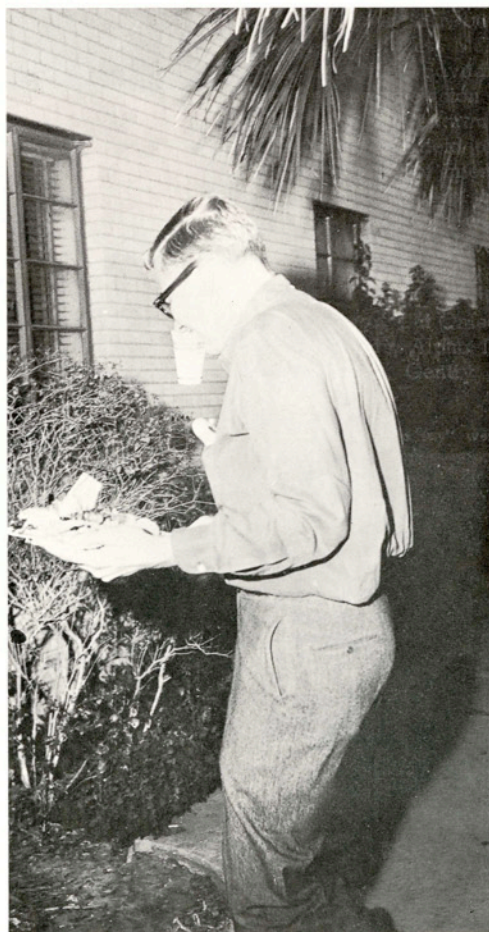

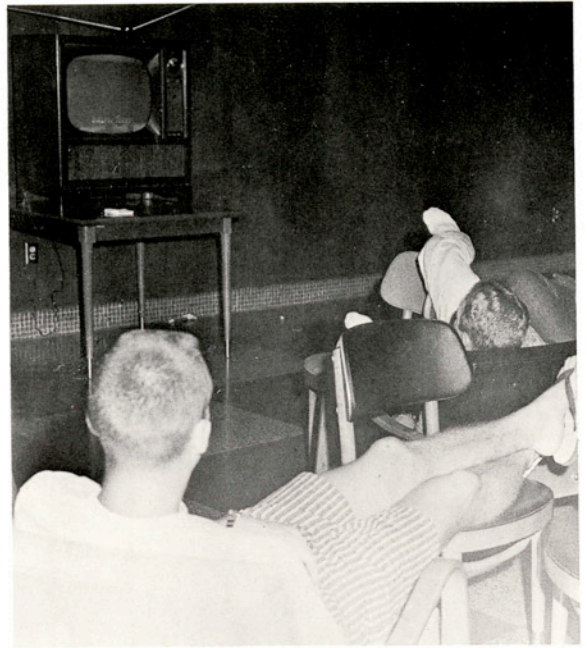

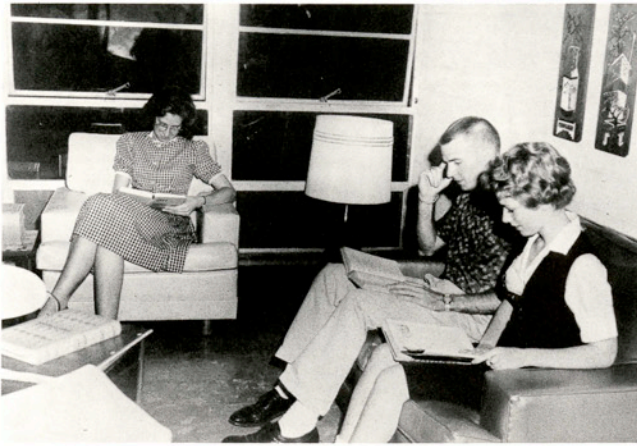

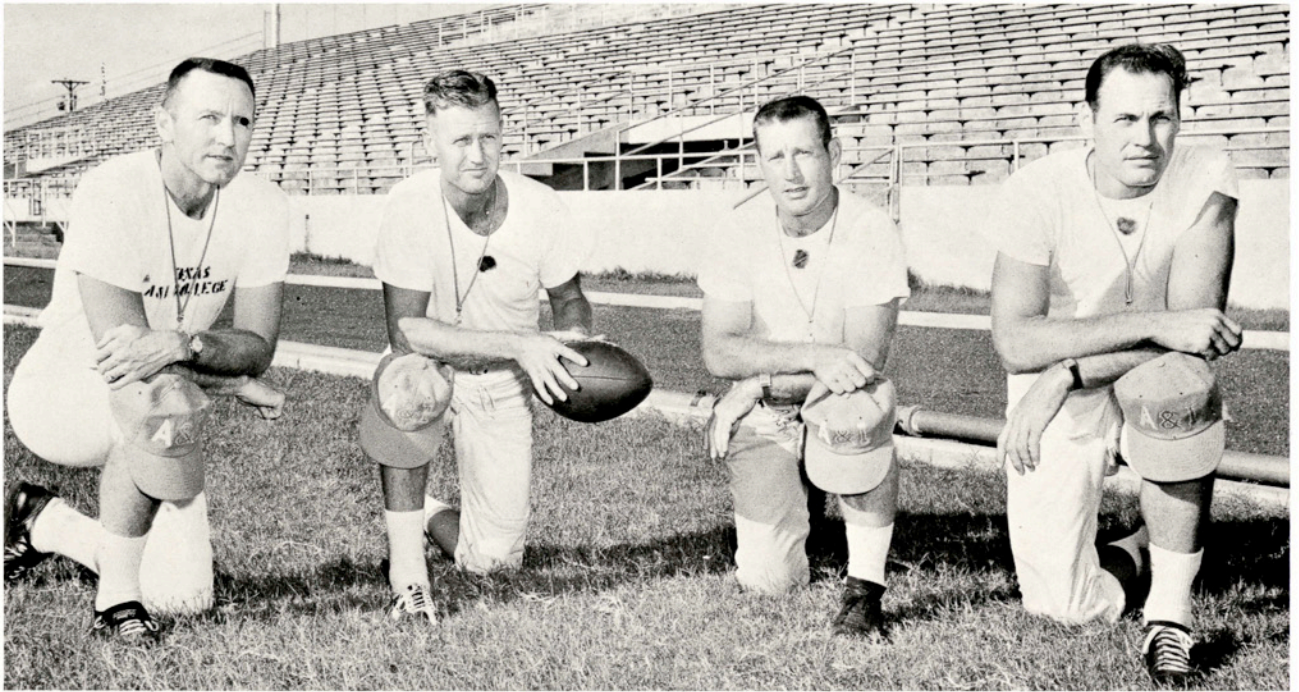

A crowd of 5,500 people watched as the Hoggies scored two touchdowns in each half with Wilbur McDaniel converting three of them successfully. The Tarpons never seriously threatened.

All-Conference Butch Pressley opened the scoring for the Javelinas with a 5-yard run to paydirt, climaxing a 90-

yard drive. Then near the end of the half, sophomore Charlie Curtis added another touchdown to the scoreboard.

The second half was much a carbon copy of the first. Sid Blanks slashed over for one score, and All-Conference quarterback Jarrell Hayes pegged a touchdown pass to half-back Tommy Janik to put the finishing touches on the Hoggies' successful 1961 debut.

The Hogs struck like lightning for the other two scores. Ronnie Holiday returned an intercepted pass 61 yards to paydirt in the first half, and then, following intermission, Sid Blanks electrified the crowd with a 65 yard scoring dash.

## A&I 22 - East Texas State 6

The Texas A&I Javelinas, termed the Number one small-college team in the nation, continued their winning ways with a 22-6 win over conference rival East Texas State before 7,500 fans.

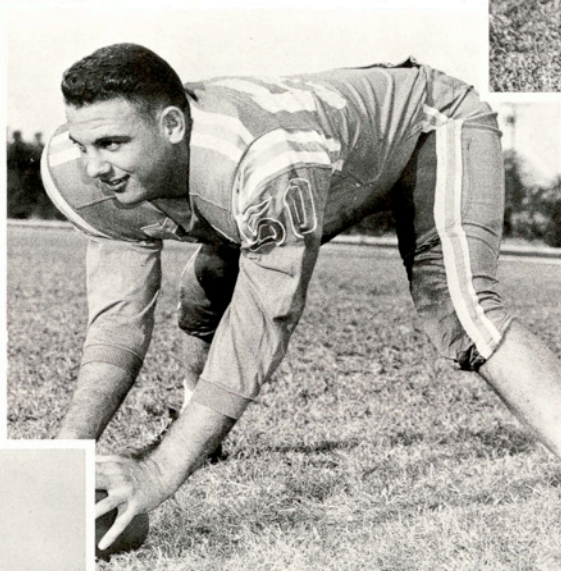

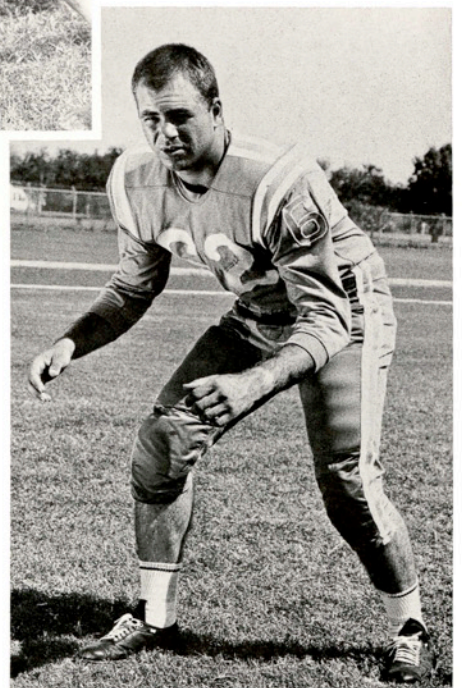

Mauricio Leal opened the scoring parade with an 89-yard punt return followed by Tommy Janik's successful PAT conversion.

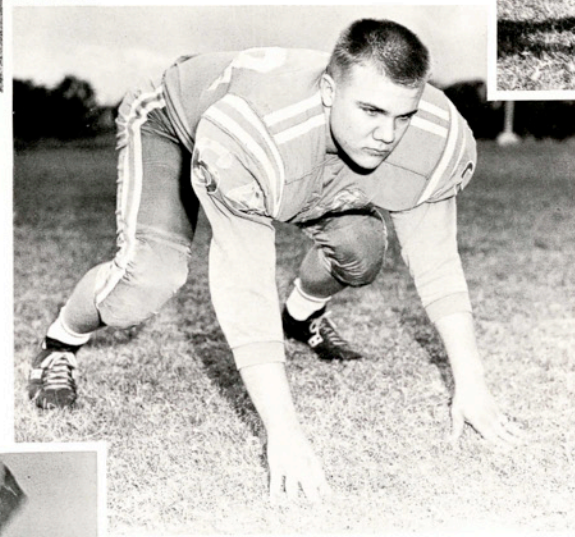

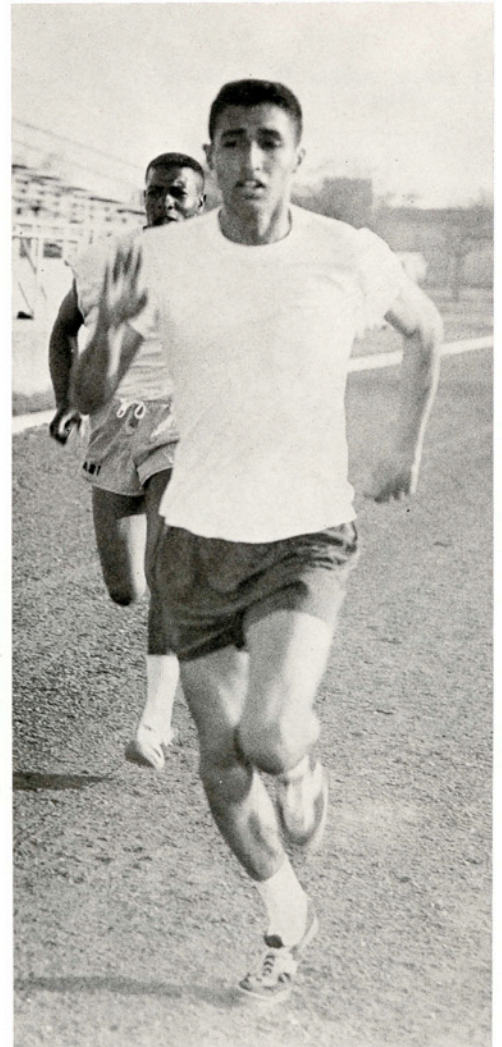

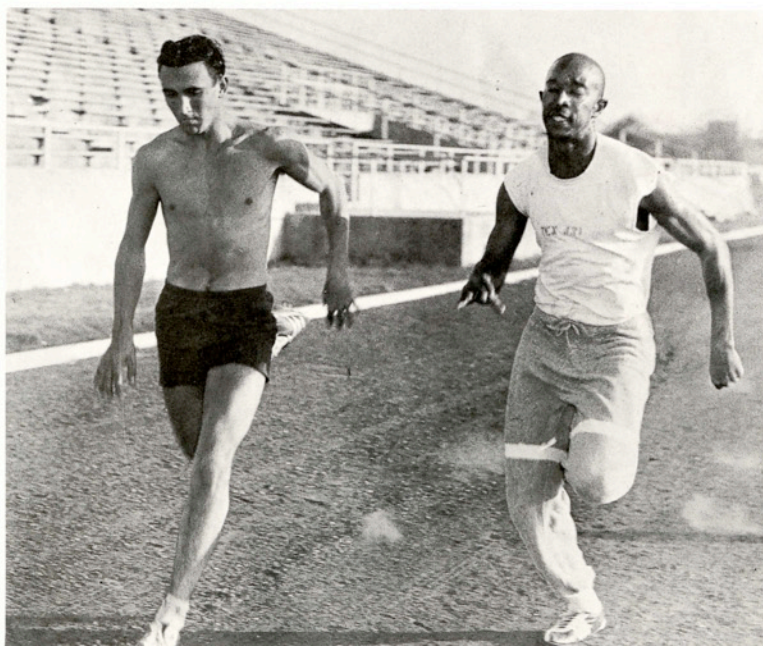

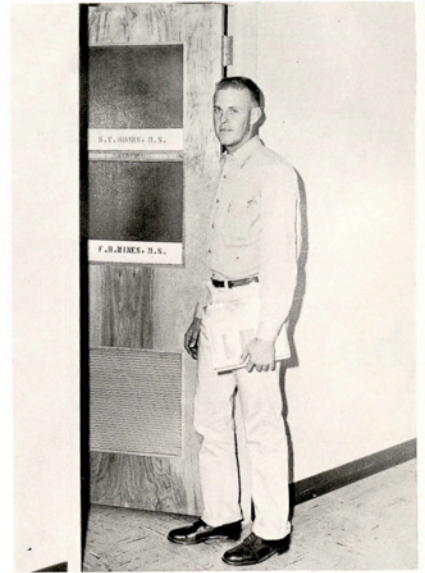
**JARRELL HAYES**

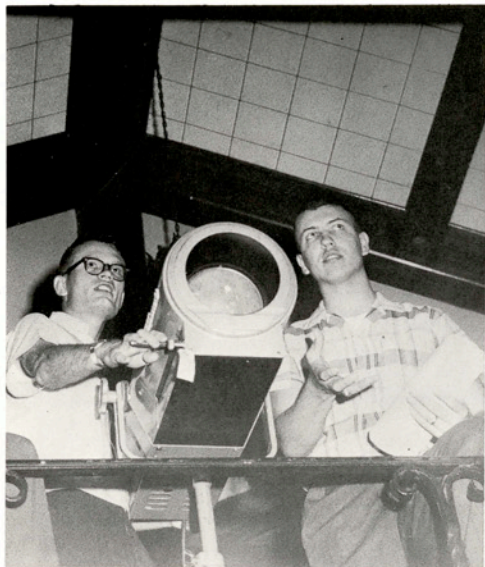

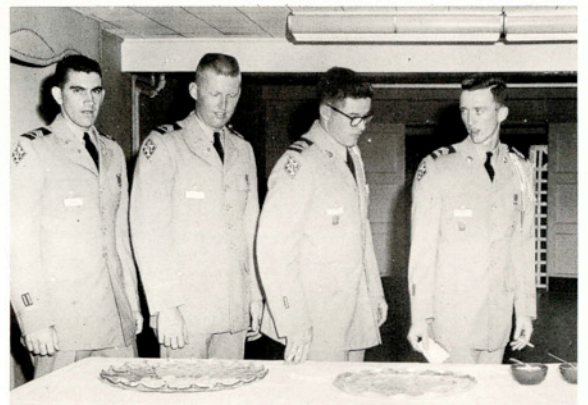

## *Lady Penny Potter*

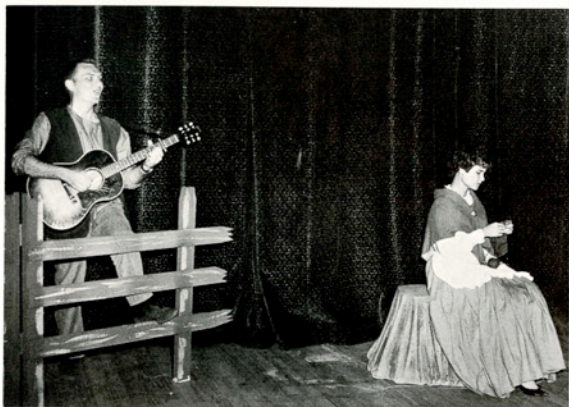

A comedy act featuring Warren Dwyer and Marie Norquest was Lady Penny's presentation number, and it consisted of a series of Revolutionary War ballads.

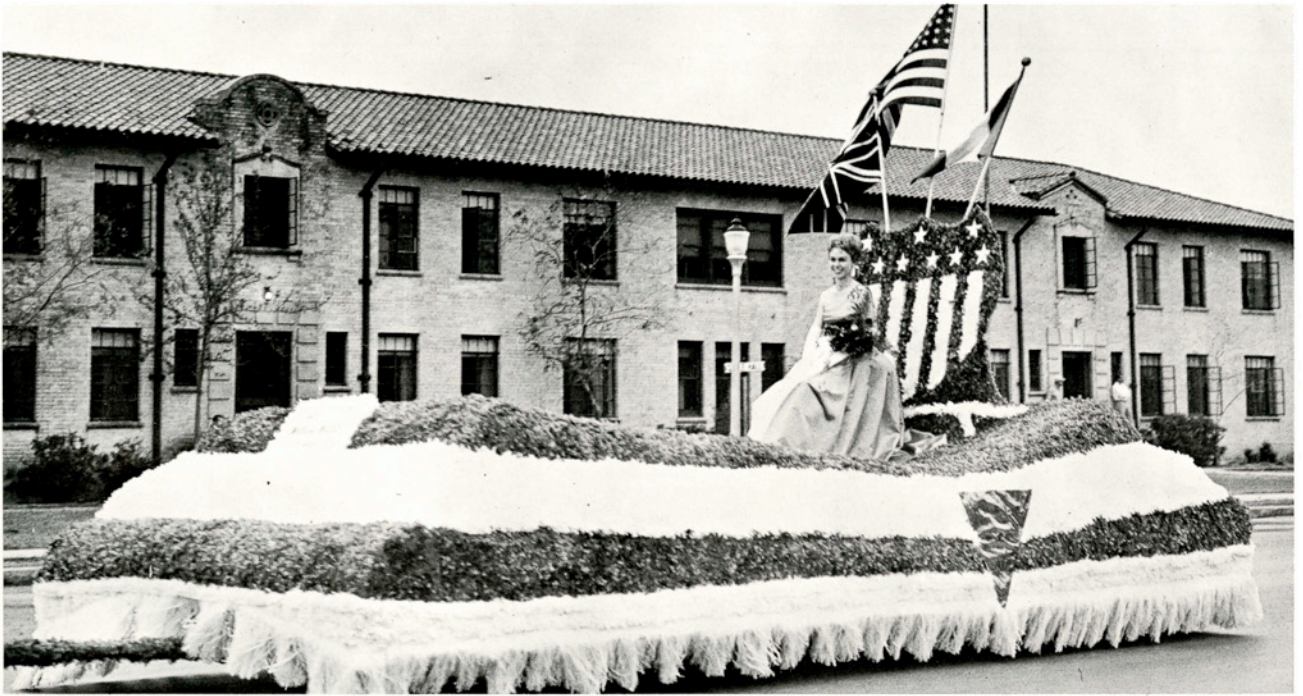
A gown of pink brocaded satin outlined in black, and panniers of black tulle and a pinafore top created the effect of the colonial era. Penny wore a tulle bonnet.

Her escort was Gene Conway.

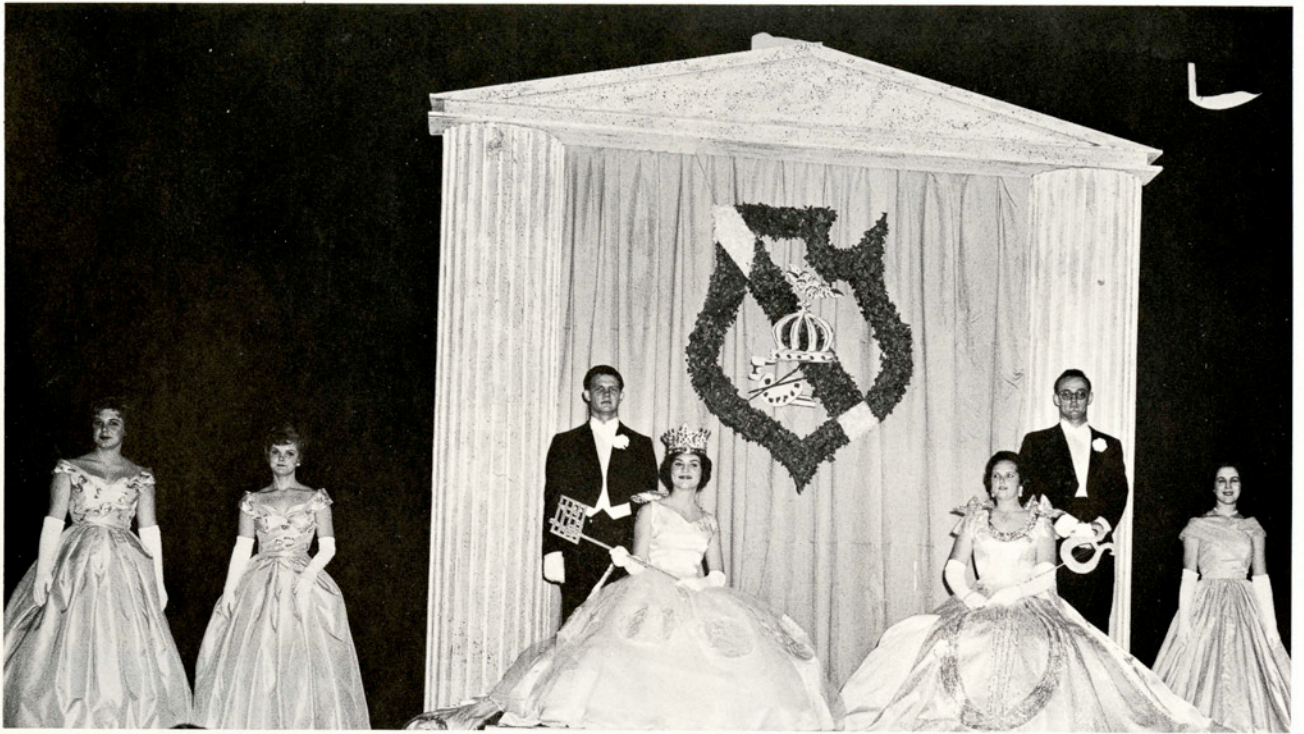

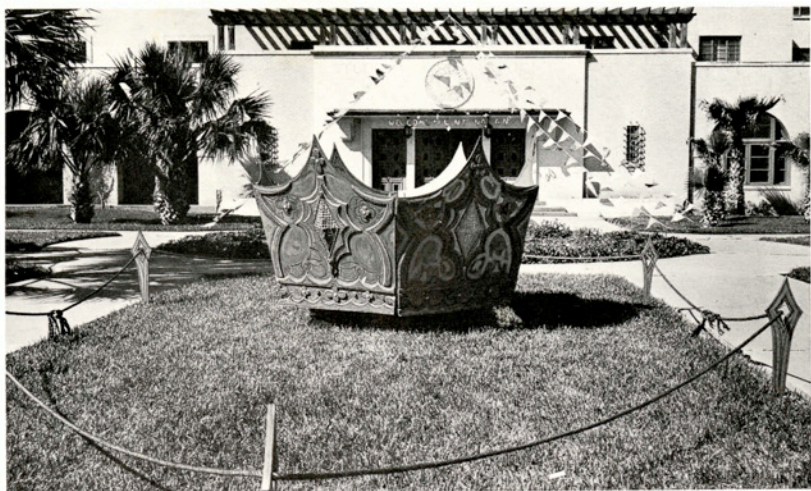
