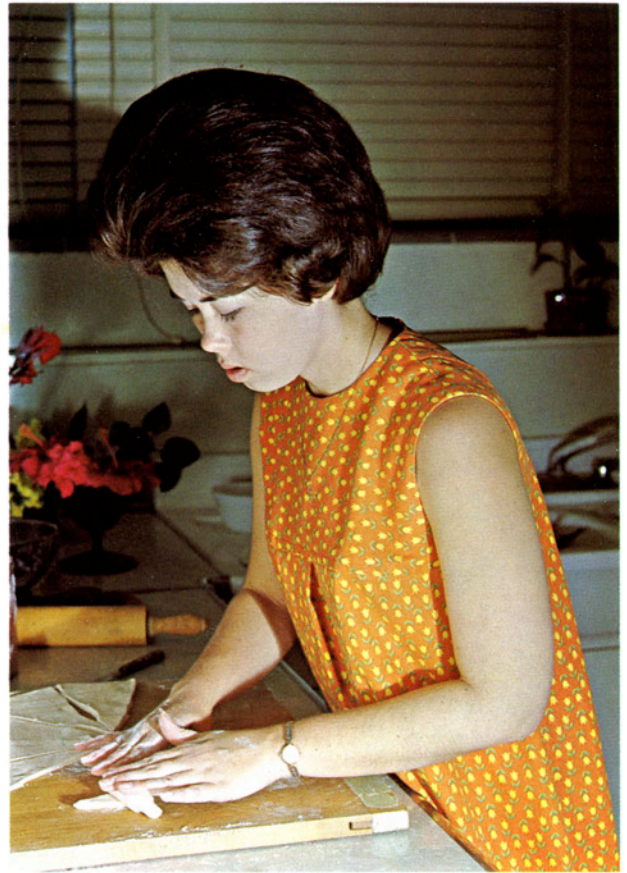

Leisure time fun is caught on the wing when rushed students leave the campus for a quick movie, a miniature golf game, for some good bowling competition.





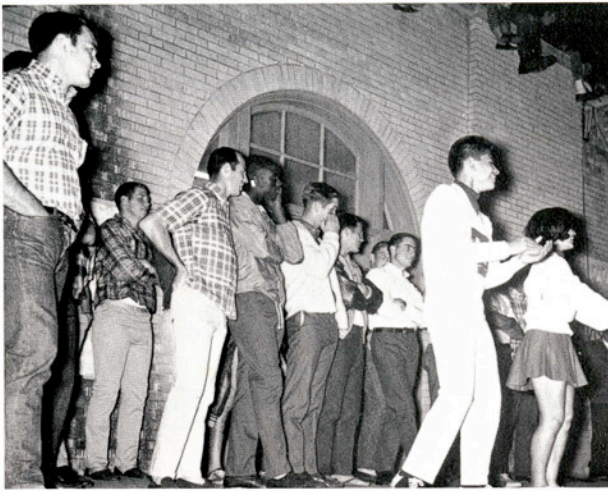

A strong defense held on while a sputtery offense scored 17 points as A&I opened the '67 season with a 17-3 win over McNeese State at Lake Charles, La.

Quarterbacks Karl Dougl and Gene Walkoviak showed the first sign of the duo combination that was to lead the Javelinas to the Lone Star Conference crown.

Douglas threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to Dwight Harrison for A&I's first touchdown; Walkoviak ran a five-yard touchdown in the fourth period.

A&I opened its first home game against Trinity under the sun because Beulah destroyed the Javelina Stadium lights. The outcome of the game was A&I 17 and Trinity 7.

A&I scored first with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Karl Douglas to Dwight Harrison. John Kardow followed with the extra point. Trinity tied A&I in the second period, 7-7.

In the third period Douglas ran in a six-yard touchdown followed by Kardow's kick. Kardow kicked a 33-yard field goal in the last quarter for the final score.

The Texas A&I defensive unit turned in a brilliant performance as the Javelinas rolled over Stephen F. Austin 16-0 in the first Lone Star Conference game.

The defensive unit intercepted four passes and limited the Lumberjacks to 34 yards passing and 135 yards rushing.

Quarterback Gene Walkoviak accounted for 163 yards total offense, completing seven of eight passes and scoring a touchdown. His performances earned him the LSC "Player of the Week" award.

Texas A&I 48 Sam Houston 6

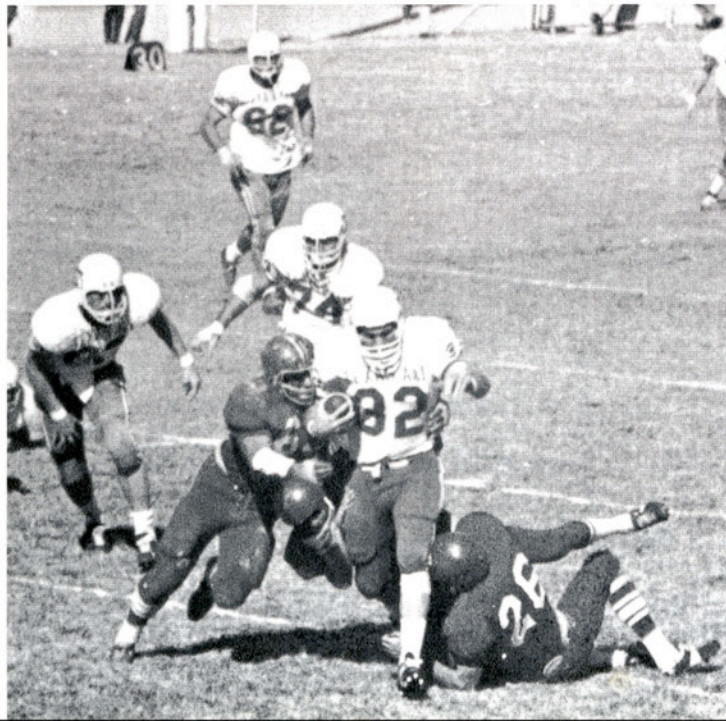
The Texas A&I Javelinas put everything together and smothered the upset-minded Sam Houston State Bearkats, 48-6, for the eighth consecutive win.

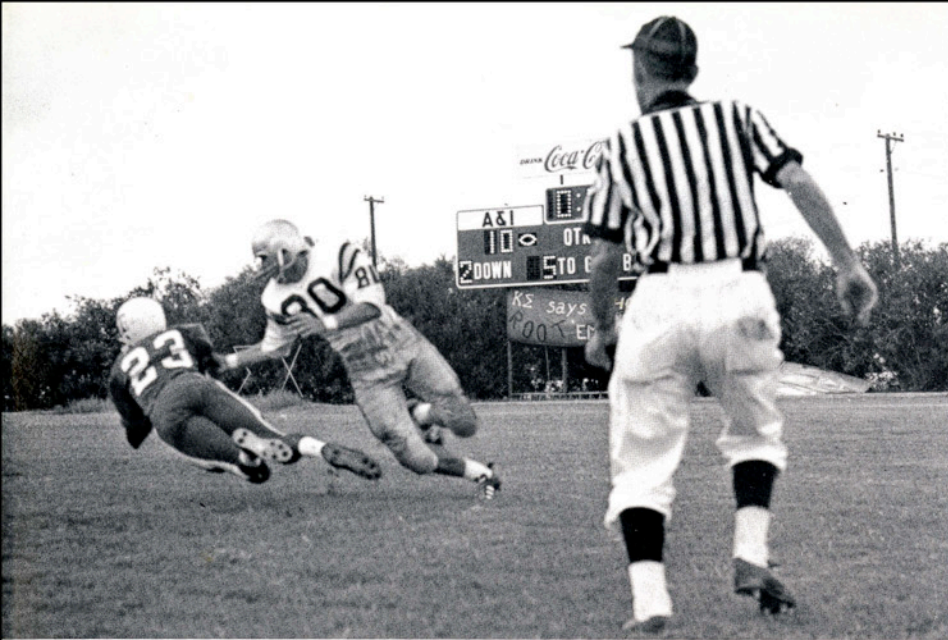
A&I quickly took a 7-0 lead early in the first quarter then started to take a rapid lead over the timid Bearkats who had to forget any big plans they had.

All this is football — on and off the field.

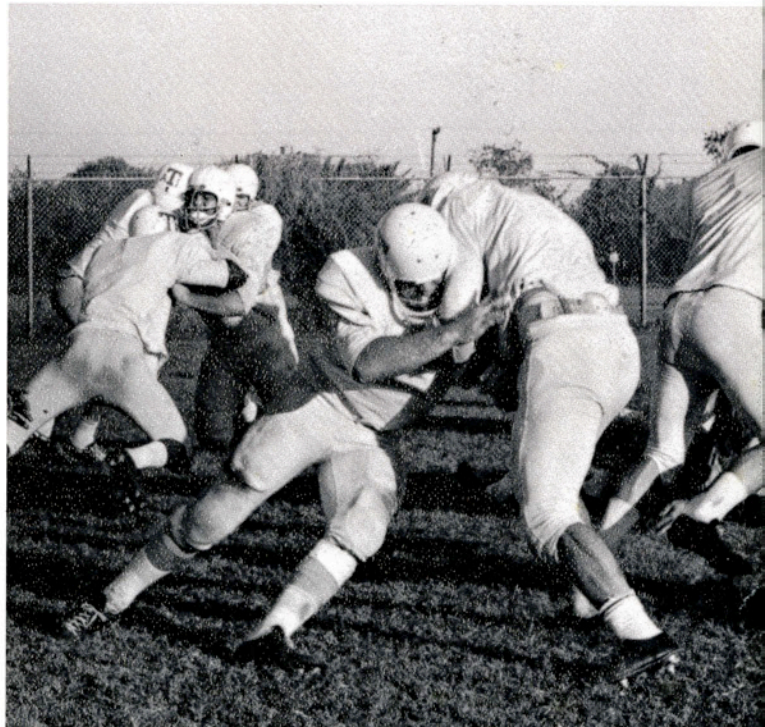

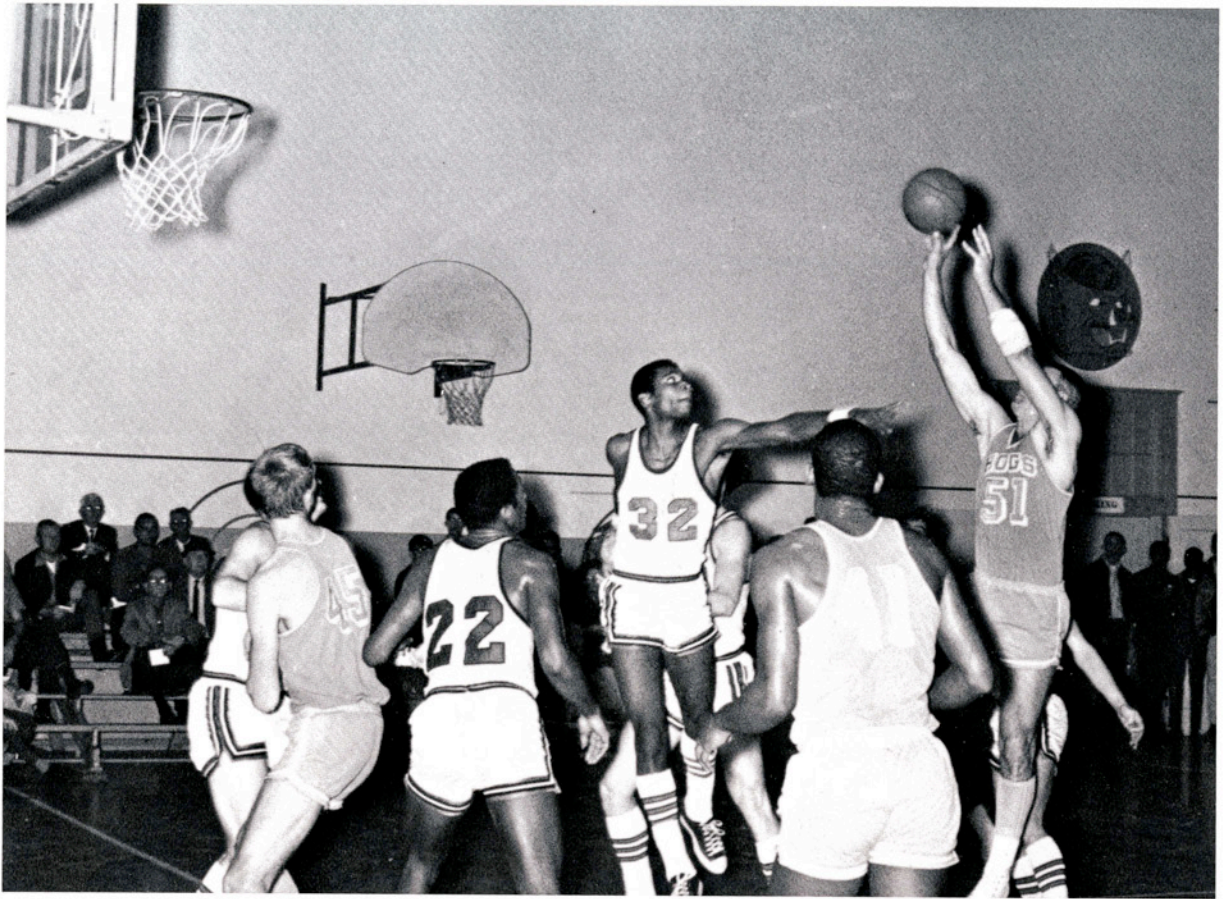

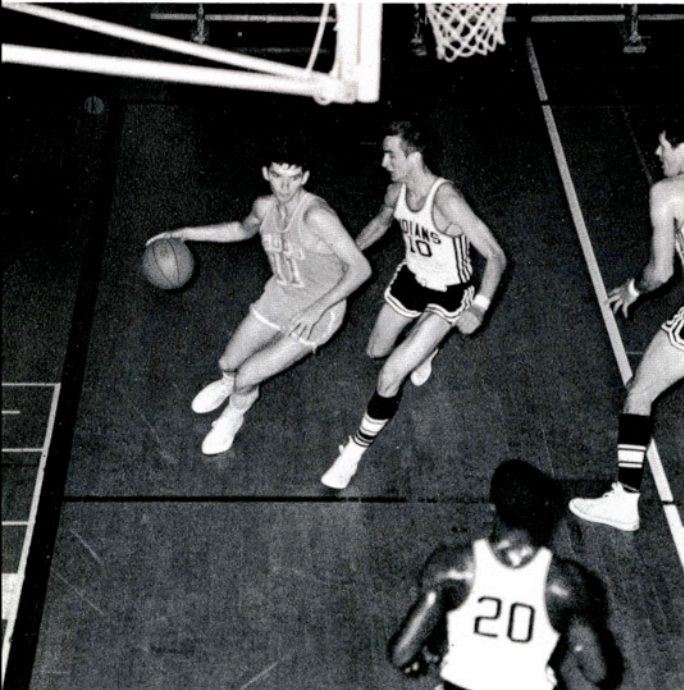

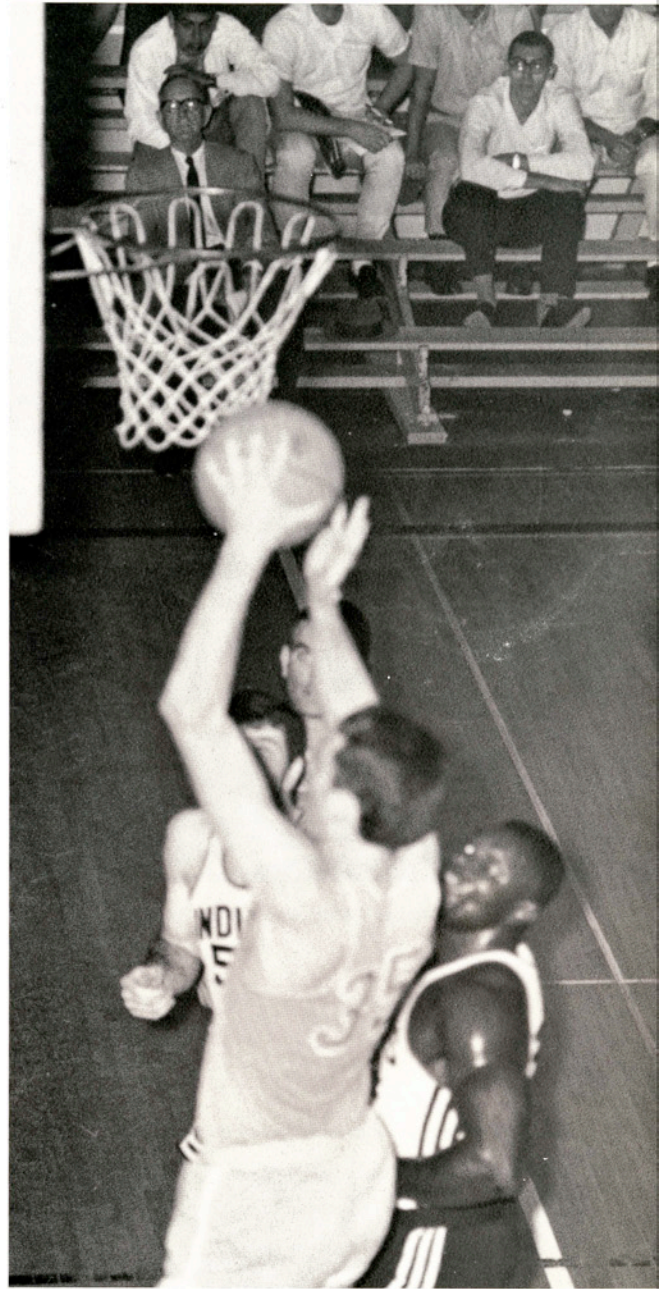

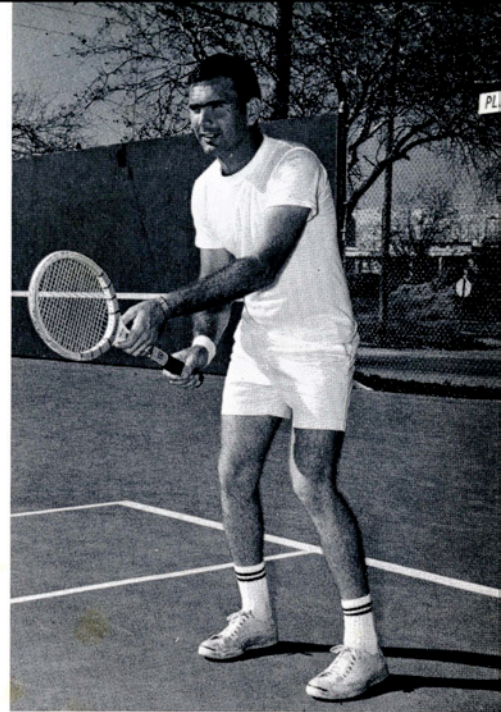

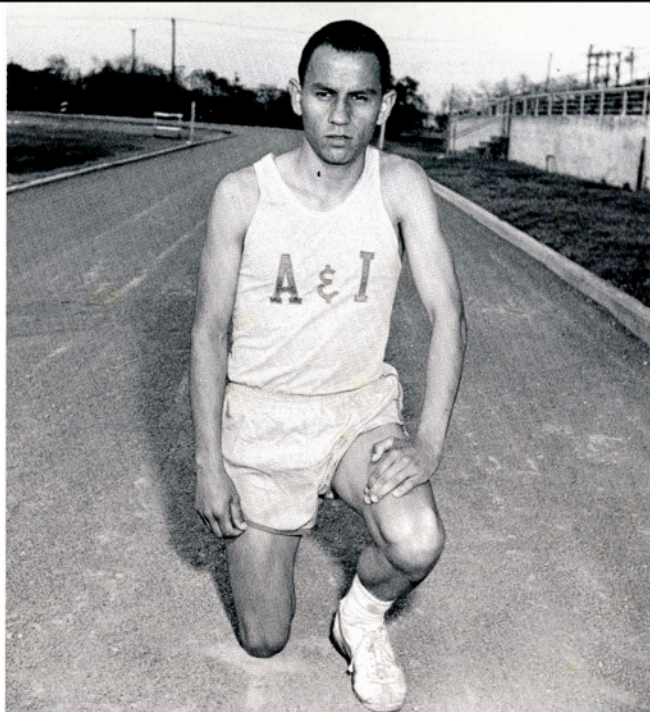

Where There Is Something for Everyone

Being a part of the speech department does not mean that a student is limited to the area of plays and their production, for this is only a small facet of a very large field that offers something to every individual.

Within the realm of the speech department a student can find opportunities not only to display his Thespian talents in actual performances, but to participate in such events as the newly formed Reader's Theatre, new concept in the interpreting of dramatic works. If not acting a student can put his artistic abilities to work and help supply the costumes and scenery for the various productions.

Few students, regardless of their major, leave A&I without having had a taste of at least one speech course. Speech 101 is designed to acquaint the student with the basic fundamentals of public speaking. Students gain experience in speaking before groups by presenting various types of speeches.

The Texas A&I Speech Department also provides service to the students in the form of audio testing. Any student who feels that he might have a hearing problem is encouraged to ask for a free test of his hearing ability. This testing is also provided to local school children.

Other activities open to collegiates are the debate team and various speech and debate fraternities and clubs. These help to further interest in speech activities.

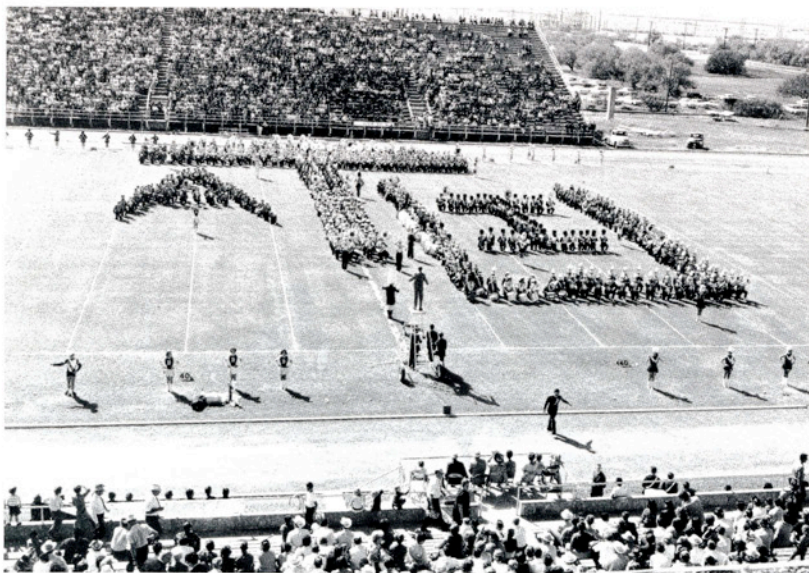

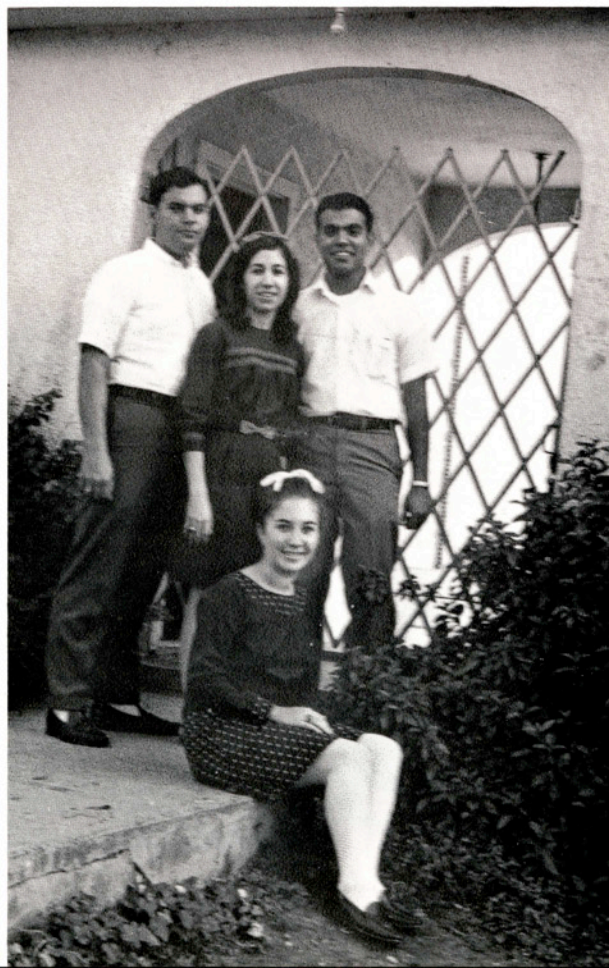

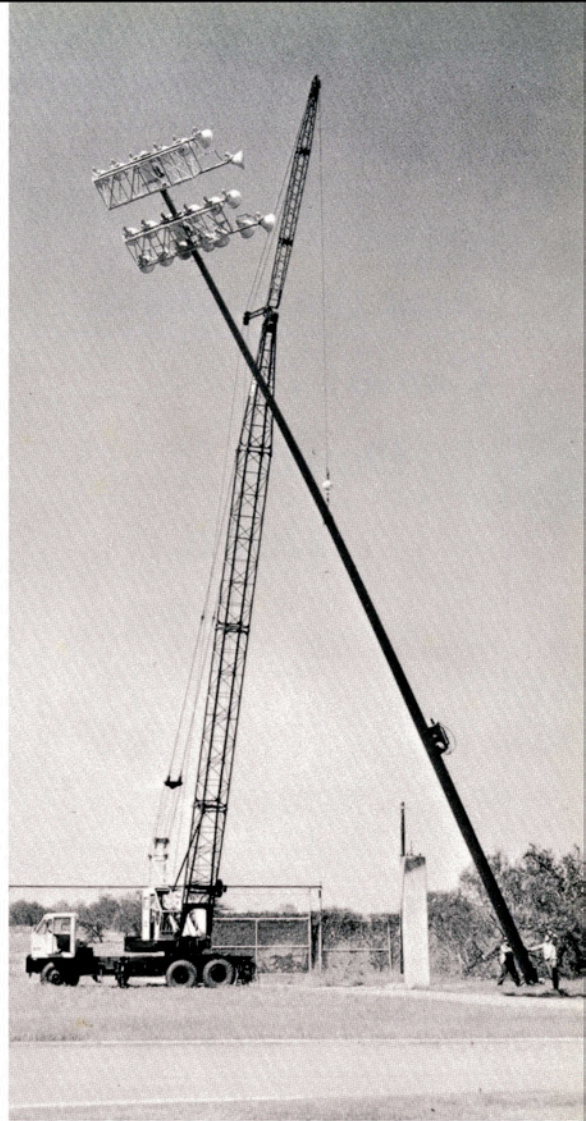
Hurricane Beulah Brings About Destruction And A Little Fun

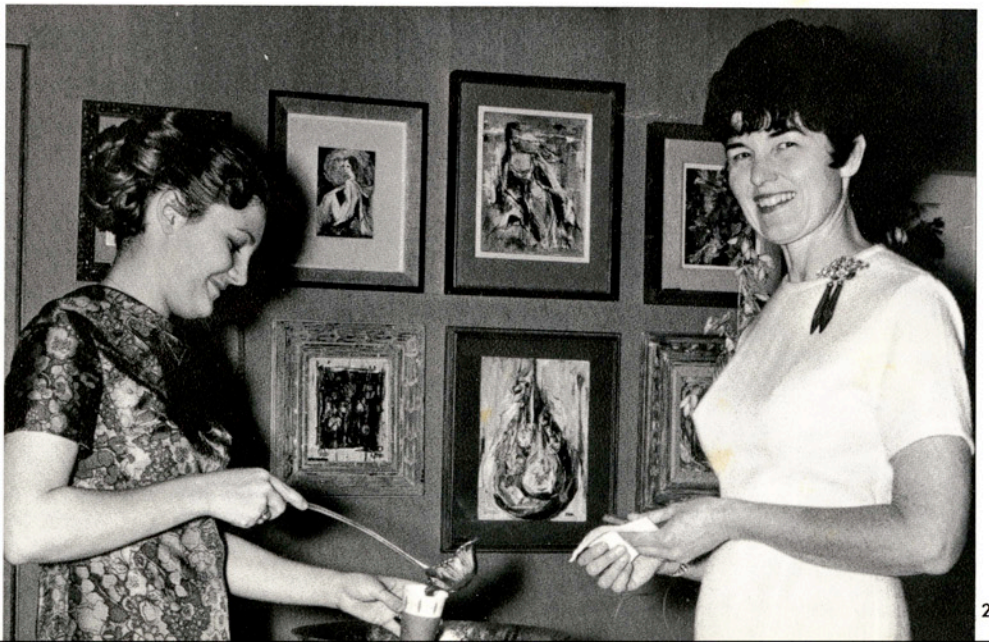

Barber Lectureship Series Features Texas Congressman

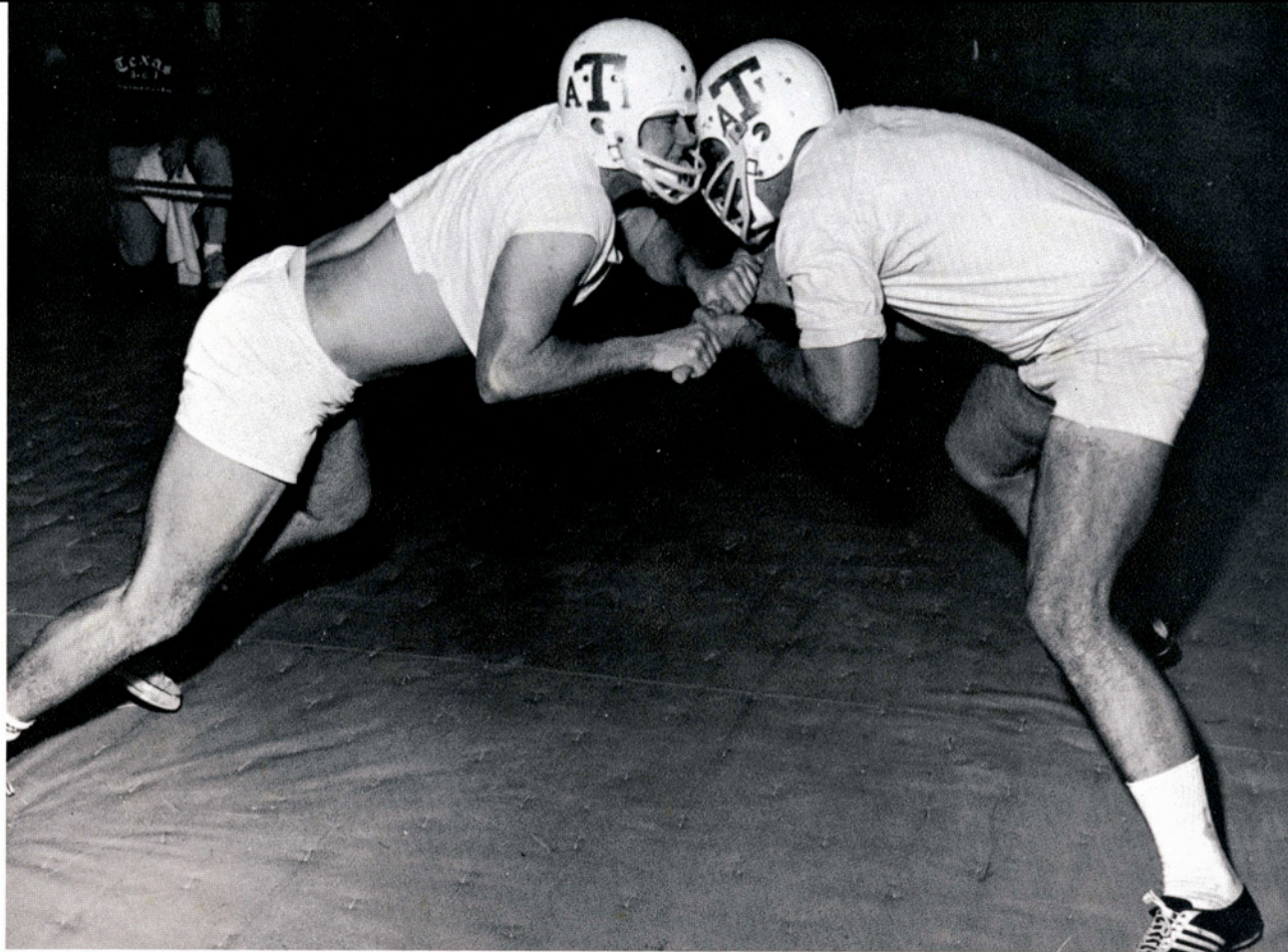

The Lectureship Series was presented Monday, March 4, by the CCF in conjunction with the university administration.



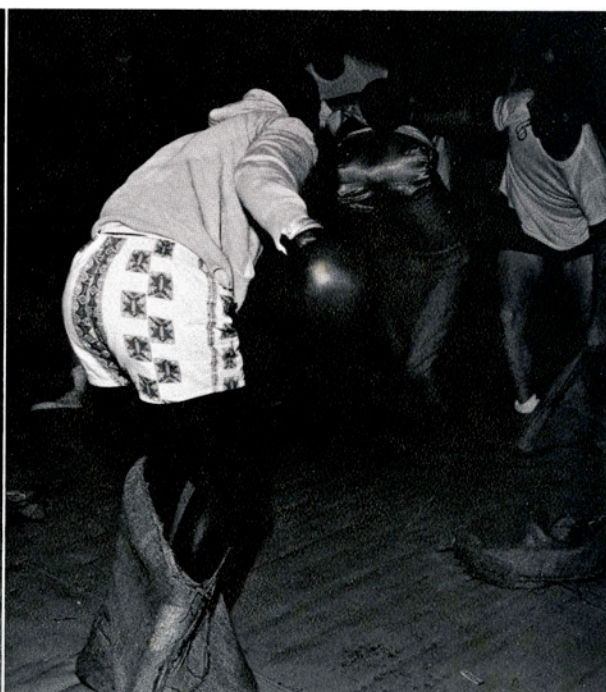
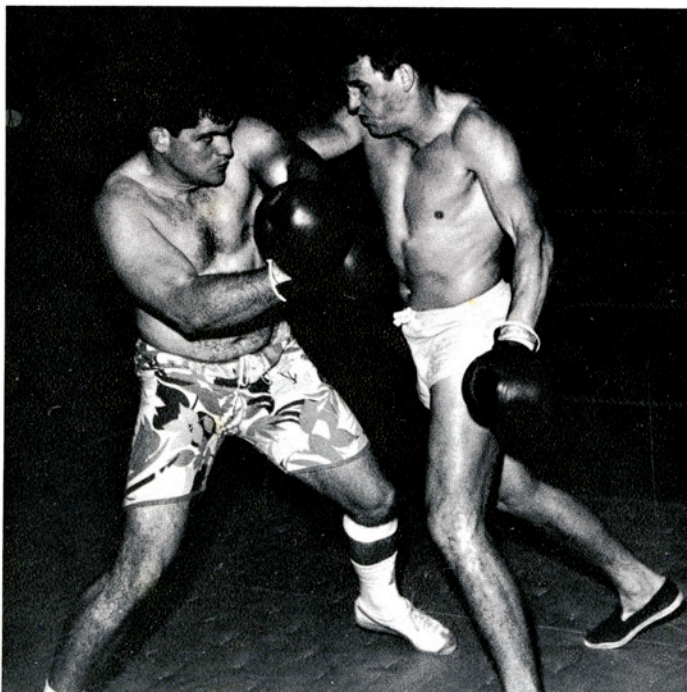
