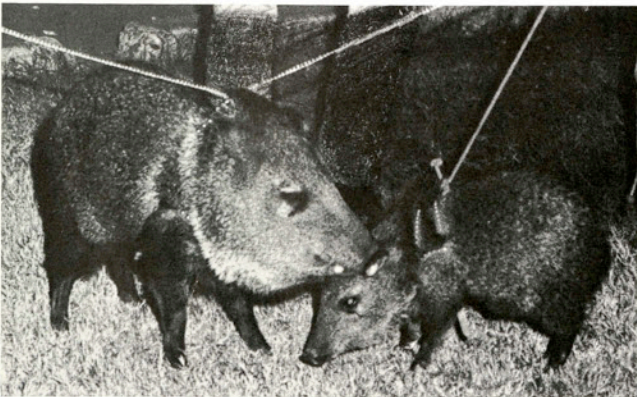

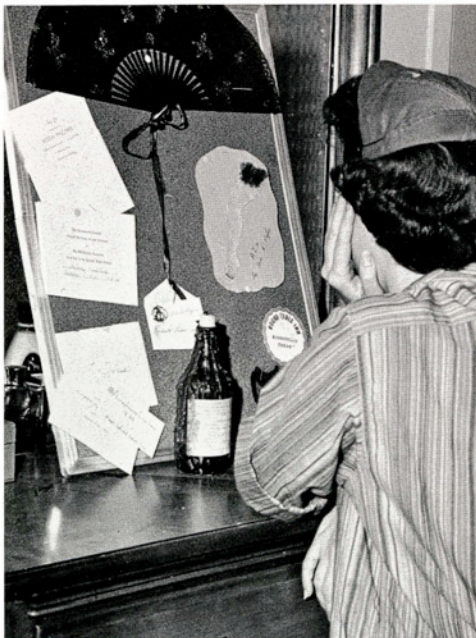

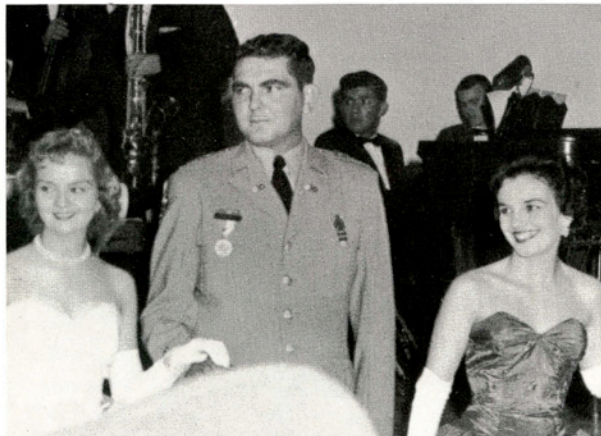

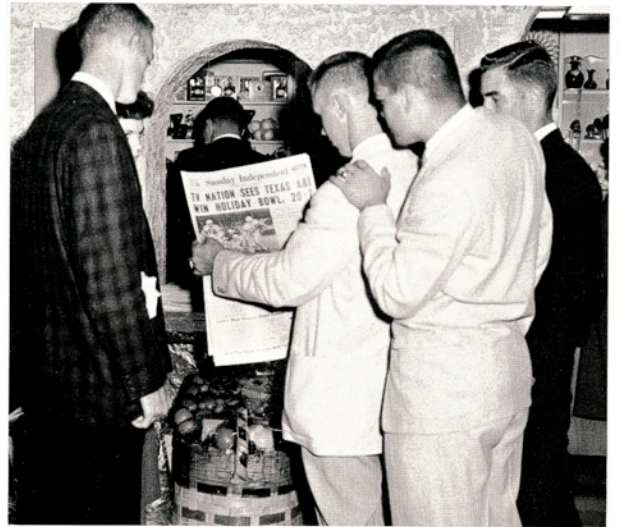

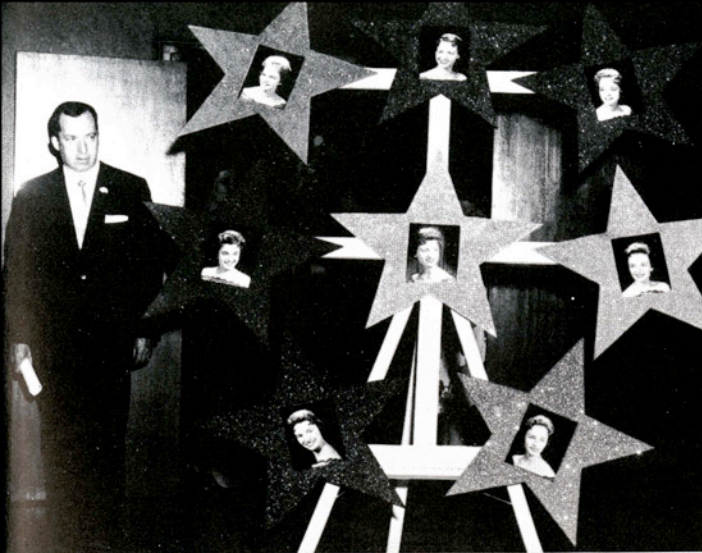

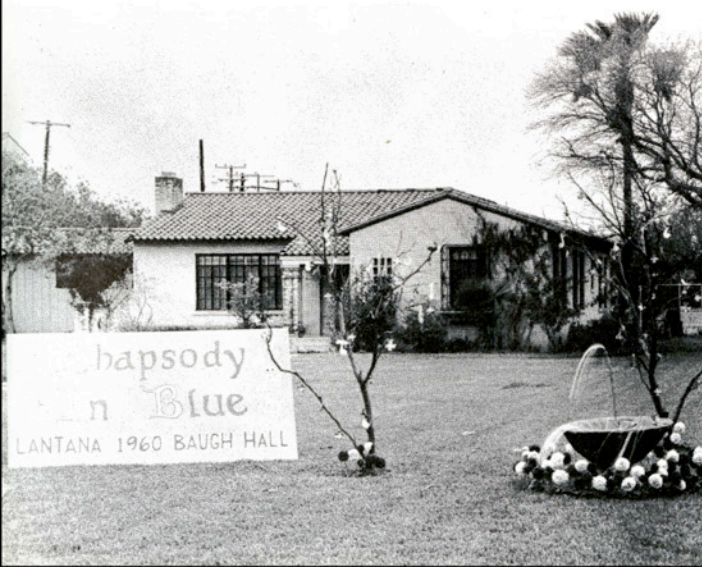

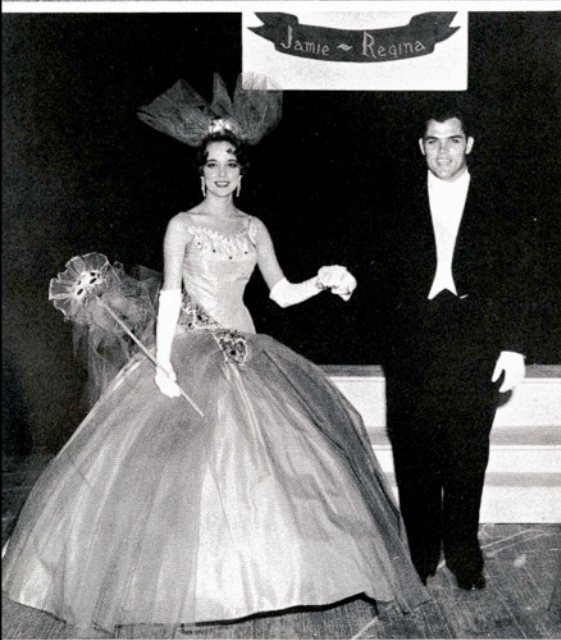

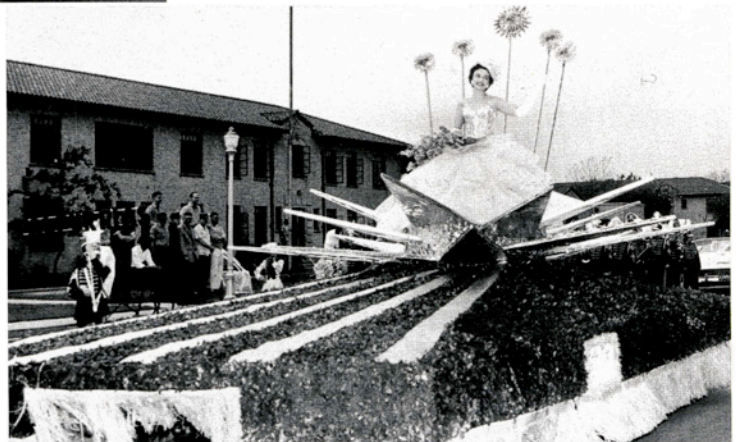

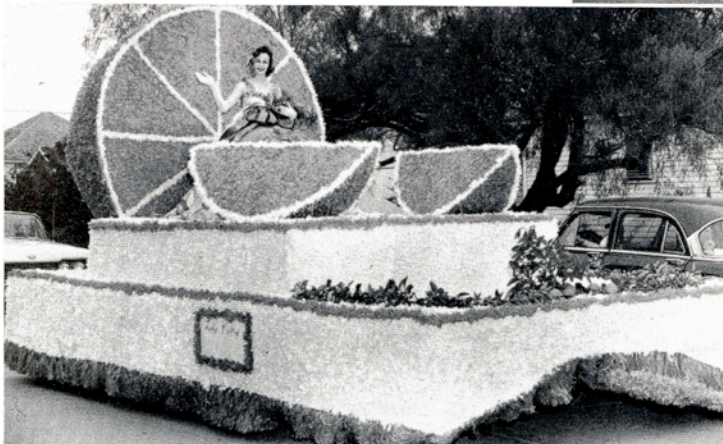

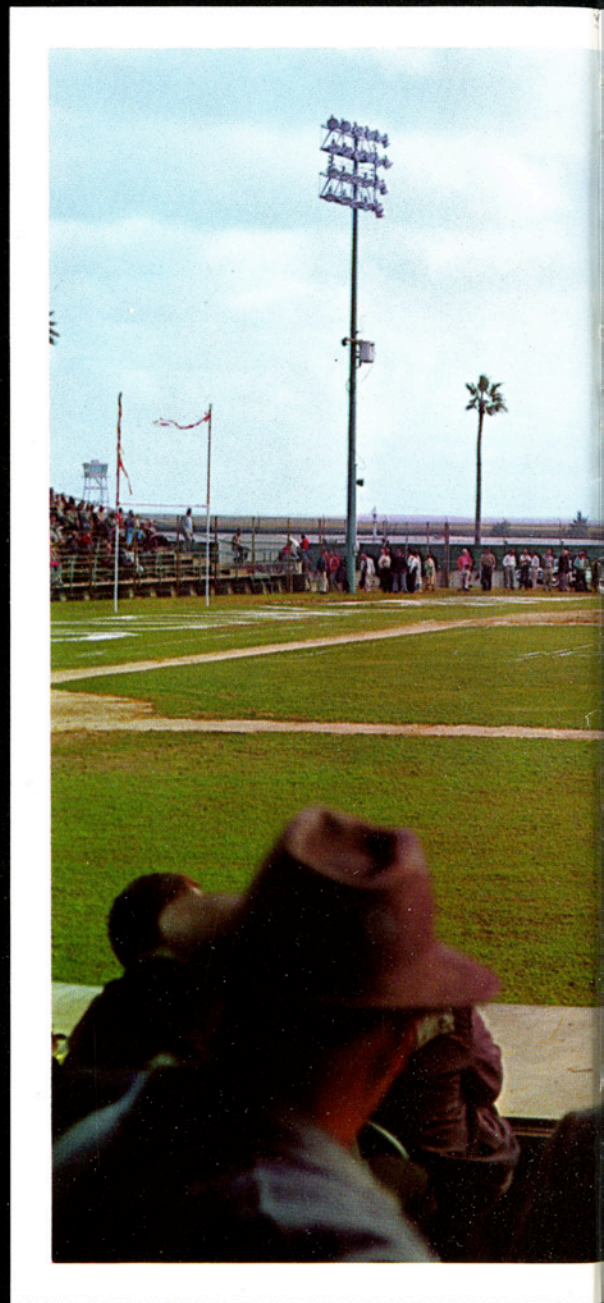

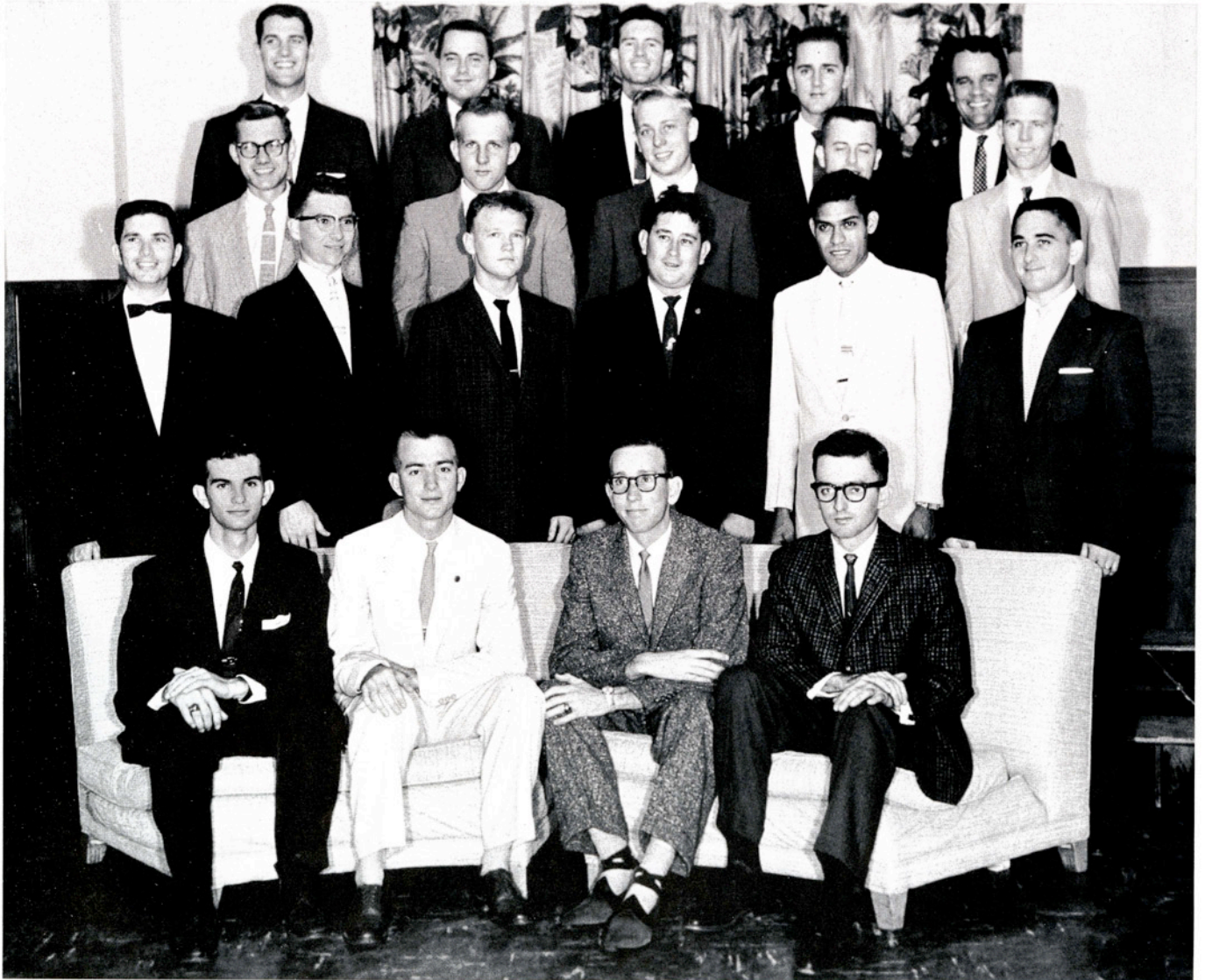

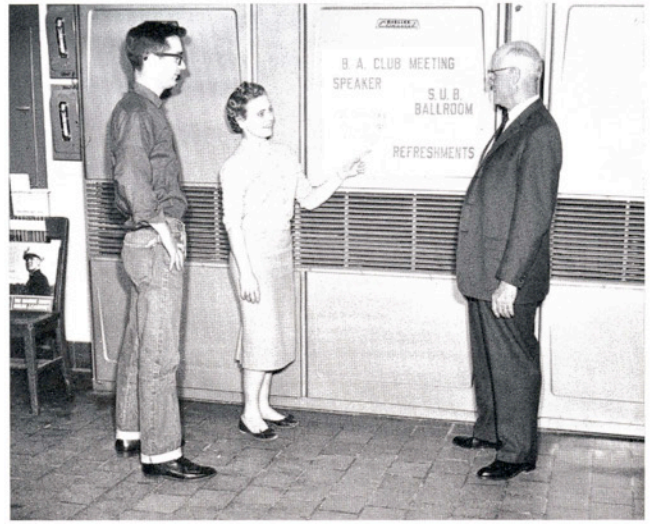

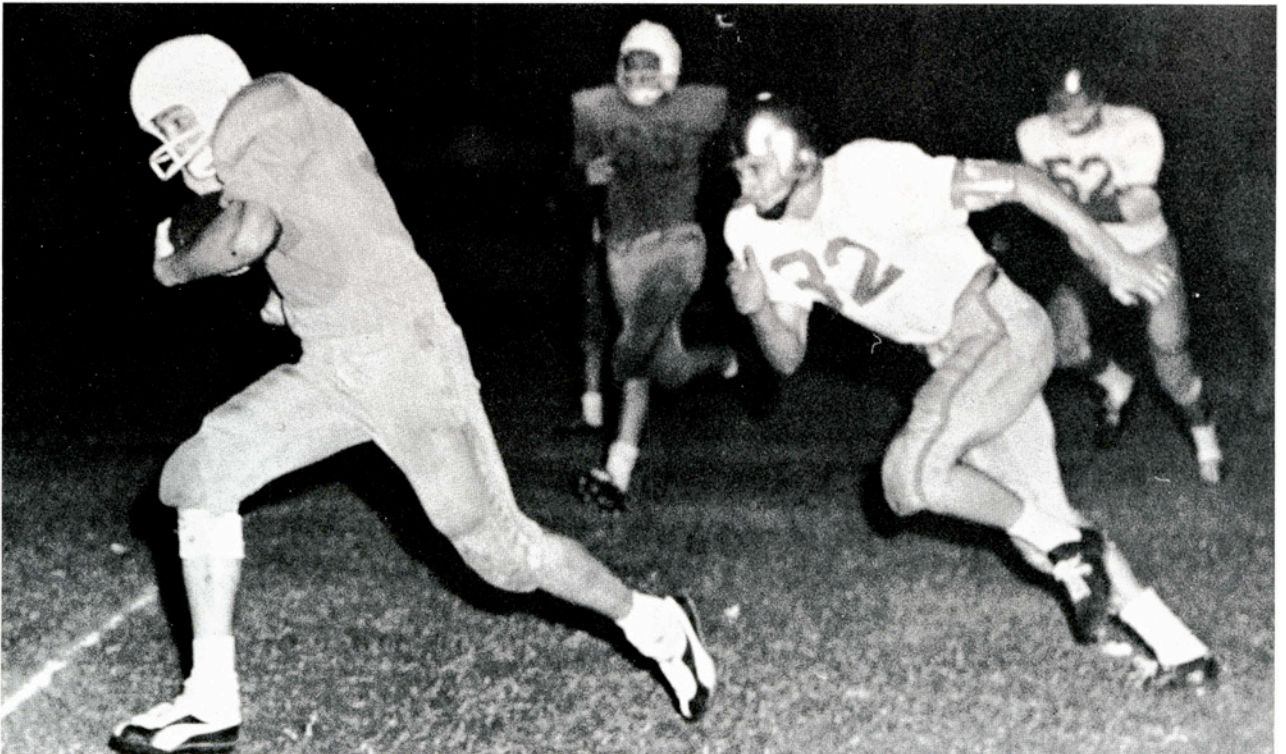

As a squad, the Hogs are particularly strong in the relays, hurdles, and middle distance events. They also have good balance in the field events and sprints.





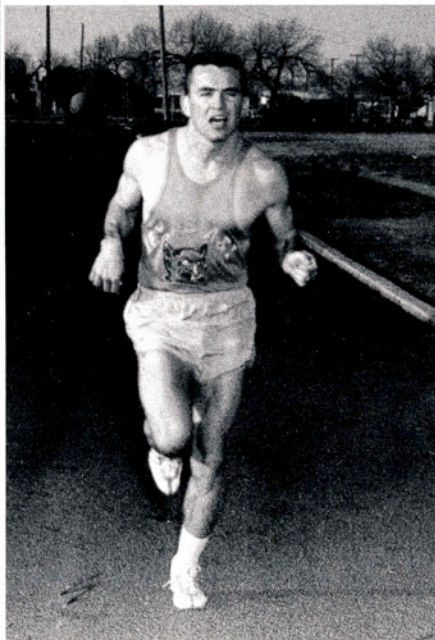

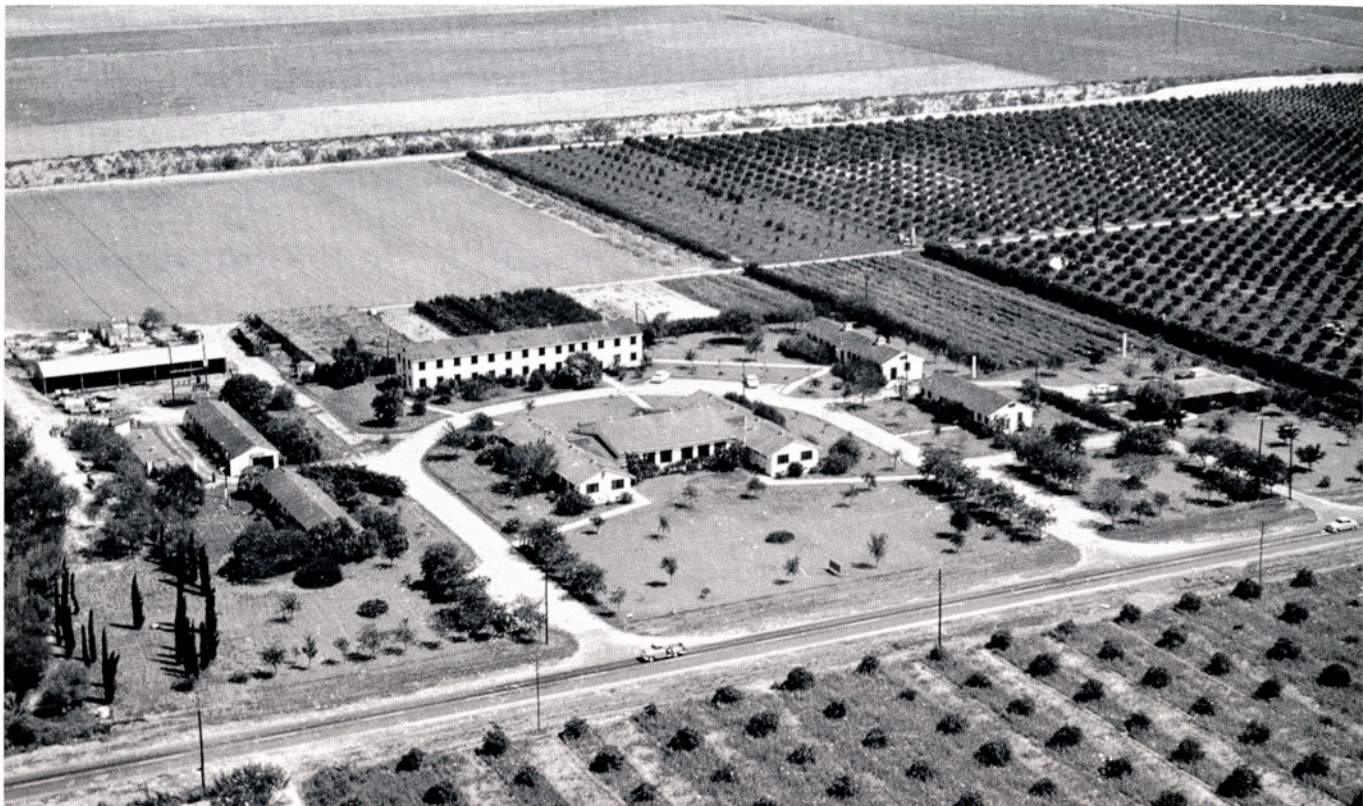

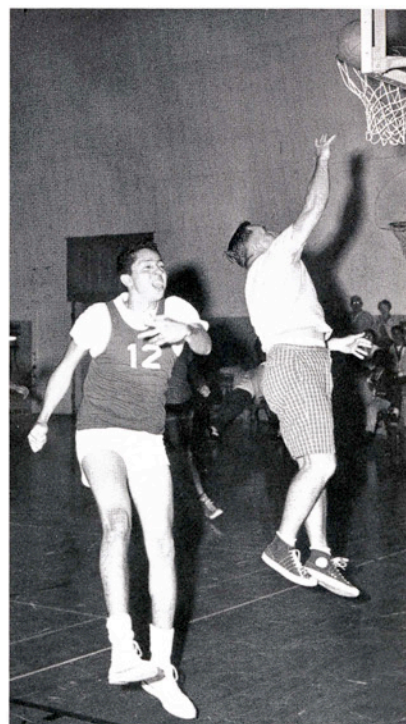
