The Hoggies drew first blood on a seven-yard touchdown dash by Barry Copenhaver. Mario Mena kicked the first of two extra points. The Salukis took advantage of a 65 yard kickoff return by Dennis Harmon to get on the scoreboard via a one-yard plunge by Vern Pollock. Bob Hight, a one-armed place kicker, converted. In the second quarter, Hight sent the visitors into intermission holding a 10-7 lead with a $35-$ yard field goal.

# Old Administration Building 

The Main Academic Building, better known as the Old Ad Building, is a two-story brick building erected in 1925. It houses the Division of Arts and Sciences, the Division of Business Administration and the Division of Teacher Education.



## Kleberg Hall

The modern Kleberg Hall houses the Division of Agriculture. It contains both the classrooms and the laboratories necessary for the study of technological, efficient agricultural production.



## Student Union Building

Center of social life on campus is the Student Union Building. The three-story building houses a student lounge, game room and large ball room which are used for study and social functions. Also housed here is a spacious cafeteria, better known to everyone as the Tejas. A branch of the United States Post Office also is quartered within the SUB.



Nierman Science Hall

Surrounded by trees and connected to the Physics and Old Administration Buildings by two arched breeze-ways is the J. L. Nierman Science Hall. The building houses the Departments of Biology and Chemistry, providing large, well-equipped laboratories for the use of students.


## Javelina Gymnasium

Scene of many Javelina basketball games is the Javelina Gymnasium, with a seating capacity of 700. The gym houses classrooms, offices, training rooms, a basketball court and the "little gym" as well as dressing rooms. Adjoining the building are a swimming pool and four tennis courts.



## College Store

The College Store was opened for the spring semester. The new structure provides more room for easier display of the books and other items, while the "supermarket" mode of operation makes it faster and more comfortable for the students to make their purchases.




## Speech Building

The Speech Building is part of the Frank C. Smith Art Center which also includes the Music Building and the Art Building. It contains the Little Theatre, in which many of the plays given by the Footlights Club are presented, plus classrooms and offices. It is one of the newer buildings on campus, having been constructed in 1959.
