MONTHS



September

Forty-seven students were selected on September 26 to fill the positions of class officers and Student Congress representatives-at-large. The Political Equality Party filled most of the governmental seats, over-riding the Independent Student Party and nonpartisan cadidates.

The A&I Artist Course Committee sponsored a one night appearance of the Houston Ballet on September 12 in Jones Auditorium. The Ballet performed "New York" by Lee Anoned, "Through a Glass Lightly," "Pas DeDeux" and "Paguita."

An Associated Press Wire Service machine was installed in the South Texan office the first week of the fall semester. The machine was secured in fulfillment of Karen Brysch's campaign promise of wire service stories for the student newspaper.

The University was switched to a Centrex telephone system prior to the beginning of the fall semester. Centrex permits all campus calls, local and long distance, without operator assistance.

A&I Kingsville's registration dropped 11% over last fall. Only 6,896 students enrolled for the fall of 1973 as opposed to 7,682 for the fall of 1972. The decrease in enrollment seems to be a national trend that is sweeping the country's universities.


President Gerald Robins was inaugurated in early September. Robins is the presidential successor to Dr. James C. Jernigan who is now chancellor of the Texas A&I System.

September was sprinkled with a lot of heavy rainfall and hurricane warnings.

Nationally: Billie Jean King defeated professional hustler Bobby Riggs at the \$100,000 winner-take-all tennis tournament in the Houston Astrodome. Watergate Senate Hearings were resumed; the Skylab two crew of Alan L. Bean, Jack R. Lousa, and Dr. Owen K. Garriott returned to earth after 59½ days in space; and Vice President Agnew underwent investigation for allegedly taking kickback from builders and consultants in Baltimore and for tax evasion prior to his vice presidency.

October


Parents of A&I students crowded the campus Saturday, October 6 for Dad's Day. The day's events, as in former years, included a rodeo in the Kleberg Park Arena, a barbeque at Mesquite Grove, a horticulture display and sale in the Agriculture Building and open house by all campus buildings. Tours were taken of the campus, King Ranch, and John E. Conner Museum. During halftime of the A&I-East Texas State football game an award was presented to Rafael Billogas who traveled 2,000 miles from Travis Air Force Base, California to visit his son Rafael. Also during halftime, 74-year-old Jose C. Rodriguez of Kingsville was honored as the oldest father present. His daughter Mary Jane and son Victor Ramon attend A&I.

ROTC sponsored a rifle-shooting contest on the .22 range during their open house. Winning with a perfect score of 50 was H. H. Tripp of San Antonio, father of Cadet Steven Tripp. Best shot among the mothers was a 49 by Mrs. Ana Maria Rodriquez of Brownsville. She has two sons in the corps, Ronald and Francisco.

The fourth annual Derby Day was also held Oct. 6 in conjunction with Dad's Day and was sponsored by Sigma Chi. Various events at Mesquite Grove included a Balloon Burst and Sawhorse Over a Mud Hole. A Derby Day Queen was crowned at the dance at Henrietta Memorial Center.

Thirteen area schools participated in A&I's 13th annual Band Day on October 20. Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma arranged the event to include an afternoon parade through Kingsville and a halftime performance at the A&I-San Angelo State football game. Dr. Gerald Robins, president of the University, was Grand Marshall of the parade and presented trophies to the best playing, marching, and all around band during the football game intermission. "A Salute to Texas" was the theme for the 1,000 musicians.



A good cross-section of students turned out to meet their new president and the three vice-presidents.

Eva Rodriguez, a Kingsville senior, was crowned Homecoming Queen at halftime of the A&I-Howard Payne football game. Miss Rodriguez, an English-French major, has been president of Alpha Lambda Delta and Tau Beta Sigma. She was sponsored by the A&I band.

First runner-up for Homecoming Queen was Dana Vittitee from Falfurrias. She was sponsored by Zeta Tau Alpha sorority.

Other Homecoming events included the election of Gilbert E. "Gil" Steinke, A&I football coach and athletic director, to receive the Distinguished Alumnus Award. Dr. Donald Patrick, Austin neurosurgeon, assumed the presidency of the Alumnus Association Board of Directors.

Head-cheerleader, Marvin Douglas, resigned his position in early November. He explained that he did not have enough time to participate as he should. Pam Brewer succeeded Douglas as head cheerleader. Miss Brewer had received the second highest number of votes during Spring '73 elections.

John E. Conner celebrated his 90th birthday in the museum named for him. The board and officers of the Kingsville Historical Society presented a colored portrait of Conner and a plaque to the museum at a reception honoring Conner.

Classes were dismissed Nov. 20-25 in observance of the Thanksgiving holidays.

Nationally: The outbreak of war in the Middle East between the Arab countries and Israel, and the U.S. support of Israel, caused the Arab nations to withhold oil supplies to the U.S. As a result the U.S. faced its first real fuel shortage and general energy crisis.

December




An outdoor lunchtime Christmas concert for all Texas A&I University students, faculty, administrators and employees, was presented by the music department.


January







The mall fountain underwent several personality changes in February. It was purple once and then it was bubbly.





Each year the club elects the Aggie of the Year on the basis of scholastic achievement and club participation.





Discussion topics at meetings included pollution, abortion, occult, drugs, family, war and peace, and testimony.


An Egg Beg, selling eggs house to house, was used to raise money to help support Summer Missions.


Footlights Club





Rodeo Club


Among the rodeos attended by the Rodeo Club are the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association and Dad's Day Rodeo.

This year in the Dad's Day Rodeo Tex Terry placed second in bareback bronc. Bob Barter placed third in the tie down roping and third in the ribbon roping.


The club also held an annual Jack Pot Rodeo and various social functions. All proceeds from rodeos were donated to the Simmy Wright Memorial Fund.


The Texas A&I Speleological Society held its first annual Ear Bust and Body Broil this year, and a tremendous tortilla bake-in.



A&I Ends Season With 49-10 Win Over SWT

The 1974 football season is something the fans and players probably want to forget. It started off with a loss to Jacksonville State of Alabama, and things just seemed to go downhill from there.

The Javelinas ended the season with a 2-8 mark, the worst in A&I's history, and that dates all the way back to 1925. But things aren't that bad, because the 1946 team posted a 2-7 record, and then came right back the next year with a surprising 7-1-1 record.

The two games A&I won proved to be big upsets. The Hogs first win of the season came in the third game against Stephen F. Austin. Surprising enough, Stephen F. Austin went on to win a post season bowl game and placed third in the Lone Star Conference. The other win came in the closing game of the season against Southwest Texas, another heavy favorite. But the Hogs proved everyone wrong and came out with a 49-10 victory.

The problem of not having a number one quarterback had plenty to do with the inconsistency of the A&I offense. Three men were used throughout the season. Mike Wendel had some good games, but often fell into a slump. Mike Morrison came out of his safety position but had problems

moving the ball. Then Coach Steinke looked to freshman Richard Ritchie, but his inexperience began to show.

Wendel and David Hill were the only men from A&I to be named on the All-Conference team. Wendel made it on the first team as a punter, and Hill was the second team tight end. Although A&I only placed two men on the All-Conference team, one member of the A&I squad was selected as an All-American. Don Hardman took that position at a linebacker spot.

In individual statistics, Ruford Huff was the leading ground gainer as he ran for 820 yards on 148 carries for an average of 5.4 yards a carry. David Hill was the leading receiver as he caught 44 passes for 601 yards and five touchdowns. Wendel was the leading passer for A&I hitting 60 out of 118 attempts for 715 yards and five touchdowns. The scoring title was taken by Clarence Alberts with 80 points.

For the second year in a row the LSC produced the NAIA national champion. Abilene Christian, a newcomer to the league, followed the footsteps of East Texas and was crowned the 1973 national champion.

A&I vs Jacksonville St.

The 1973 football season started off with a bang, but the only problem is the gun was shot against the

Javelinas.

The mighty Hogs traveled to Jacksonville, Alabama to take on the Gamecocks, and the score ended in a disappointing 34-14 loss. The only offensive threat A&I could come up with, was running back Clarence Alberts. Alberts had A&I's only touchdowns, as he scored from 7 and 53-yards out. He ended the night as the leading A&I ball carrier with 79 yards.

On defense, the big men were Ray Evans, who had 10 unassisted tackles, and Jerry Janik who had the

game's only interception.

A&I vs Abilene Christian

In the second game of the season, the Javelinas traveled to Abilene to take on the newest member of the LSC. Not only was Abilene Christian the most recent addition to the conference, they also had the top offensive team in the NAIA. The score was a good indication as the Wildcats came out on top 35-14.

The Wildcats held up their reputation as they gained over 430 total yards. The A&I offense was again slow getting started as the Hogs made only

123 total yards.


The A&I offense had good opportunities to score, but the Abilene defense proved to be just as tough as the offense as they stopped A&I cold several times. A&I could only muster up a four-yard touchdown run by Alberts, and another four-yarder by Reginald Jones.

A&I vs Stephen F. Austin
The Javelinas finally crawled out of their rut as
they beat a good Stephen F. Austin team 31-14 in the
first home appearance for the Hogs.

Mike Wendel got the starting quarterback job for the game, and proved indeed he was a leader. He led the A&I offense, which had been inconsistent in the first two games, to over 460 total yards and their big-

gest point output of the young season.

The game even had a pair of reserves team up to put on an exciting last half scoring drive. Freshman quarterback Richard Ritchie took over for Mike Wendel in the fourth quarter and guided the offense to the final score of the game which was capped by a 47-yard touchdown run by Joe Herzik.












East Texas State, the defending NAIA national champion, was the fourth opponent of the Hogs and the A&I squad was hoping for their second upset of the season, but it didn't turn out that way as the Lions came out on top by a score of 28-7.

Miscues were again the main factor as the Hoggie offense had trouble hanging onto the ball and the Lions used the turnovers as an effective weapon to build up the score.

A&I's greatest hopes came with just over nine minutes left in the game when A&I looked to have their second touchdown of the game, but a fumble on the two-yard line killed the threat, and instead of the score being 21-14, it stood at 21-4. When the Lions took possession, they drove 98-yards for the final touchdown with only 3:08 remaining in the game.

A&I's only score came on their first possession of the second half. The drive covered 70-yards with Reginald Jones scoring from six-yards out.

A&I vs Sul Ross

The Javelinas ran into trouble for the fourth time this season as they were defeated by Sul Ross State 10-7 in Alpine.

The deciding points came on a 46-yard field goal by Arch Nixon with 9:32 left in the game. Up til that point, it had been a sluggish battle between both teams.

Only twice did the A&I offense show any real form. The first came in the final seconds of the first half when freshman quarterback Richard Ritchie completed two consective passes to account for all the yardage on a 48-yard drive that netted A&I's only touchdown. The other came on the opening offensive series of the second half when the Javelinas exploded in three plays to the Sul Ross 12, only to lose the ball on a fumble.

Ruford Huff was the leading A&I ball carrier as he ran for 71-yards on 12 carries. Clarence Alberts had 69-yards on 18 carries before injuring an ankle that sidelined him for the entire fourth quarter.

A&I vs Angelo State

The jinx on the Javelina football team continued in the second half of the season as the Hogs dropped a wild one in Javelina Stadium to Angelo State 45-28.

Freshman quarterback Lynn Leonard riddled the A&I defense as he led his team to five consecutive touchdowns in the first half.

A&I rallied in the second half behind Mike Morrison and Gerald Hill. But the rally fell short and A&I

turned in their fifth loss of the season.

Morrison, who had his first starting assignment of the season, hit 10 of 25 passes for 148 yards and ran for another 62 yards. David Hill caught seven passes for 120 yards and Leonard had 14 completions for 239 yards and two touchdowns.

A&I vs Tarleton

When it looked like A&I was going to get a win under their belt, their own bomb exploded in their face and the previously winless Tarleton State Texans outscored the Javelinas 34-33 on the Texans home field.

Both teams combined for 723 yards in total offense. Tarleton had 386 and A&I had 337 with 142 of that coming on the ground. The Javelinas had their first 100-yard rusher for the season as Ruford Huff picked up 158 in 15 carries. A big hunk of Huff's yardage came on a 61-yard gallop in the first quarter that produced A&I's first touchdown.


A&I vs Sam Houston

Another heartbreaker hit the Javelinas as they fell 15-14 to Sam Houston as the Bearkats were successful on a two point conversion in the fourth quarter.

It was the fifth straight defeat for the Javelinas, being the first time in Coach Steinke's 20-year tenure as head coach that A&I has lost more than four straight games.

The quarterback duties were shared by Richard Ritchie and Wendel, but Wendel had the edge in yards as he hit 13 of 19 passes for 104 yards and two touchdowns. Gerald Hill caught nine passes for 83 yards.

A&I had the edge in both first downs and total yards. The Bearkats managed 14 first downs to A&I's 15 and the Javelinas had 274 total yards to Sam Houston's 238.




Quarterback Mike Morrison sets up behind the blocking of Richard Chapman.




Clarence Alberts is dropped for a small gain as Jim Gandy looks for a defender.



A&I vs Howard Payne

For the second year in a row, A&I lost their homecoming game as the Howard Payne Yellowjackets invaded Javelina territory and came out with a 28-0 victory.

The first half was all Howard Payne, as they scored all their 28 points during that span. But A&I came out in the second half ready to fight, and fight they did. Not once did the Yellowjackets get into Javelina territory as the defense played superb. Although the defense kept up their end of the deal, the offense had trouble getting the ball into the endzone. There were many opportunities, but fumbles and interceptions kept killing the drives.

A&I led in total yards 306 to 291 as fullback Ruford Huff had 88 yards rushing, just four-yards less than the whole Yellowjacket squad.

Other leaders on offense were Ritchie who completed nine of 17 passes for 105 yards and Hill caught seven for 93 yards.

A&I vs Southwest Texas

When it looked as though the 1973 season was going to be a total disaster, the Hoggies pulled out the season's closing game in a big upset over Southwest Texas State 49-10.


Mike Wendel ended his career at A&I as he had a fantastic game. He came off the bench in the second quarter and sparked A&I to two touchdowns. He finished the night hitting eight of 10 passes for 123 yards and two touchdowns. In addition to his fine passing, he also had a punt that traveled 49 yards. David Hill was again the prime target as he caught six passes for 73 yards and one score.

Two other men had good nights as both got their name in the A&I record books. Clarence Alberts and Ruford Huff both surpassed the 2,000 yard rushing mark in their career.

A&I had 446 total yards as to SWT's 166. A&I also led in first downs 21 to 8 and closed out the season at 2-8 compared to SWT's 4-6.

Hog Set Record With Eight Straight Victories

The 1974 basketball team was truly one of the classic teams in A&I's history. When things were going good, there was not a single team in the Lone Star Conference that could come anywhere near the Hogs. But when things weren't going so good, the cellar team could walk away with a 20 point victory.

The season started off in a fair fashion, but seemed to get worse until the Christmas break. A&I lost three straight LSC games by a total of three points. That is enough to almost break a team, but A&I came back to beat Angelo State and Sul Ross. Then things got bad again as Howard Payne, Stephen F. Austin, Abilene Christian and SWT all walked away with victories over the Hogs.

At this point, the team struck lightening and won eight straight games which set a new school record. Much of the credit has to go to the magician, Hoegie Simmons as he went on a scoring spree and the Hogs knocked everyone off the court, including a 114-88 win over Paul Quinn College. A&I played well in games against the leading teams in the LSC. Some of the key wins included a 10 point victory over Sam Houston, an 11 point win over East Texas, and a three point win against Howard Payne. In two of these key games, Simmons went over the 50 point barrier as he set a new school record by scoring 52 points against East Texas and made 51 against Howard Payne.

But the winning streak was stopped by SWT as the Bob-

cats took a 87-75 victory in San Marcos. A&I played even ball until the last five minutes of the game. At that point, SWT pulled away to stay.

A&I finished the season with a 14-13 record making the second year in a row Coach McDonald's team has gone over the 500 mark.

Hoegie Simmons, the All-American guard from Tucson, Arizona, led the league in scoring for the second year in a row with 29.3 average. He also scored well over 750 points to break the record for most points in a single season. He set the old record of 624 last season. He also made LSC player of the week twice on a NAIA national player of the week once.


Although Simmons did most of the scoring, he got plenty of help from Jeff St. Clair who carried a 16.0 average and finished among the leaders in the conference in rebounds. Steve Weems came into his own this year as he averaged over 10 points a game and was second leading rebounder on the team.

Coach McDonald should have an array of talent next year as he carried a total of eight freshmen on the team. Many of them saw action as Danny Kaspar, Rick Calhoun, and George Shivers showed the most potential as future stars.




Steve Weems jumps high in the opening game tip-off.



















Spring Relay Runs 40.9 In Austin Meet

The Track team improved greatly as the season progressed when Coach Kelly came back after a short retirement to inspire the runners to some important victories.

The biggest improvement was the relays. The 440-yard relay ran an impressive 40.88 at the Austin Invitational meet but were given second place after a photo finish. In the San Angelo meet, the sprint relay stepped off a fancy 41.1 to win the first race of the finals. Members of the 440-yard relay were Mike McMillion, Garland Nelson, Lewis Edmonson, and George Franklin.

The 40.88 was the best for an A&I sprint relay since 1970 when Ernest Haynes an company ran a 40.5 to win the LSC.

The mile relay improved as they ran a time of 3.17:3 in the Corpus Christi Invitational Meet.

Eldon Tuttle seemed to be off his usual record setting pace, but still managed to bring home plenty of medals. In the Border Olympics, Tuttle won his third straight gold medal with a heave of 203-6. He was far off his record throw of over 230 feet.

An important addition to this years squad was freshman George Franklin. Franklin had an excellent 9.4 in the 100-yd. dash, and a 21.5 in the 220-yd. dash. The 9.4 in the 100-yd. dash is the best by an A&I runner since 1969 when Ernest Haynes ran a 9.3 to tie the NAIA outdoor record. Franklin is also the starting receiver for the football team and is unusually fast for his 6-4, 210-pound frame.

Tommy McMillion, one of the veterans on the squad, kept up his good pace by stepping out a 54 flat in the 440-yd. intermediate hurdles.

Other times by A&I runners was a 1:55 by Harold Barnes in the 880; a 49.4 in the 440-yd. dash by Ernest Pruneda; and a 15.3 in the high hurdles by Elmer Blaylock.











ACADEMICS



Dr. Gerald Robins Is Seventh President Of A&I University



"The president of a university must be able to deal with immediate problems of all kinds, all the time," explained Dr. Gerald Burns Robins. "My style for dealing with problems is a balance between personal involvement and decentralization."

Dr. Robins, 49, was chosen unanimously by the Texas A&I System Board of Directors to become the seventh president of Texas A&I-Kingsville. He assumed the president's duties on Sept. 1, 1973.

Dr. Robins graduated from the University of Arkansas in 1948 with a B.S. in education. He earned his M.S. degree from the University of Arkansas in 1950 and his Ed.D. degree from the University of Georgia in 1954. He has done postdoctoral work at Harvard University and University of Michigan.

From 1957 to 1970 Dr. Robins was president of Augusta College. During that time Augusta College was converted from a junior college to a senior college. Augusta College is about half the size of A&I. There is no College of Agriculture or Engineering, but there is a medical center with which the college is closely associated. "Like A&I, Augusta College is part of a college system," noted Dr. Robins.

During the last three years, Dr. Robins has served as a full professor of education at the University of Georgia. He studied educational systems in Switzerland, the Soviet Union, Lebanon, Thailand, Hong Kong, and Japan in 1970.

"The three years between presidencies gave me the time I needed to read about, study and consider possibilities for university developments," said Dr. Robins.

He also had an opportunity to start a manuscript with the tentative title *Academic Blacksmithing*. The book is a study in "beating swords into ploughshares," the development of an Augusta arsenal into a 72 acre college. Dr. Robins is also the author of several other publications.

During his professional career, Dr. Robins has served as president of the Department of Higher Education of the Georgia Education Assoc.; chairman of the Education Committee of the Georgia-South Carolina Nuclear Council; and president of the Georgia Junior College Association.

Dr. Robins is married to the former Fay Ann Dennen. The couple have two sons, Gerald, 23; and James, 21.

Dr. Robins feels that A&I's international atmosphere will serve as a great asset in the University's development and expansion over the years. He also feels that the university's "objectives and goals and my philosophy and ambitions are in close accord."



Vice presidents schedule classes, oversee student financial affairs

Mr. Edward Pennington, as Vice President of Fiscal Affairs is responsible for the management of all fiscal affairs of the University, which encompasses the functions of purchasing, accounting, payroll, and property control. Pennington is also responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of buildings, grounds, and utilities on campus; the University Bookstore; the financial management of the athletic program, and management of the Physical Education Center.

Dr. W. Floyd Elliot is the *Vice President for Student Affairs*. He oversees all student developments on campus. Some of the many offices under him are student aid, student health center, student union, and veteran's affairs. Elliott is also executive advisor of student publications, campus security, and student organizations.

Dr. Mario A. Benetiz has been Executive Vice President and Dean of the University since the fall of 1971. Dr. Benetiz is the chief academic officer and handles all academic affairs. The curriculum and scheduling of classes are under his jurisdiction. Benetiz also represents the president of the University at meetings and functions which the president cannot attend himself.











Chancellor Jernigan, assistants serve A&I System



Mr. Joe Bishop serves the Texas A&I System as *Vice Chancellor for University Relations.* Bishop is responsible for the external support of the system. He raises monies needed for the support of the system and its components. Bishop handles federal and state legislative relations and works with the alumni in gaining support for the system. He also oversees communication relations for the A&I System.

Manuel Salinas is Assistant to the Chancellor. His primary function is to give the Administration the support needed or required by the Chancellor. It is his responsibility to assure coordination of all systemwide reports and to supervise the record-keeping the system uses. Salinas prepares, coordinates, and disseminates systemwide information to the campuses. He represents the Chancellor's office at meetings and functions when the Chancellor cannot attend.

As Vice Chancellor of Fiscal Affairs, Mr. William English coordinates all fiscal activity for all components of the A&I System. He coordinates the budget preparation and coordinates a fringe benefit program. English oversees all major construction and major repairs on the campuses. He periodically visits and attends meetings with the vice presidents of fiscal affairs from all the campuses.

This year was the first time for Dr. James C. Jernigan to serve as *Chancellor of the Texas A&I University System* without the added office of President of A&I at Kingsville. Jernigan oversees the A&I campuses in Corpus Christi, Kingsville, and Laredo, and the Weslaco Citrus Center. His offices were moved from College Hall to Seale Hall on the Kingsville campus.

Dr. Stanley Anderson has been Dean of the School of Agriculture since 1967. Last year the College received a grant of \$147,400 to begin a long range project to study "Efficient Beef Production Through Forage Regimes." These funds will be continued at \$50,000 for each of two years. With its allocated funds the School plans to increase beef production through utilization of improved forage crops. This beef increase will benefit South Texas, the United States and nations of the world. Since 1967 the School has turned from a teaching institute to a practical agricultural College with emphasis on graduate research. Recent program additions have been Range Science, Agricultural Economics, and Meat Science.




One of the more recent developments in the College of Arts and Sciences, according to Dr. S. Boyd Stewart, Dean of the College since 1961, is the addition of an Ethnic Studies program which is rapidly gaining popularity with students. Courses in philosophy and a radio station have also been fairly recent additions to the College. Closed circuit television has been added to the speech department to aid in teaching debating and production courses. The College of Arts and Sciences is currently composed of 15 departments.


Dr. John W. Glock has been Dean of the School of Teacher Education for 15 years. In the past few years three important programs have been added to the School: a kindergarten program and a specialization program for bilingual students. Dr. Glock is especially proud of the School's new building and last year's National Accreditation. He is also happy to announce that a large percentage of first year teachers from A&I rate above average or superior to other first year teachers from other colleges according to a recent survey of school superintendents and principals by the A&I Placement Office.











In the 10 years Dr. John C. Rayburn has been *Dean of the School of Graduate Studies*, 22 of 24 masters degrees have been added to A&I as majors. Texas A&I is currently the only university south of San Antonio offering a masters in Business Administration. This past year a sociology major was added.

Dr. Ernest A. Franke has been *Dean of the School of Engineering* since the fall of 1971. Major accomplishments of the past two years include a reduction in the number of hours required for a B.S. degree, from 145 to 135. Two new degrees were added to the School in the form of Civil Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. In 1971 a wing was added on to the Engineering building and last year the School expanded its research program with the aid of \$65,000 in grants and contracts.

Dr. Dennis B. Ford, *Dean of the School of Business Administration* for 10 years, is particularly pleased with the development of several internship programs. These programs allow students to receive onthe-job training for salary or credit. The consortium program is coordinated with Texas A&M, with Texas A&I and Texas Tech as participants.



College Of Agriculture

The College of Agriculture, with a strengthened graduate degree program, is moving into a new area of development with a planned 10 year, \$1.5 million Farm Facilities Research Center.

Also under operation was a water well and irrigation equipment to be used for crop and pasture testing under both dry land and irrigated land production.

During 1972-73 more than \$147,400 was funded through the legislature to enable the College to develope a water system, secure irrigation equipment, and obtain the necessary feed, seed and fertilizer for research.

Another \$85,000 was obtained from legislature and private sources for sheep and swine facilities and research in grass evaluation and range evaluation.

Since 1935 A&I has offered vocational agriculture training through the Agriculture Training Education Department.


In cooperation with the Texas Education Agency, the department prepared students to teach vocational agriculture and to earn a state teacher certification. Graduates of the department fill positions throughout Texas and several other states.

College Of Arts And Sciences

Art

An addition to the Art Building was completed this fall. It houses introductory and painting classes. Forty easels were acquired for use in the new painting room. A sculpture yard was also built this year.

Art work by Ralph Magruder, William Renfrow and Jon Thompson was accepted in National Art Exhibitions.

Biology

The Biology department was developing three areas this year; a health-related science laboratory, an organized area and facilities to house vertebrate and invertebrate collections, and the incorporation of a modern laboratory to support the Biological Station on Baffin Bay.

A summer workshop designed to provide experience in the biological sciences for elementary and secondary school teachers will be offered this summer.

Chemistry

The chemistry department hosted a Seminar on Freshman Chemistry and Laboratory Safety for chemistry teachers in South Texas during the fall semester.

The department purchased a Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Spectrometer for \$11,010. The purpose of the machine is for teaching and research.

English

For the first time in several years all English classes were held in Fore Hall. In previous years classes had been held in various buildings on campus.

Each semester the English department has a booksale on the mall. The money from these sales finances three scholarships for the department.

Dr. Claris Glick joined the staff this year and Dr. Clyde Cerant retired after 16 years with the department.



Geography-Geology

Field trips highlighted the events of the Geography-Geology department. Trips were made to the Big Bend National Park, Ozarks, Rocky Mountains, Stephenville, and the Arbuckle Mountains and Ouachitas Mountains.

Dr. Raymond Suhm received an A&I Research Grant for field study of Ordovician rocks exposed in Van Horn, Texas region. Dr. James Norwine also received a grant to study climates of South Texas.




Health And Physical Education


The Department of Health and Physical Education has suggested an outdoor activity area for students, but the project has not been approved yet.


Women's athletics is developing rapidly. The department held its first dance festival last year.

History

Methods in Historical Research was added to the History department curriculum this year.

Dr. Ward Albro was promoted to full professorship and Dr. Harry Huebel was promoted to associate professor.

Paul Soifer returned to the staff this year after a leave of absence.

Home Economics

Nutrition students with Dr. Marilyn Samply of the Home Economics department are experimentally researching the eating habits of teenagers and pre-school children.

In the spring the faculty, professional home economists, and students attended the Texas Home Economics Association in San Antonio.

Upper students formed a dietetic group this year. The group hears several speakers each semester.

The department purchased a \$1200 dining room suite, slides for nutrition and disease classes, sewing machines, and other equipment.

Freshman Mary Lozano proved an outstanding Home Economics student this year, winning three scholarships.

Industrial Arts

The A&I Department of Industrial Arts is the best equipped IA department in Texas, according to Dr. A. F. Gross, chairman of the department. Among its latest equipment is an engraving machine for metals and plastics classes, a sandblasting machine, a mitering machine, and an olympus camera for special production of color slides.

The department is experimentally developing color slides for educational purposes. It is also working on the production of overhead projectuals. This would throw diagrams on the wall above the teacher.

Journalism

The Journalism Department hosted a UIL Journalism Student Activities Conference on the A&I campus in the fall. Tours were made of the newspaper offices and radio and televisions.

In approximately one year, the department expects to be moved into part of Manning Hall especially remodeled to meet its needs. Its present building is a remodeled WWII barrack-type structure on Engineering Avenue.

Library Science

Most of the 50 students enrolled in the Library Science department are working toward a provisional school librarian certification.

A&I's Library Science department offers seven undergraduate courses including Reference Materials, School Library Organization and Management, and Literature of Adolescents.

A new course on selecting, cataloging, and storing nonbook media is being developed. Also being considered is an extension course program.

The School Librarian Program is under the direction of the Dean of Teacher Education.


Mathematics

The Mathematics department occupied the third floor of the New Classroom Building this year, ending the time when math offices and classrooms were distributed throughout five campus buildings.

The department added a new course to its curriculum this year; Mathematics for Elementary Teachers.

The math department offers 100 sections and also maintains an active tutoring program.

Mathematics for Business and Economics II was added to the department's standardized testing program.

In the Modern Language department an experimental program was tried in the second level French classes. The program was a move toward individualized and independent work. Each student selects an area of interest and works on a project with another student or alone. Some projects have been research reports on French authors and a French soap opera.

Dr. R. R. Hinojosa-Smith won the Third Annual Quinto Sol Award for Literature. Eladia Leon-Hill went to Paris for three weeks to investigate the literary work of Nobel Prize win-

ner Miquel Angel Asturias.

Music


The Music department developed two experimental programs this year. The Jazz Workshop program, although begun last year, has made the arranging, composition, and improvisation portion of the program a separate one-hour course.

The addition of a second section of choir, the University Chorus was established to determine the interest of the university in a general student singing group.

The department offers several courses to non-music majors in an effort to serve the university community.

Physics

The Department of Physics ordered three electronic calculators for use in laboratories this year. The department also secured several research items and added equipment to the astronomy lab. Dr. James Tylicki was promoted to associate professor this year. Research grants were given to Dr. Tylicki, Dr. Lionel Hewett, Dr. Paul Elliott and Mr. S. B. Dunn.



Political Science

The Political Science department's major endeavor this year was to consolidate its graduate and undergraduate programs. In the past two years the department has made major revisions in both areas and is now in the implementation stage.

The department once again offered comparative government courses in voting behavior with Mr. Fredrick Matkin's return of absence.

Psychology-Sociology

A new graduate major in sociology was approved this year and offered by the Department of Psychology and Sociology.

The graduate program includes such courses as seminars and studies in contemporary sociological problems, sociological theory, and social organization.

A course offered this year for the first time was Physiological Psychology. This course is an introduction to the physiological substrata of behavior. Among the areas covered are basic physiology and neuro-anatomy and central nervous sytem functions.

Speech-Drama

The Speech and Drama department sent its dramatic production of *La Fiaca* to Monterrey, Mexico this year. The department also sent its production of *Hubba! Hubba!* on a USO/ATA tour of military installations in the Far East.

The drama department presented four productions for A&I including *Imaginary Invalid* and *Arms and Man*.

The speech department attended high school speech tournaments and an oral interpretation workshop. Telelessons were introduced in Speech 101.



College Of Business Administration

The College of Business Administration offers students traditional academic programs as well as innovative approaches to the field of business.

The College's four departments include accounting and electronic data processing, economics and finance, general business, and management and marketing.

Beginning additional programs this year, the College planned short courses and mini-courses in addition to regularly scheduled classes taught on campus.

The College offered a consortium program in real estate this year. The program is coordinated by Texas A&M with Texas Tech and A&I as participants.

The program is a professional approach to real estate education rather than the vocational approach.

The College also offered an undergraduate internship program where students recieved three hours credit for working off-campus. The A&I program is coordinated through the Council of Governments in the Coastal Bend areas.

A graduate internship program was operated with the cooperation of the city of Sinton. The program is a research grant in tax administration made by the Moody Foundation to the Texas Governor's office. The College set up a program with the Governor's office whereby one student worked on a project and received six hours of credit.

College Of Education

"Teacher Education Grads Speak Out: Assessments and Implications" contains the results of a four-year study of 614 university graduates in teacher education by Jon Sanders, A&I education instructor.

Graduates felt that a teacher training course was of extreme value when method rather than content was emphasized.

Courses offering assigned actual teaching experiences in the public schools as part of the course requirements received an extremely valuable rating.

Graduates implied the need of experience for the pre-student teacher to work with pupils in a public school setting.

Dr. David L. Zufelt, associate professor of education, participated in the Third Annual Congress on the Scientific Study of Mental Deficiency at The Hague, The Netherlands and England as well as facilities for educating the handicapped.

Dr. Zufelt is also the co-author of a book designed to help the bilingual student achieve academic and professional success. The title of the book is "Cognates: Vocabulary Enrichment for Bilinguals."


Mrs. Frances G. Gavenda retired from the education faculty this summer. She taught at A&I 10 years and now plans to be a workshop consultant in language arts and reading.


Ten faculty members of the A&I education faculty attended the annual Texas Conference on Teacher Education in Dallas this fall.

Students who are education majors spend many hours in and out of the classroom trying dramatics, Educational TV tape, and actually teaching children. The kindergarten program is a new department in the College of Education. The children are brought from local kindergartens to the A&I kindergarten.









College Of Engineering

A national shortage of engineers has proved to be good news for college engineering students.

According to the Manpower Report of the President, an average of 48,000 engineering graduates will be in demand each year between now and 1980.


The College Placement Council reports that engineering graduates in 1972 received the highest starting salaries of all groups studied, averaging \$890 a month.

Electrical engineers have the most openings. A yearly average of 12,000 positions need to be filled. Openings for mechanical engineers average 10,000; and for civil engineers, 10,000.

December 1973 was the first time for students to graduate from the Department of Civil and Mechanical Engineering. There were 11 civil and four mechanical engineering Bachelor of Science degrees given. A new course was added to the Department of Chemical and Natural Gas Engineering, "Engineering: Its Principles and Problems in a Technological Society" requires no special background in science or mathematics. The course gives the impact of engineering in history and the social responsibility of engineering.

David Gaines and Steve Gehlbach participated in a 10-week summer Undergraduate Research program in electrical engineering. They studied the use of microwave energy to measure the moisture content in soil. The program was initiated by a \$3,890 grant to A&I by the National Science Foundation.

This past summer, senior mechanical engineering major Weldon L. Wallace received a \$500 Scholarship from the American Smelting and Refining Company.

College Of Graduate Studies

Administration of the College of Graduate Studies is under the direction of the Graduate Council, which determines policies and administers them through its Dean. Students seeking the master's degree are governed by the general rules of the catalogue and their work is under the general supervision of the Graduate Council.

In order to qualify for a master's degree, a department must submit a survey listing costs, equipment, library holdings, faculty qualifications, student interest, and reasons for wanting the degree. The survey and qualifications are considered by the curriculum revision committee, the graduate council, the council of deans, the academic vice president, the president, the board of directors, and the coordinating board. The degree request must pass all of these stages before approval is granted.

Currently 26 major master degrees are offered at A&I.

Department Of Military Science

The Department of Military Science offers a military science program to those women and men who wish to qualify for commissions as second lieutenants in the United States Army.


Until recently, A&I was the only university in Texas and only one of 10 in the nation to enroll women in its Army ROTC program.

Qualified senior cadets are eligible for the department's flight program which may qualify them for a private pilot's license.

In addition to the basic program, the department offers students a chance to participate in Band, Color Guard, King's Rifles, Rifle Team, Reserved Officers' Association and the Ranger detachment.

A&I dorm mothers strive to make Dorms "a home away from home."

"One has to be fleet of foot around here!" said Ellen Wade, co-director of the men's side of the New Dorm. "A dorm mother has to be so versatile. We act as a liaison between students and the administration. We try to make the dorm seem like a home away from home," explained Mrs. Wade.

Catherine Gray aids Mrs. Wade with the 370 boys in New Dorm. "I think I know all their tricks," smiled Mrs. Gray. "After all, I grew up with ten brothers!" Mrs. Gray is interested in the boy's education and the development of their talents to help themselves and others in the world.

"Being a dorm mother is a big challenge," said Velma Rushing. "I enjoy working with my men." Poteet Hall is the only all male dorm on campus and houses most athletes. According to Mrs. Rushing, "This is not a dull, routine job. There's something new all the time."

"A dorm mother is like a housewife," said Naoma Caraway, dorm director for Lynch. Her 190 girls constantly seek her advice and opinions. "One has to love young people to maintain this job. We have to be all things to all people."

Jewel Cauley came to Martin Hall before the building was completed in 1966. She has been the dorm mother for the Martin boys every year since then. Mrs. Cauley is a good listener. She likes to get along with everybody and has always enjoyed young people. "They give me a real good outlook on life," she smiles. Her job gives her a feeling of contribution. "Every day is a different experience," says Mrs. Cauley. "With 189 boys, anything and everything can happen."

When Edythe Dailey decided to become a dorm mother, her college daughter warned her, "Don't nose into the girls' business." Mrs. Dailey has respected this advice the five years she's been at Martin Hall. She considers her major duty as a dorm mother is just "being there" when she's needed. She never gossips and strives for harmony with her 145 girls.

The university's youngest dorm mother, Eloise James smiled, "I love being a dorm mother. The rewards are plentiful, but the job can be heartbreaking." She has an open heart for her 141 Lewis girls. They are in and out of her office all day with gifts, exciting stories and tears. They affectionately call her the "Wicked Witch of the West."

"I'm a Virgo and like serving others," said Mae Roper. With 280 girls in the New Dorm to serve, she really loves her work. "Being a dorm mother keeps your ideas young," explained Mrs. Roper. "After all, life is what you make it."

The duties of all dorm mothers are multiple. They oversee maids, porters, resident advisers and senior advisers. They order all the supplies the students need and handle all their complaints from cold rooms to leaky faucets and inoperative telephones. But mostly, they're always available for those who need them.

Campus security chief discusses services, bikes, parking problems

Besides giving traffic tickets and controlling traffic, the campus security protects state property and acts as a service to students, faculty and staff.

Twenty-one officers, including three sergeants, patrol the campus 24 hours a day on three shifts: from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; 4:00 to midnight and from midnight to 8:00 a.m. One officer patrols each dorm from midnight until 8:00 a.m. Officers must have a high school degree or its equivalent. The university sends its officers to police school at Del Mar College in Corpus Christi for certification as peace officers.

Services to students include the loaning of jumper cables and locating students to inform them of burning headlights. To save students the high cost of ambulance service, the campus security will take students to the hospital during emergencies. Chief Harris A. Connor has even bailed students from the city jail who are there on misdemeanor charges.

According to Chief Connor, Texas A&I has been fortunate in its low number of stolen bicycles, traffic accidents and low parking costs. Connor recommends that bike riders invest in a sturdy, heavy-duty bicycle lock with a strong cable, instead of a combination lock, to aid in preventing thefts.


During the 1973 Fall semester A&I had only 15 traffic accidents on the campus streets.

Despite the numerous complaints by students and faculty about parking problems, A&I has one of the most lenient and least expensive parking regulations. The cost of a decal has been \$4.00 for many years and the cost of a parking ticket \$1.00 for the first offense, is one of the lowest in the state.

There are 400 red faculty-staff parking spaces, 131 blue dorm spaces, 759 purple dorm spaces and 68 brown spaces for married students in the university apartments. Cars with yellow decals have 984 spaces on campus and a 3,000-car capacity on the east and west sides of Javelina Stadium. There are five paying parking lots with 605 spaces for all decals — only 5¢ to park all day. This money is used to pay for the cost of the parking lots. Although every student cannot park close to his class, it takes an average of only 10 minutes to walk from one point on campus to another.

Approximately 527 tickets were issued in November and 1,000 were written in October. Of these tickets, 90% were warnings.

"We want the students to understand that we're here for service." explains Chief Connor, "not just to issue tickets."




A&I was one of five universities chosen to make the trip with cooperation of the Department of Defense, United Service Organization (USO) and the American Theater Association.










El Rancho uses more color in 1974 yearbook



The South Texan office moved into the old News Service office in the journalism building. News Service transferred its office to College Hall.


The newspaper sponsor was visiting instructor Jim Ivy who also sponsored the yearbook this year.

KTAI's goal this year was to find music that would appeal to everyone. Staff members mingled with students to see what music they wanted.


The format was changed from the Top One Hundred to progressive music, a heavier, deeper, non-AM sound.


