












Javelinas Win Season Opener 27-0

The second half was much a carbon copy of the first. Sid Blanks slashed over for one score, and All-Conference quarterback Jarrell Hayes pegged a touchdown pass to halfback Tommy Janik to put the finishing touches on the Hoggies' successful 1961 debut.












Wanda wore a gown of blue peau de soie with a drape of white organza and a sequined cumberbund in red, white, and blue.




