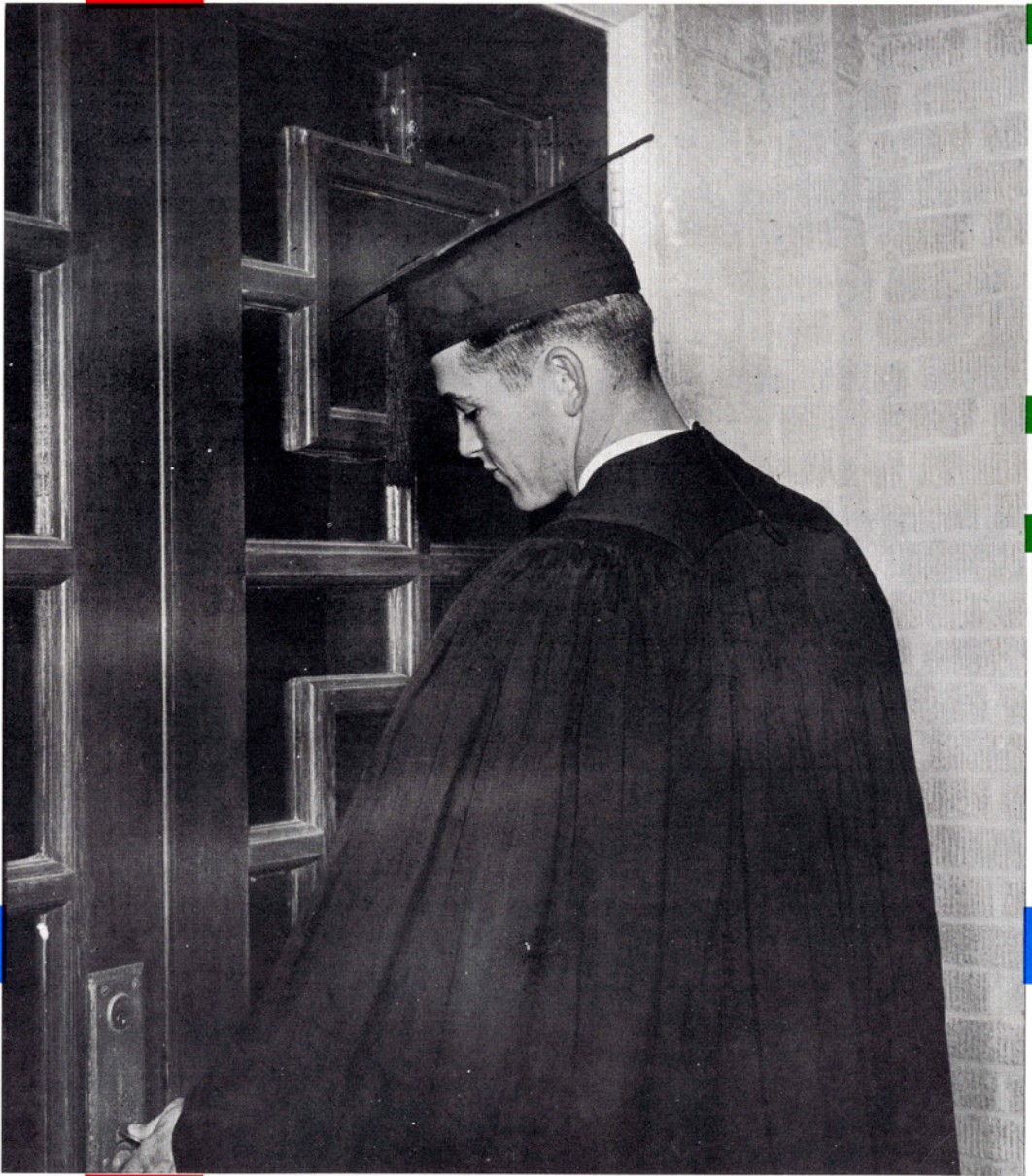
