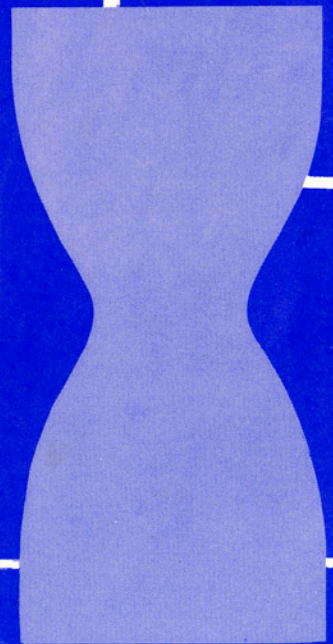


DEDICATION

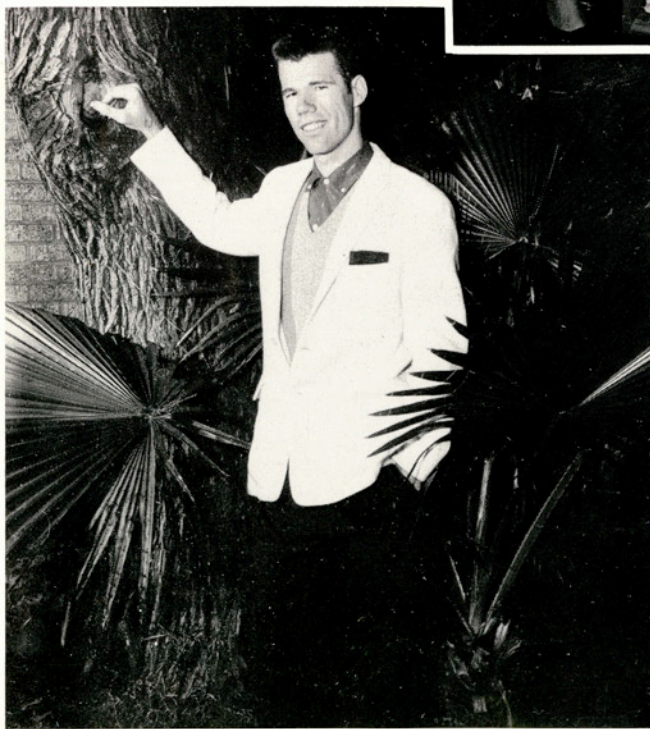


KATHLEEN CLARKSON

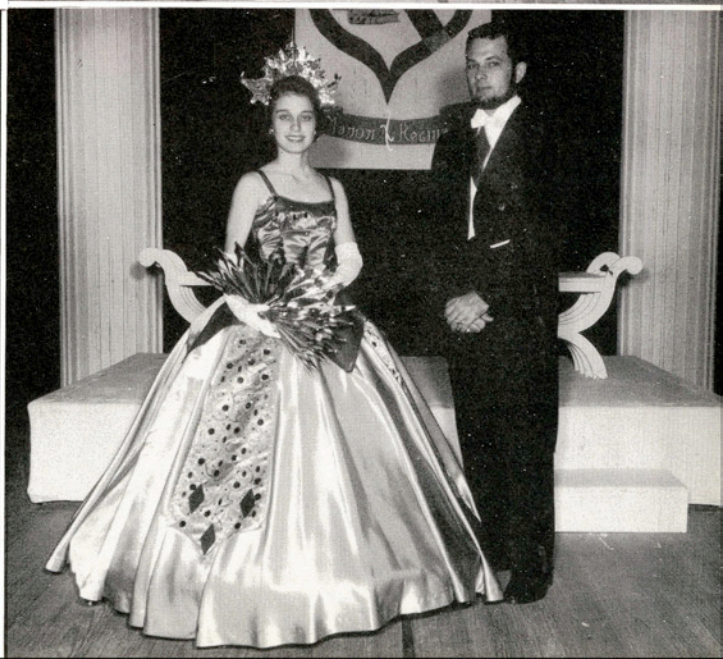

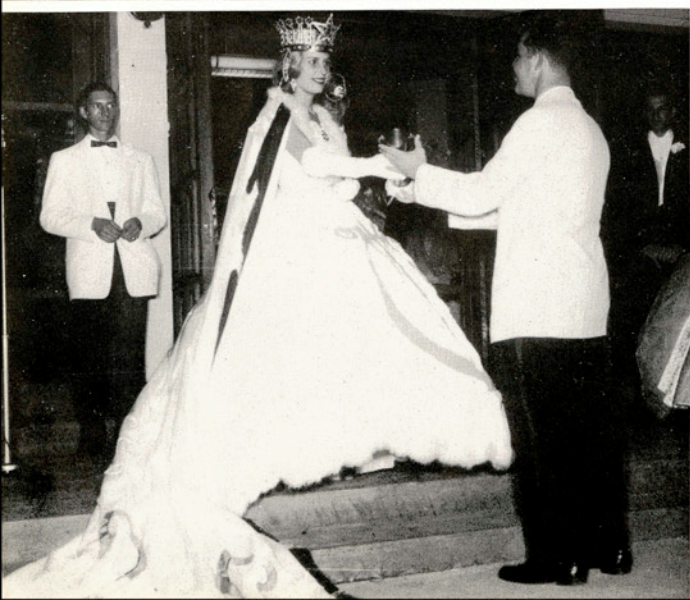

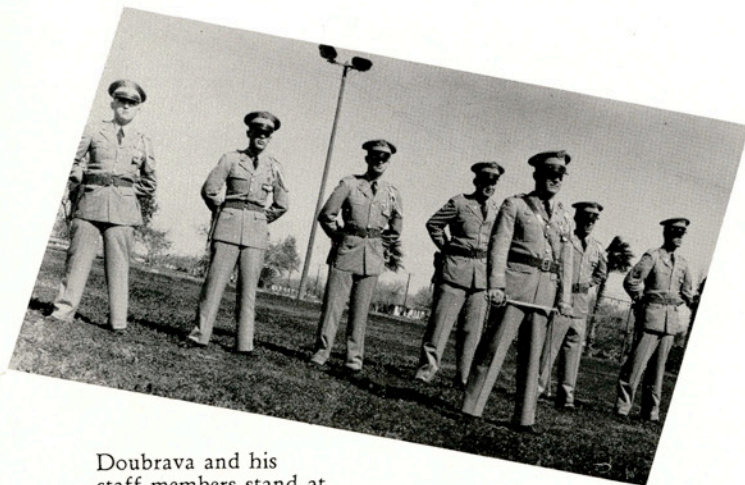

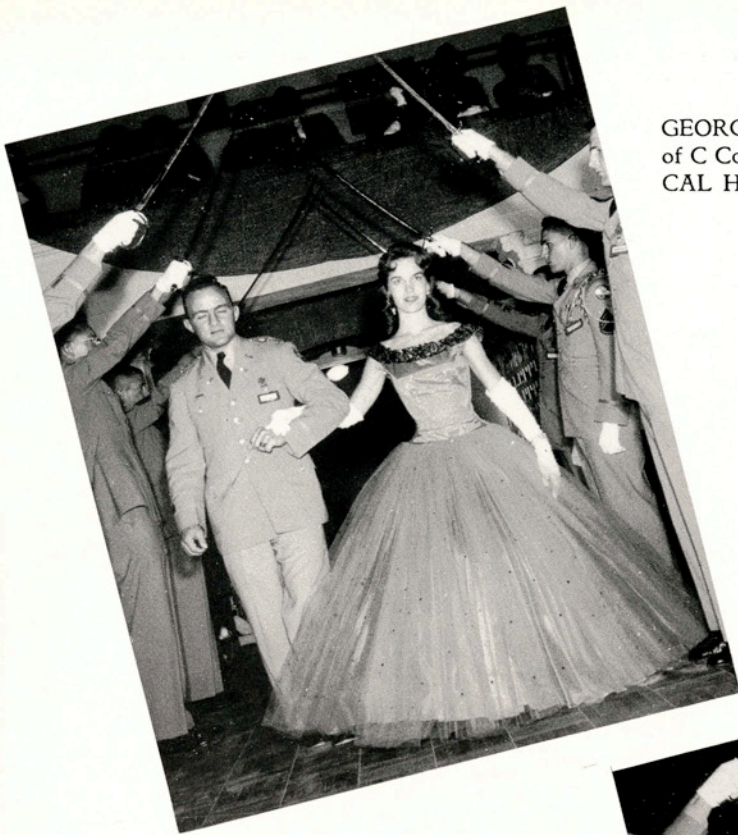

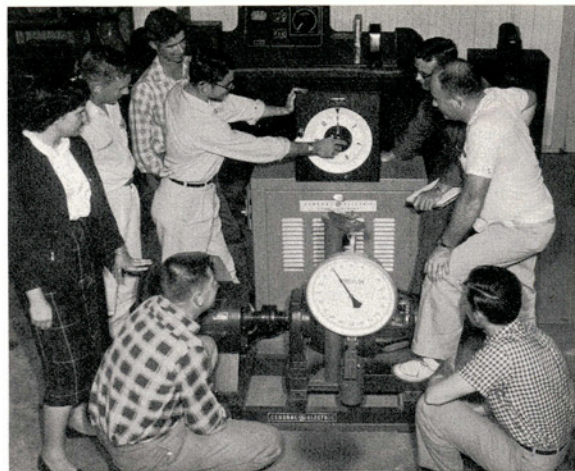

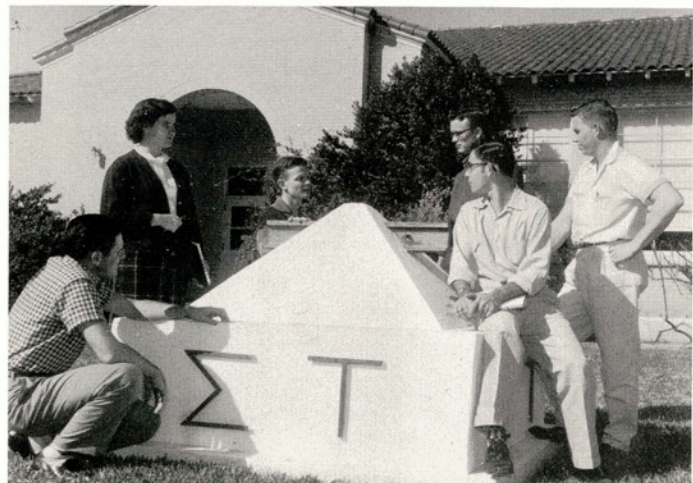

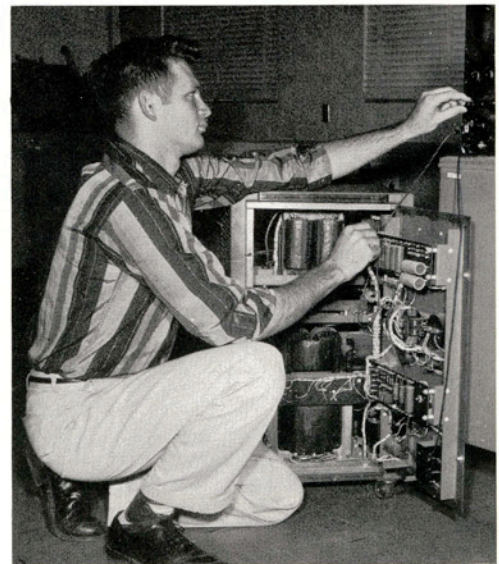

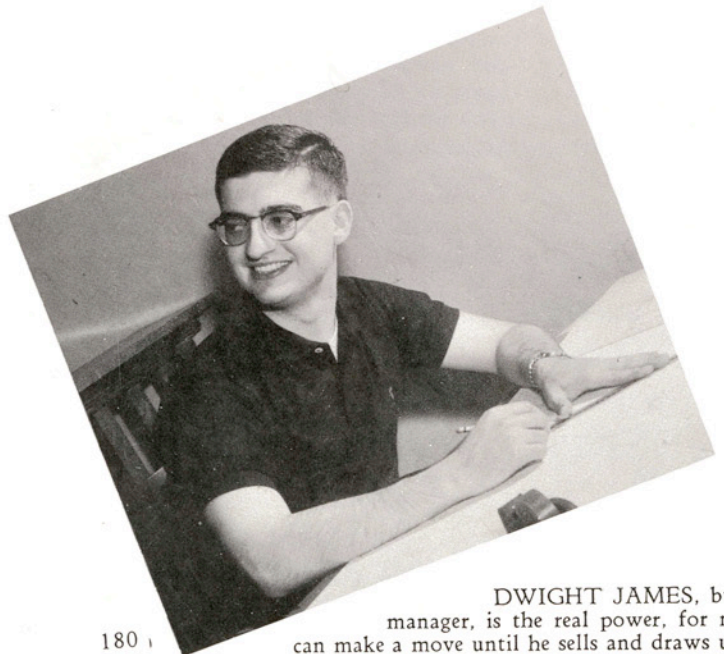

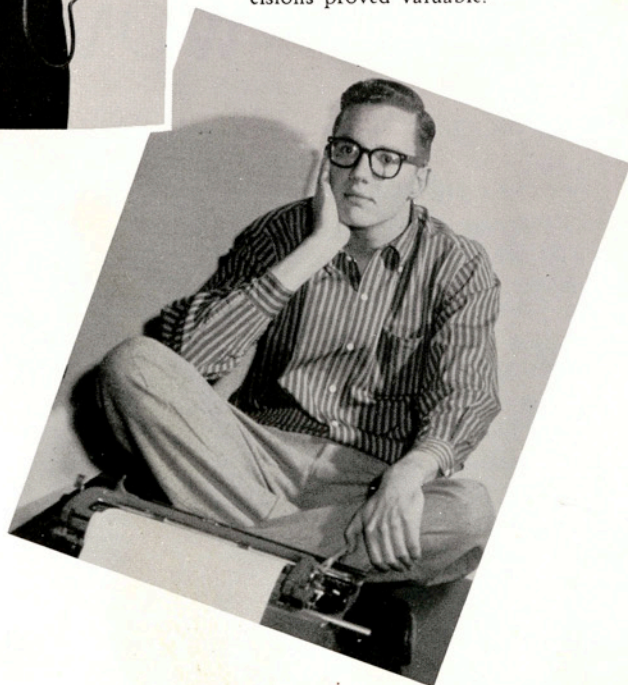

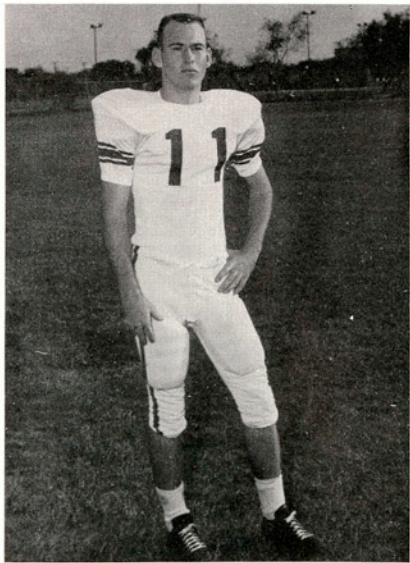

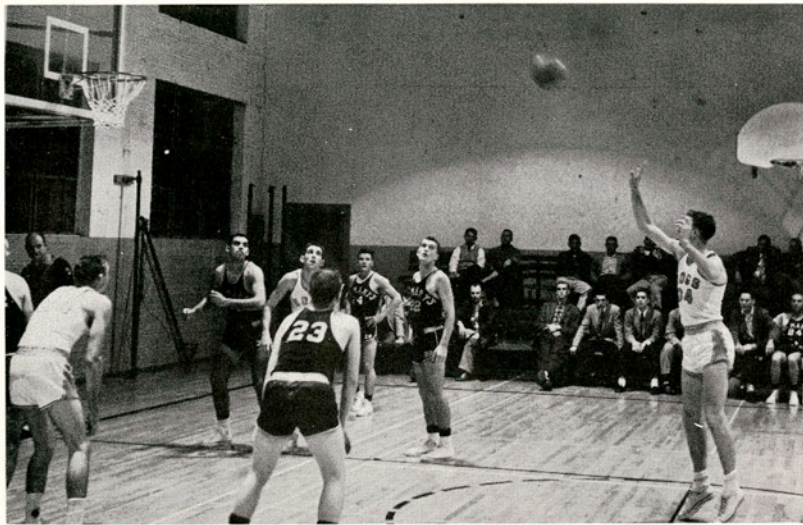

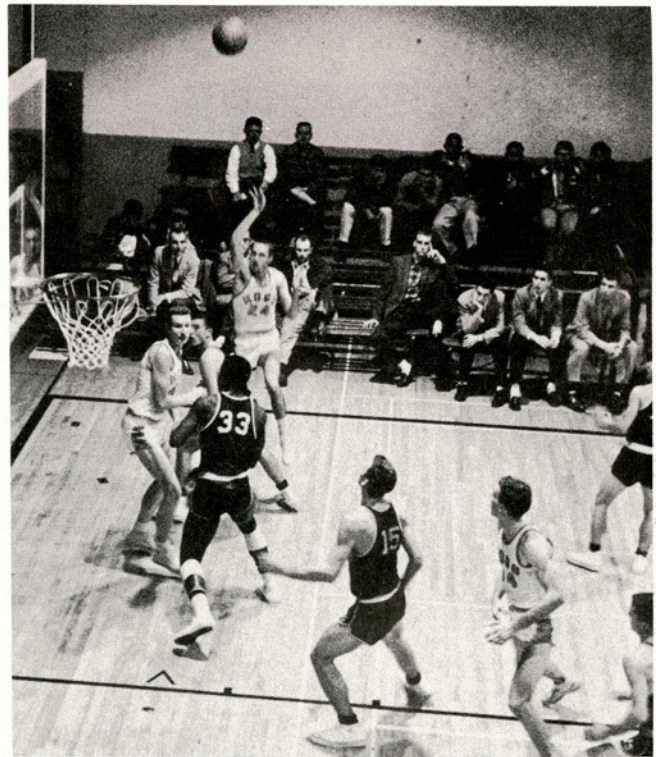

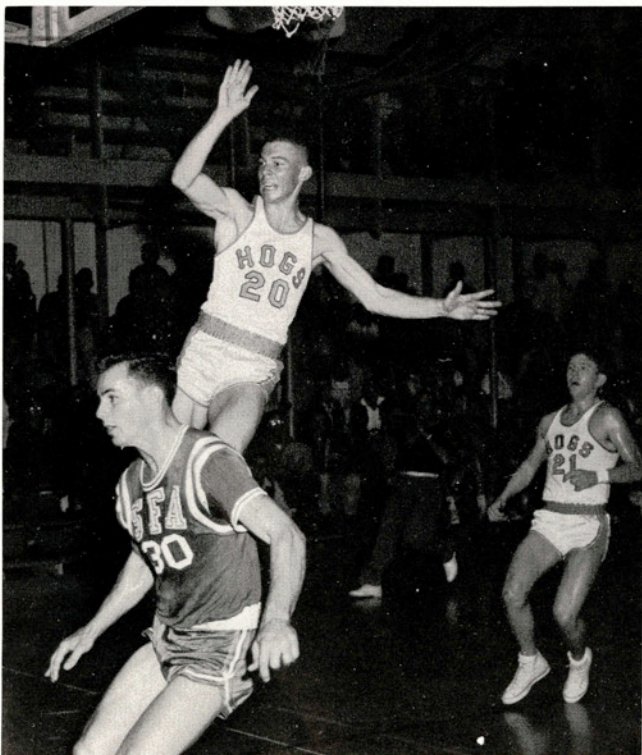

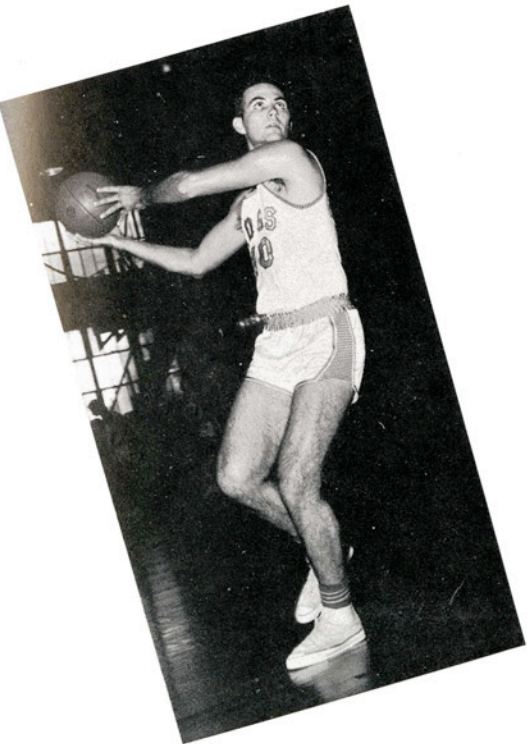

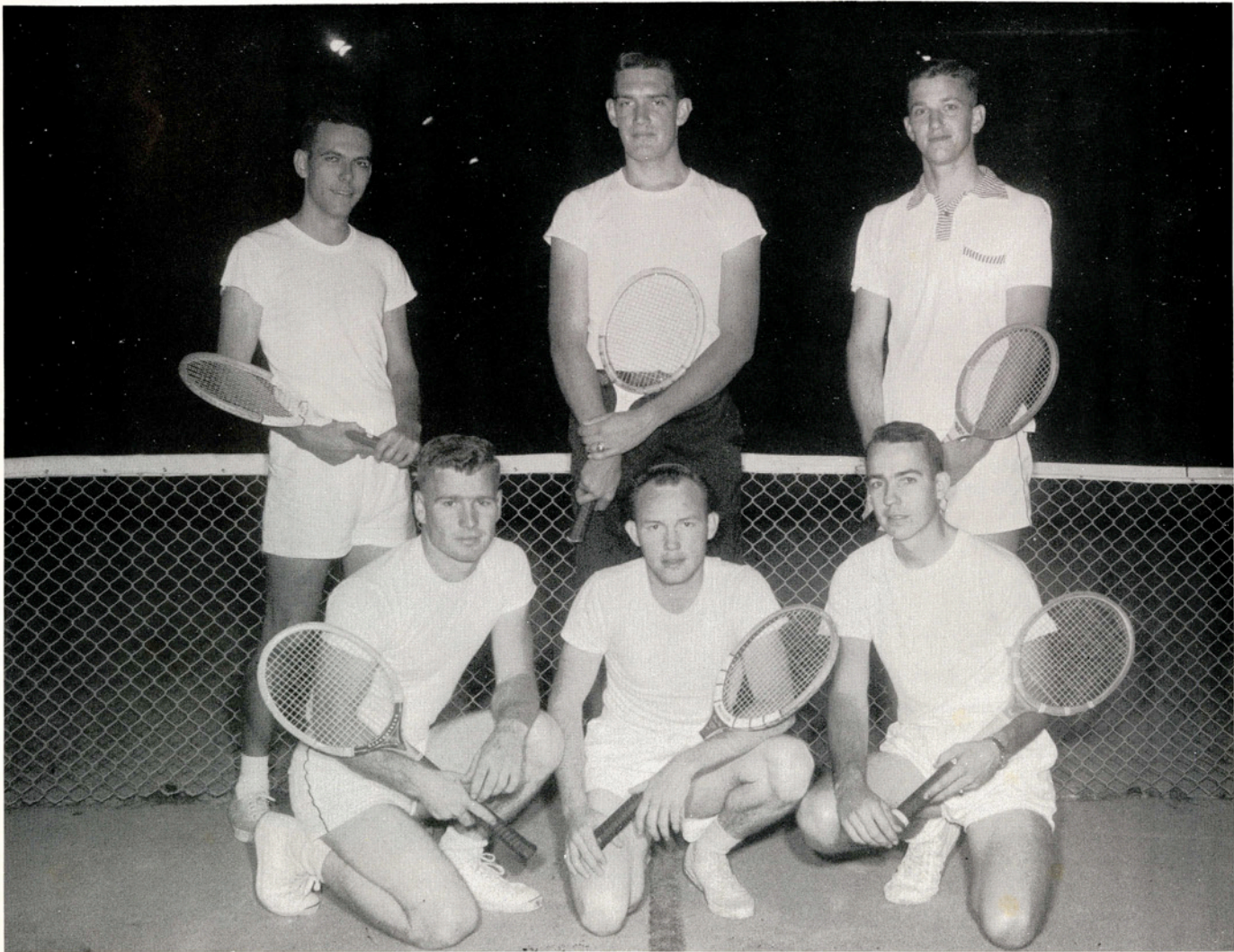

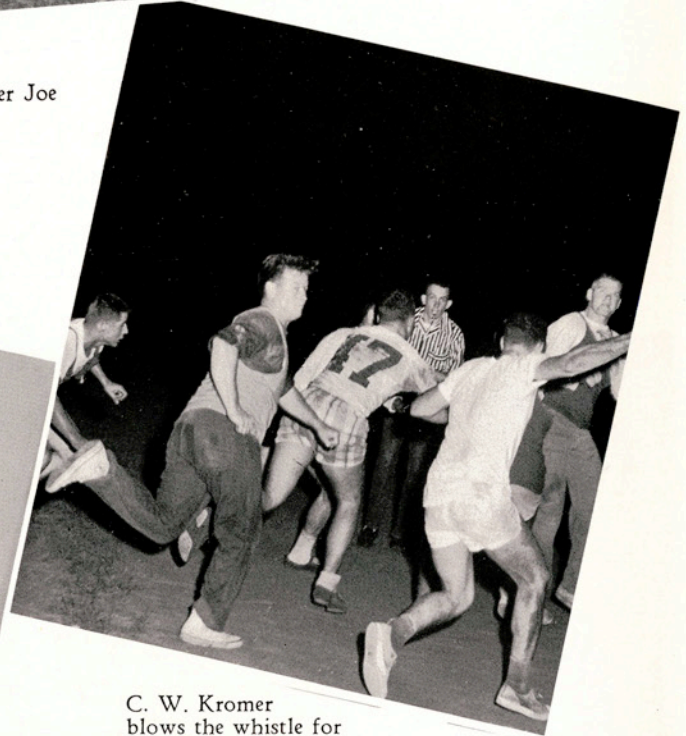

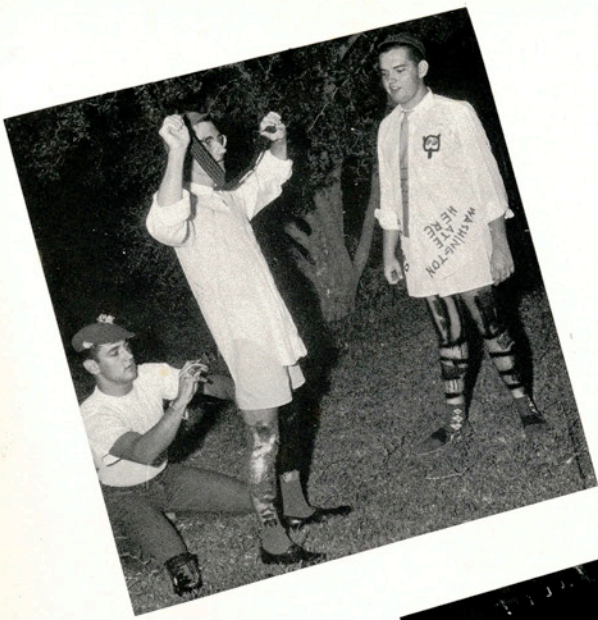

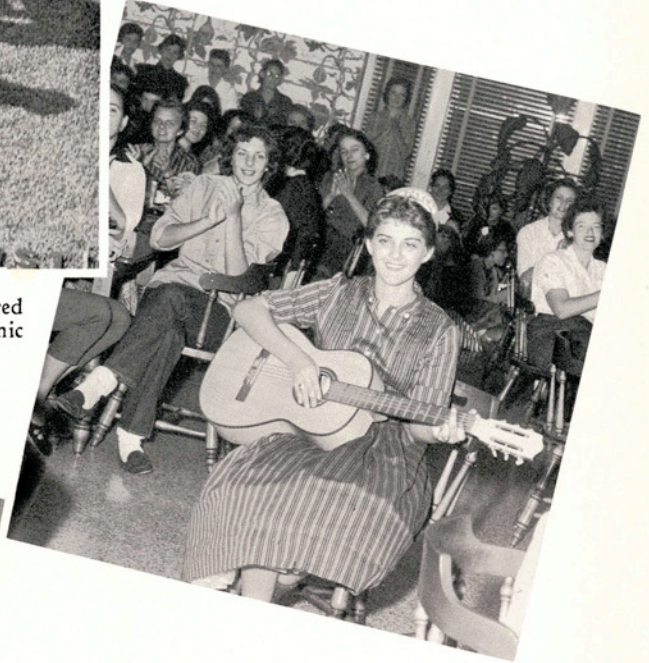

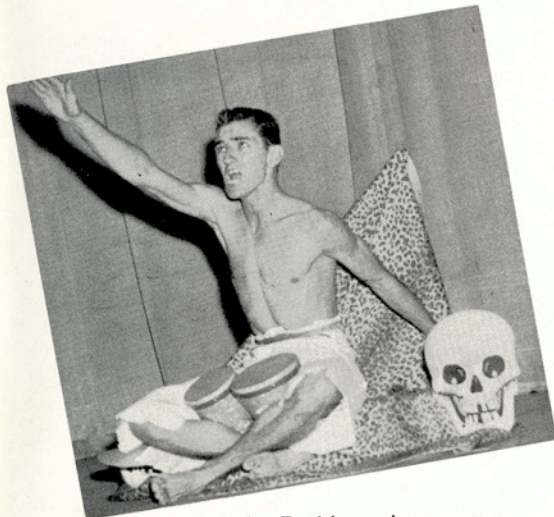

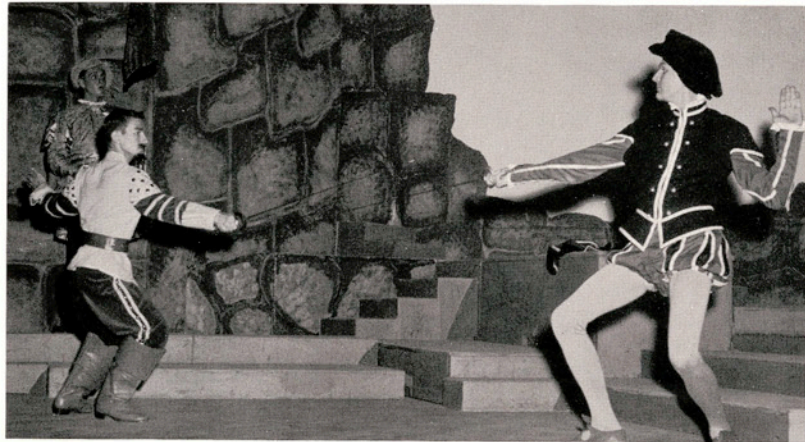

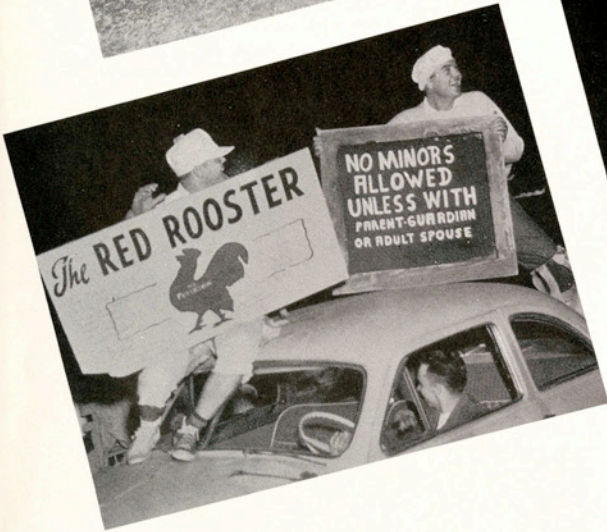

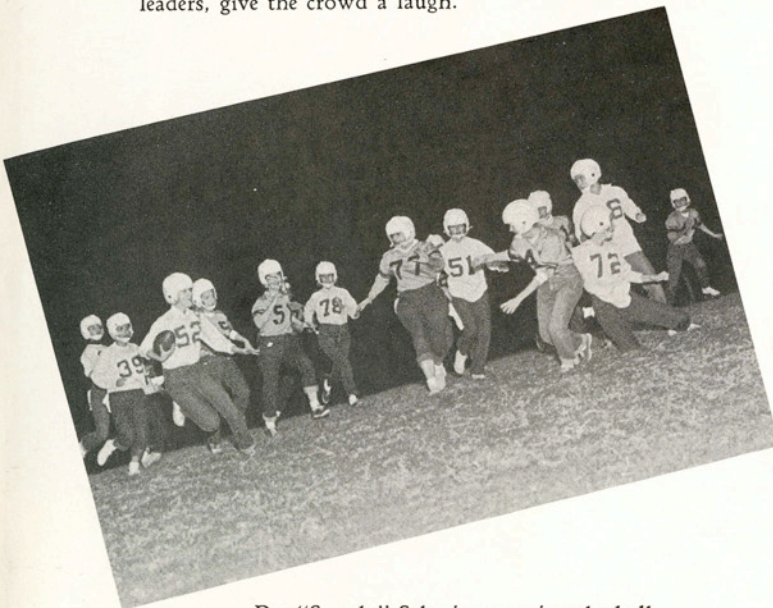

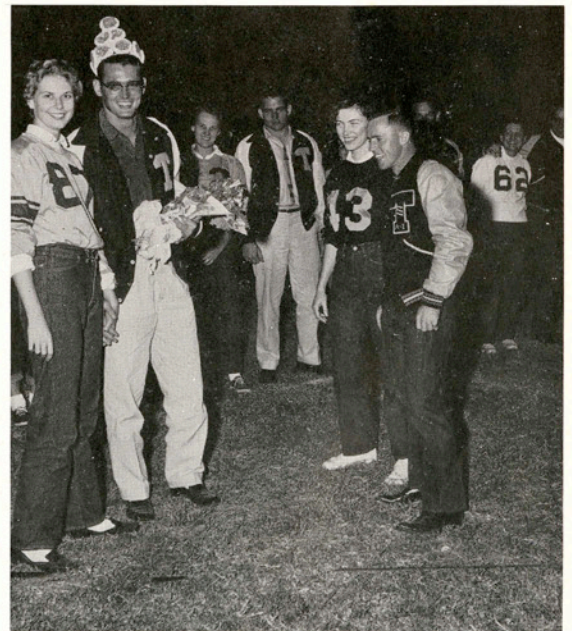

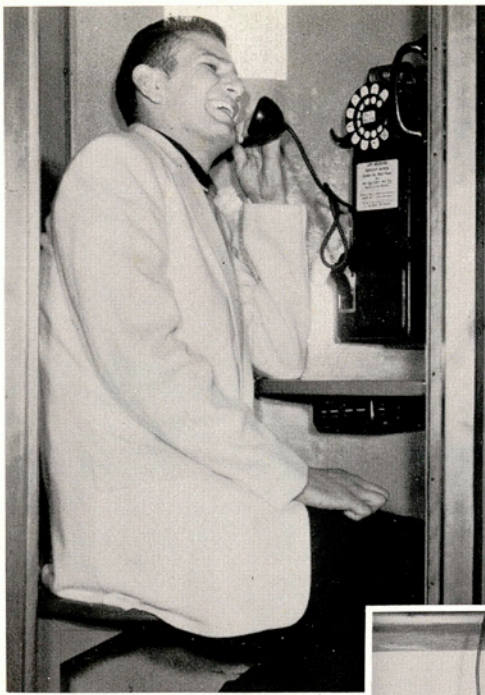

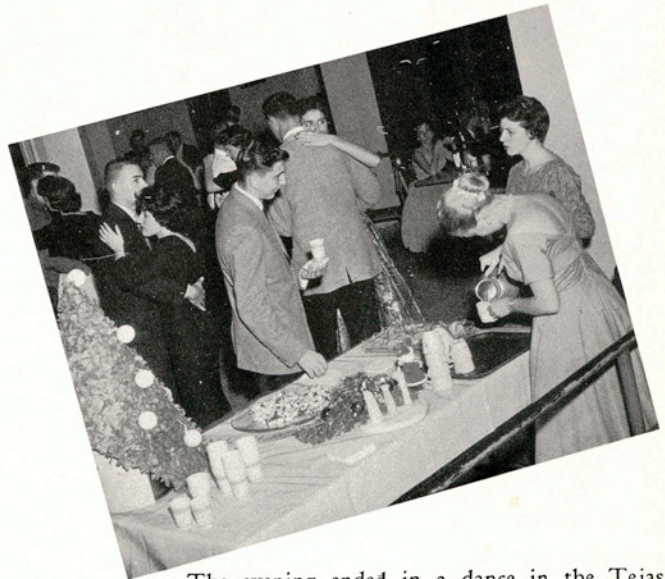

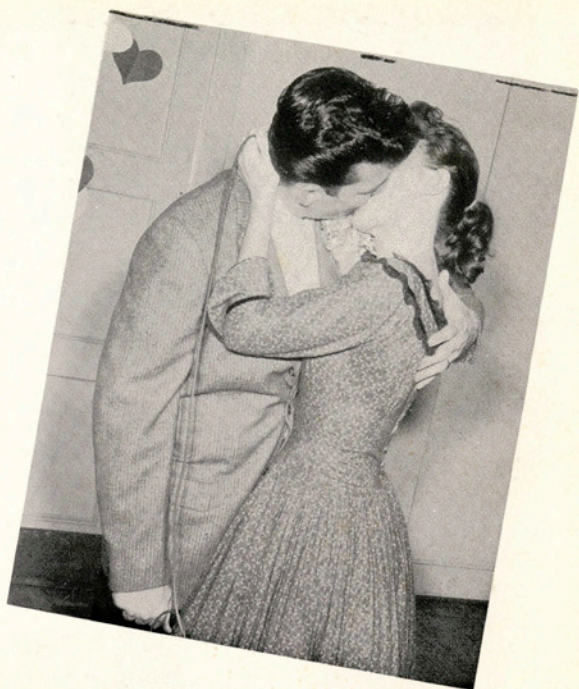
