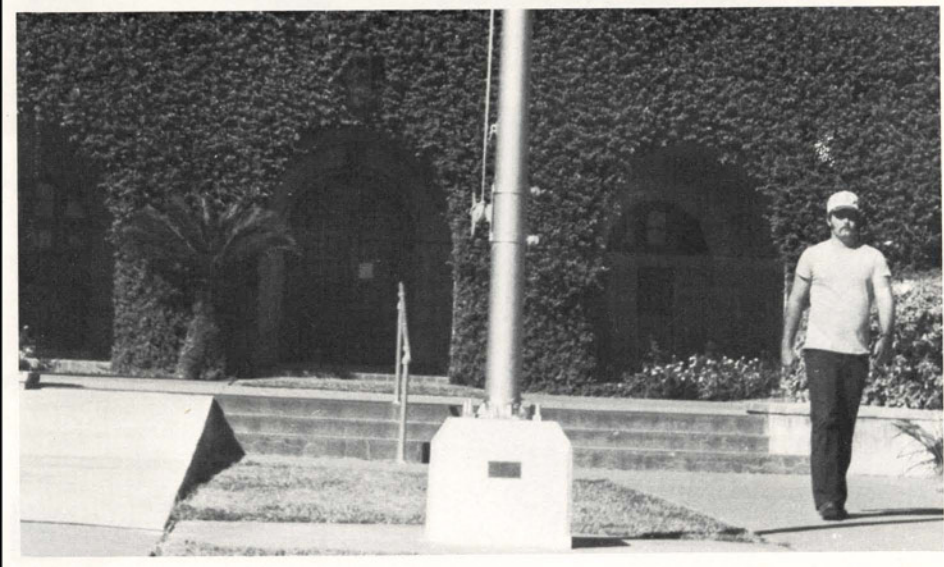
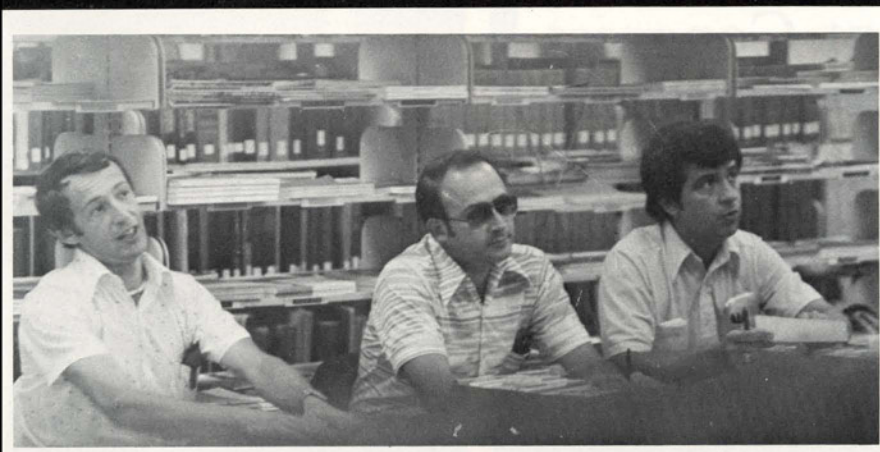




September October

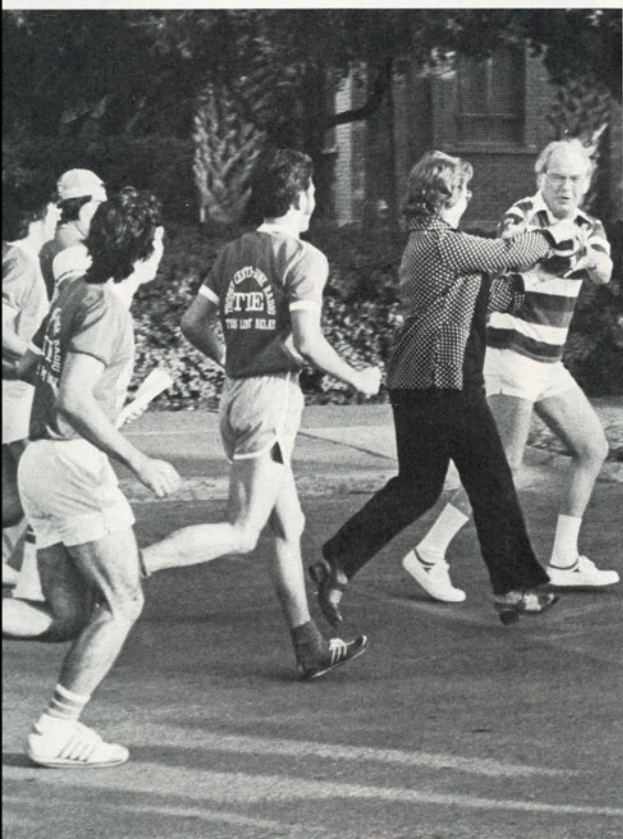
By November, students are pretty well established in their college routine. Football continues along with many other activities. In December, we have the beginning of basketball and we bid farewell to many graduating seniors.

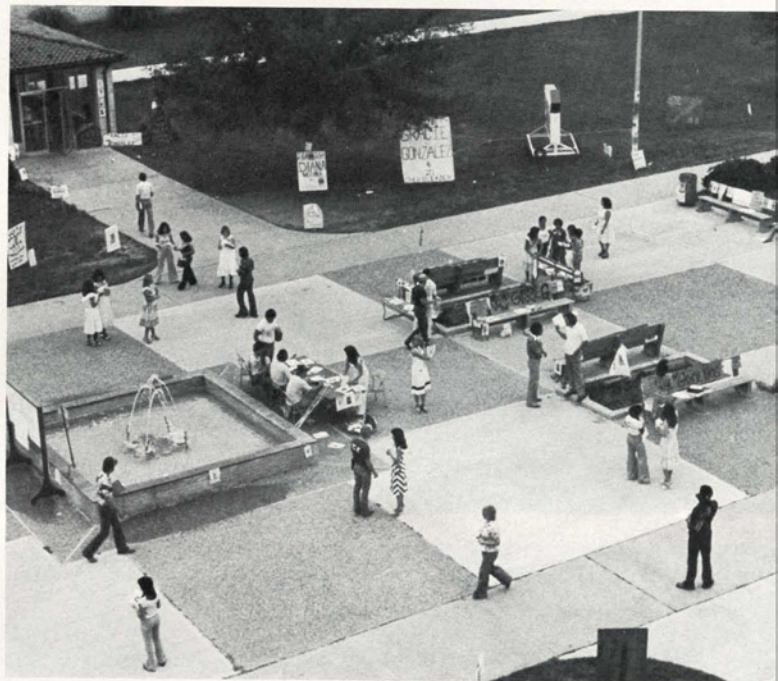






March April

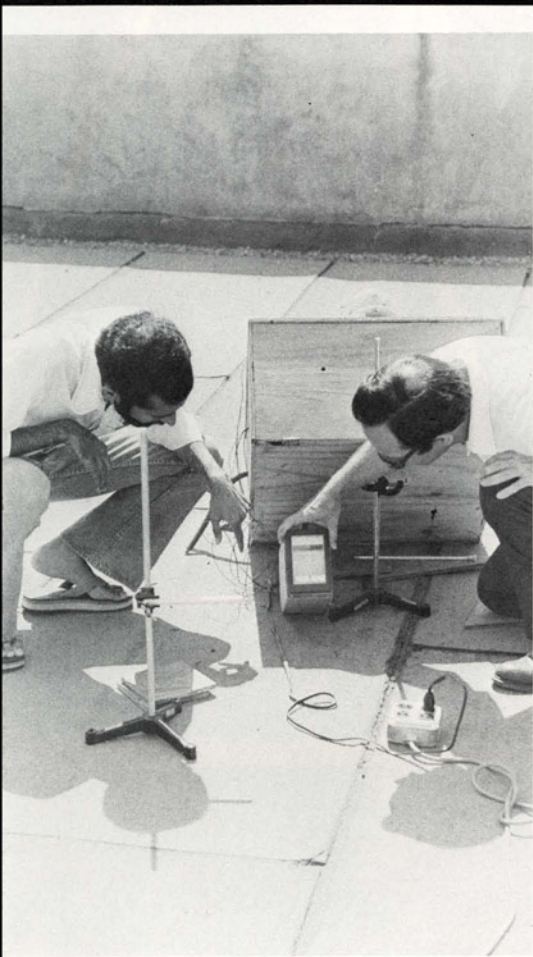




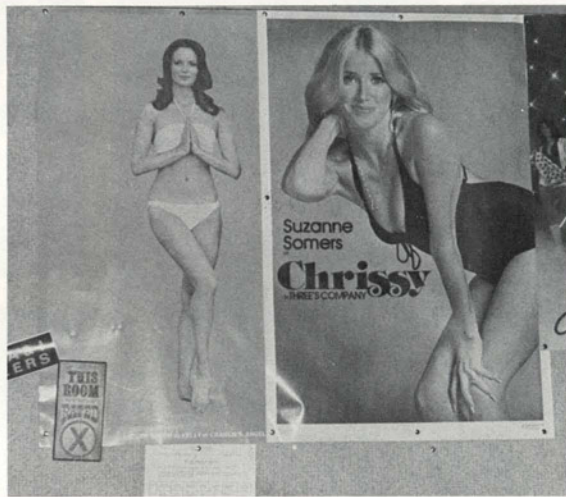


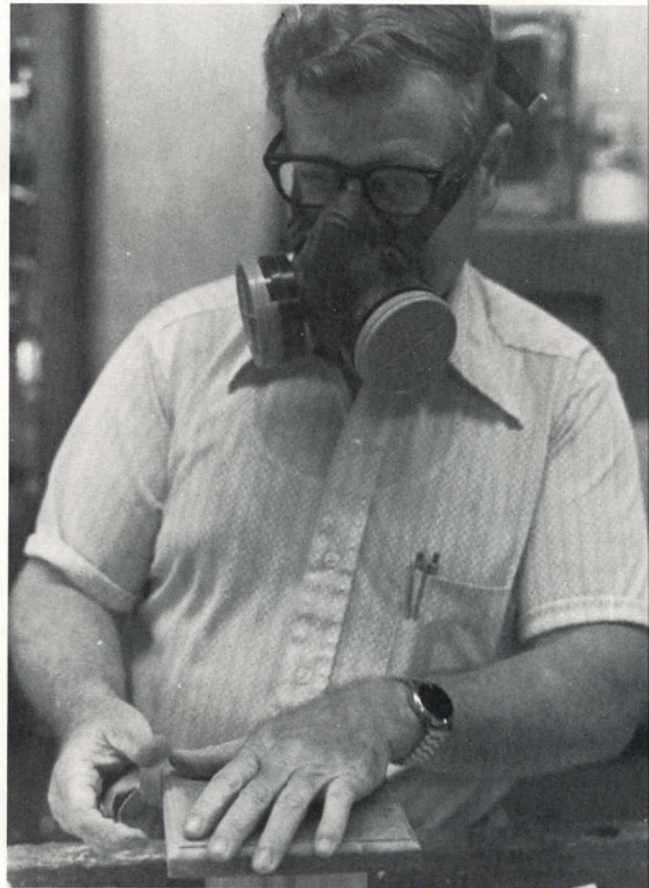
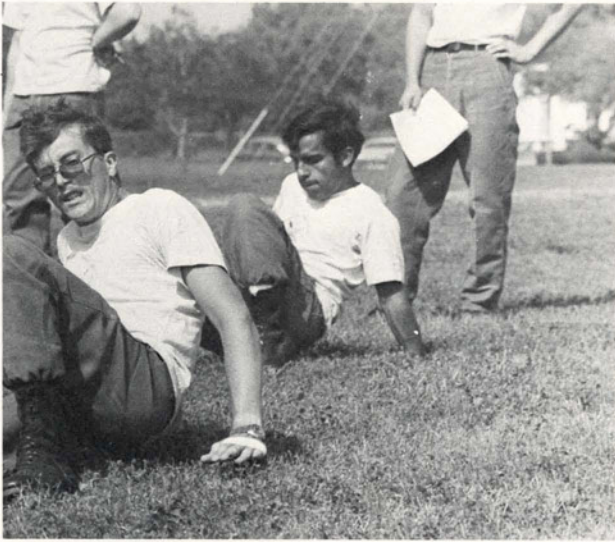
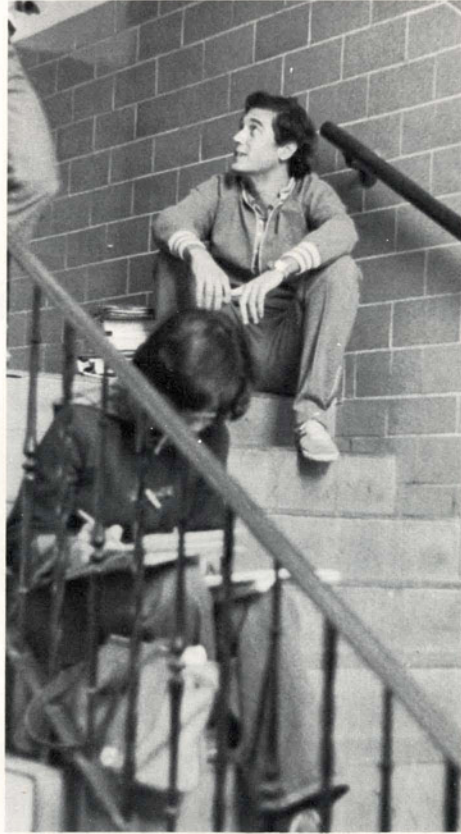
May

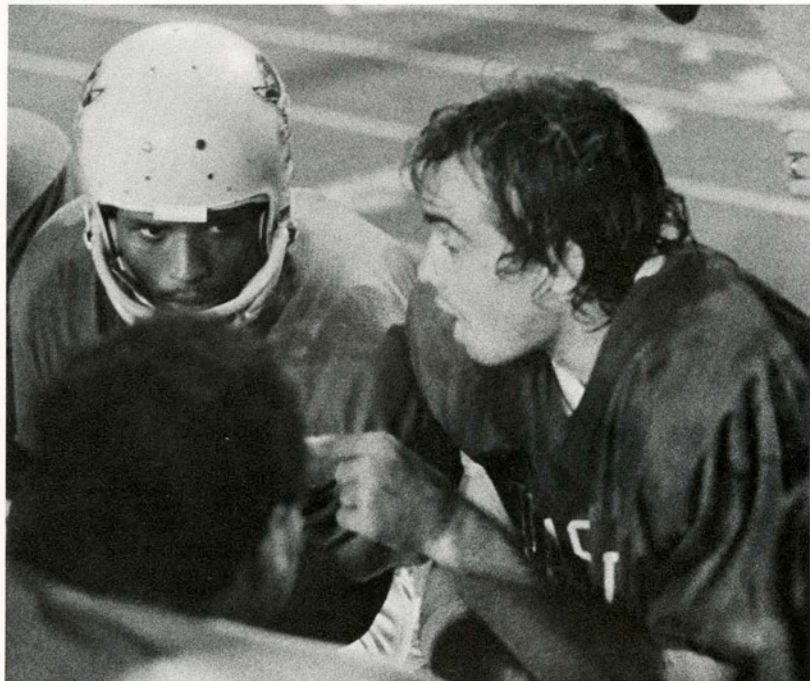


Hogs Skin Tigers 21-13

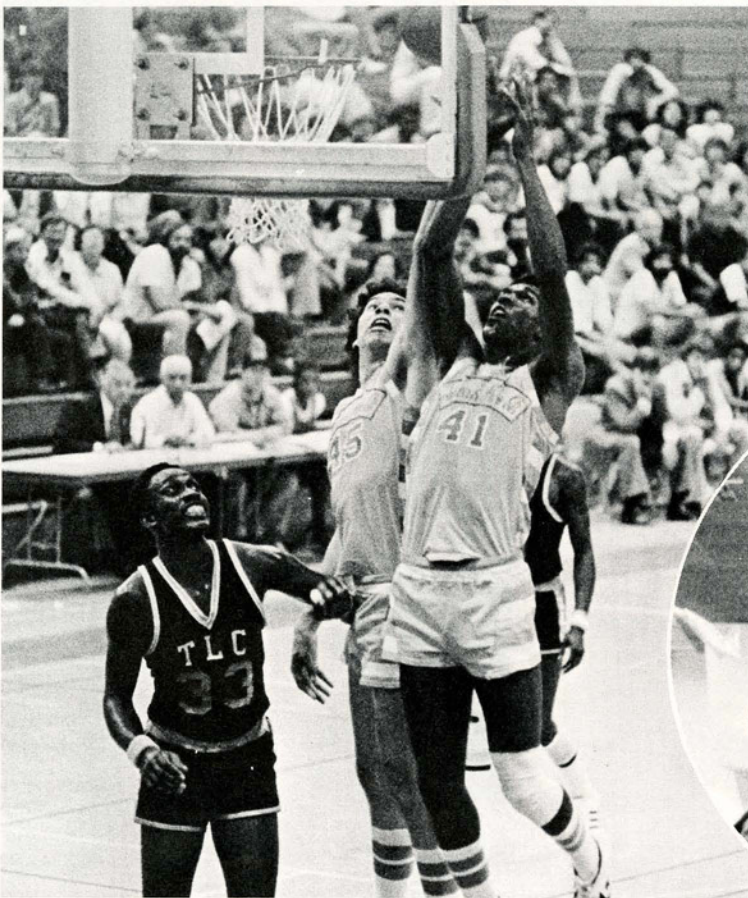


Hoggies Hoopsters Play By Their Theme

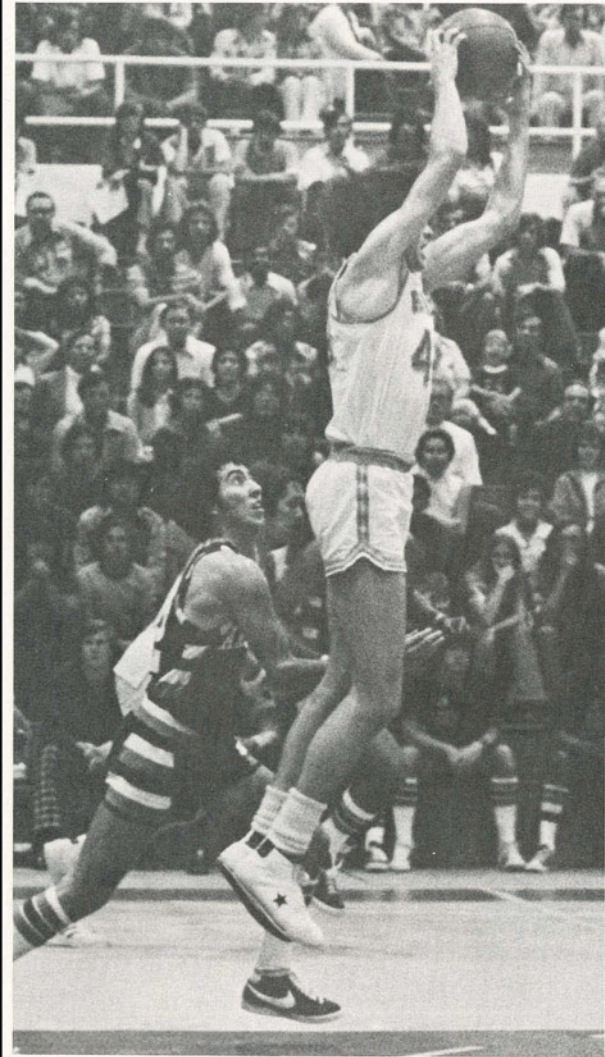


Pan American Wins 115-65

After traveling to Commerce the next day the Javelinas lost to East Texas 82-72.

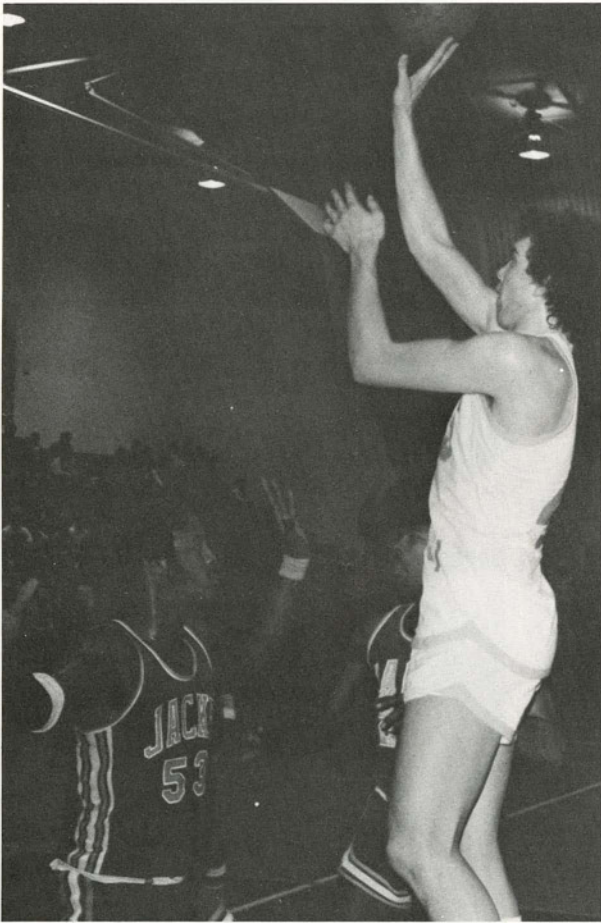

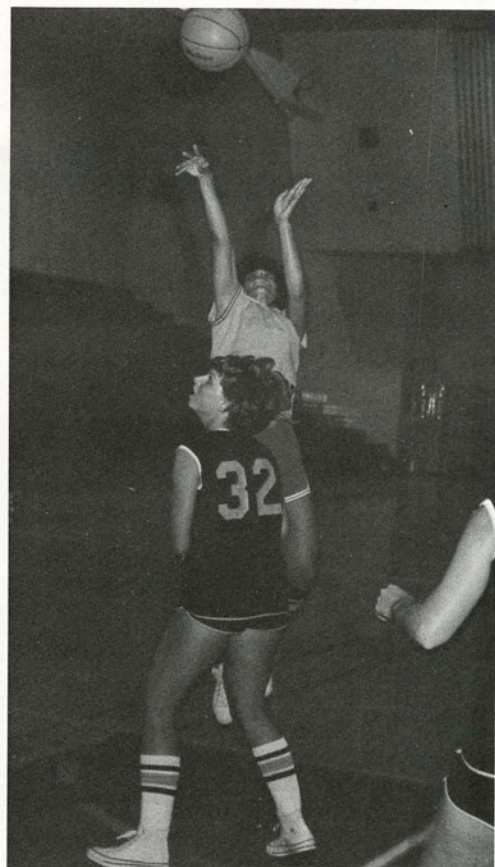
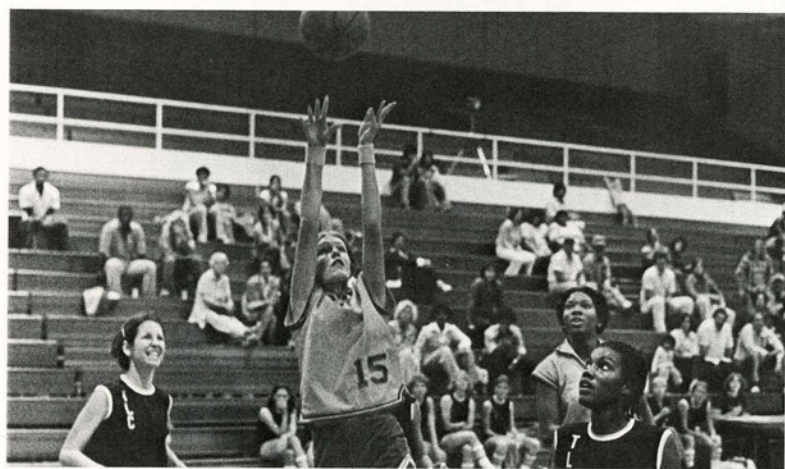
The Hogs ended their season on the road winning two of their last three games.

A&I had three players selected for the All-LSC team. James Johnson was chosen to the first team and Bobby Kinzer and Eric Staten were selected to the second team.

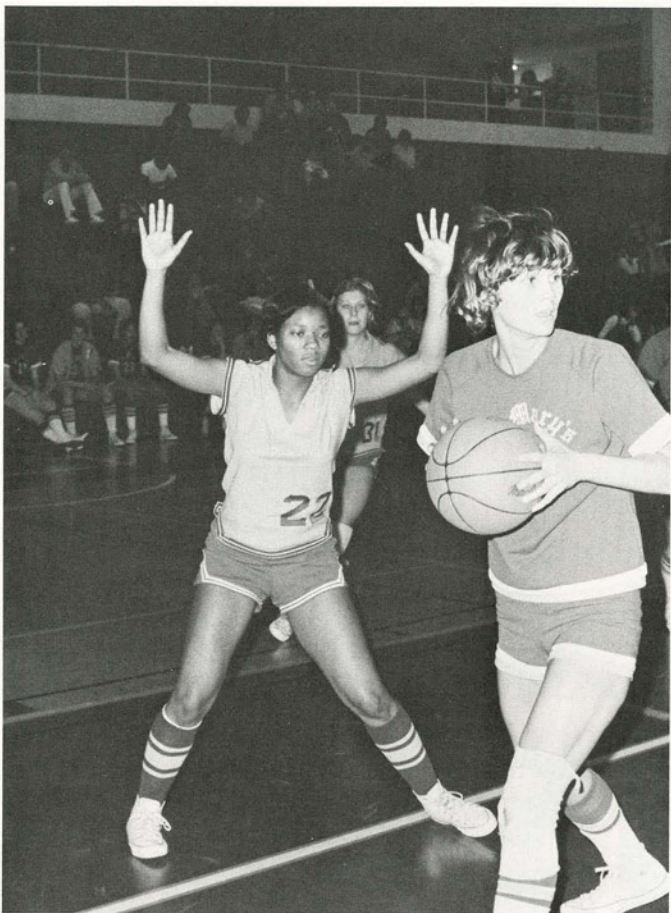

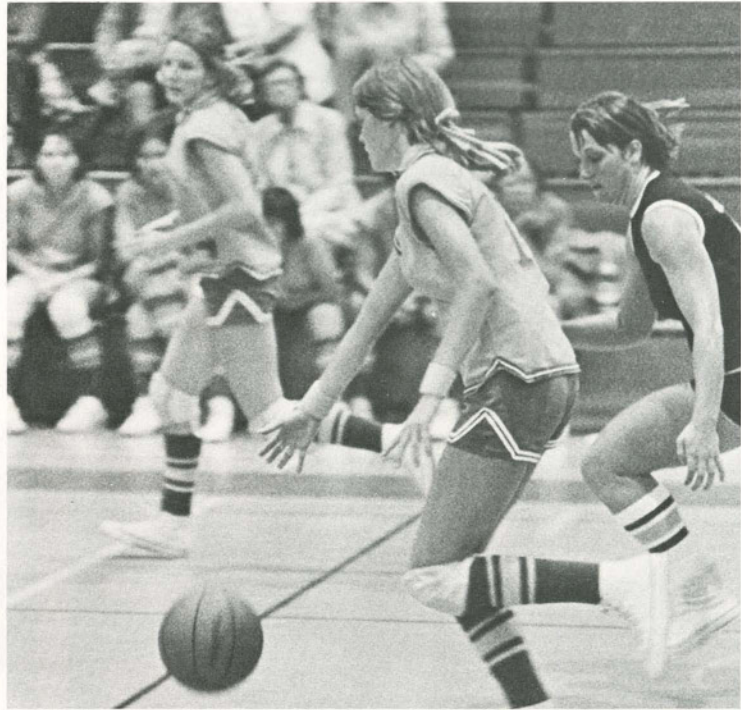


Determination Was Shown In Every Game

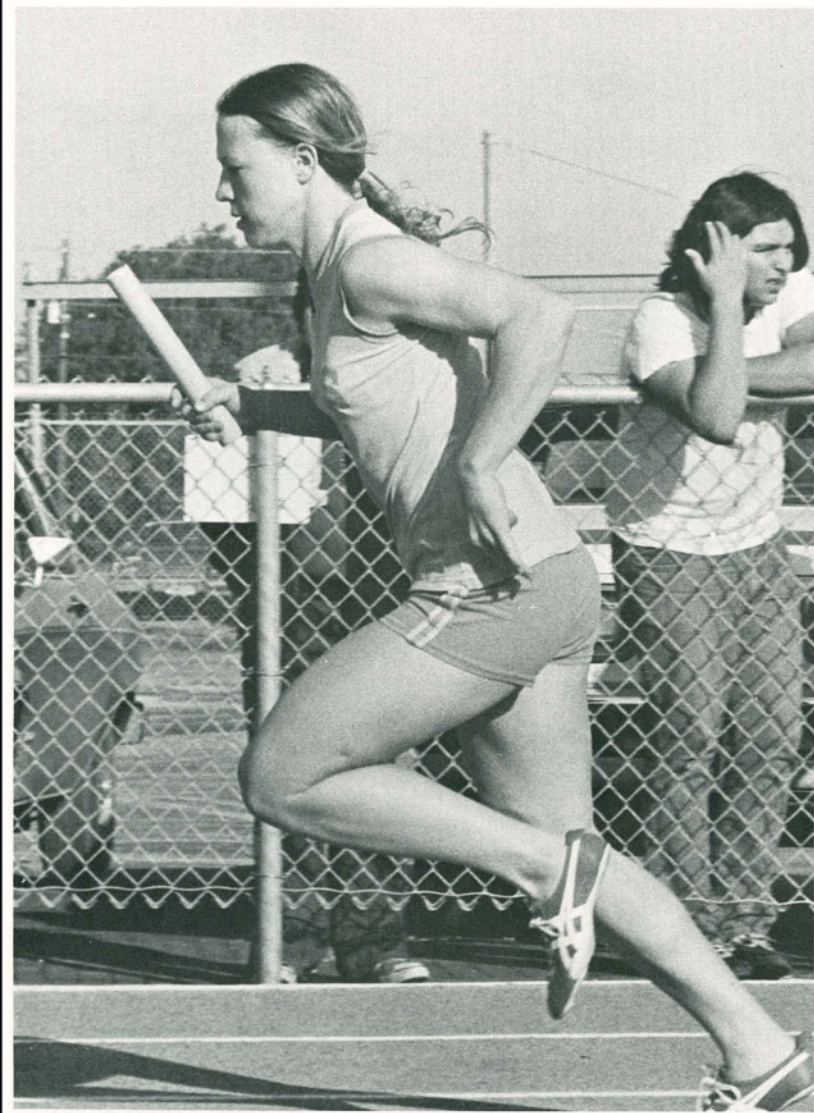




Track Cont'd

Coach Diaz was impressed with the number on the team this year after having only four people run last year.

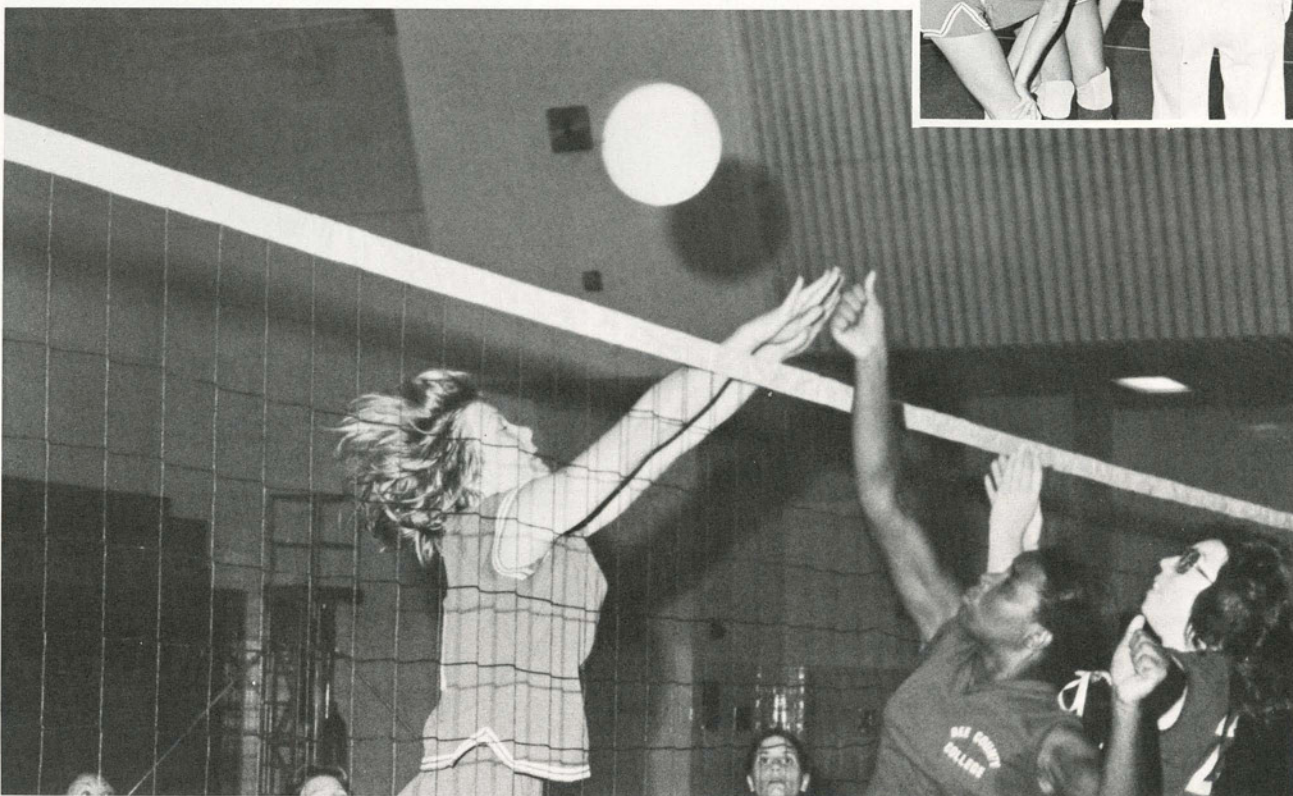
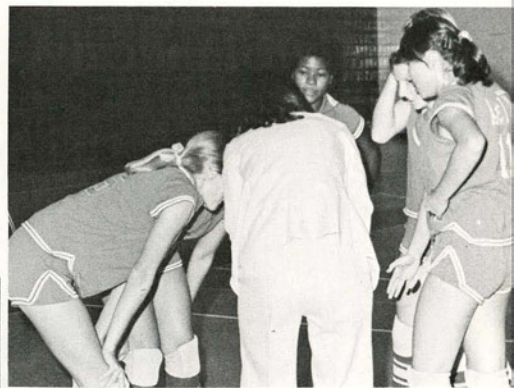
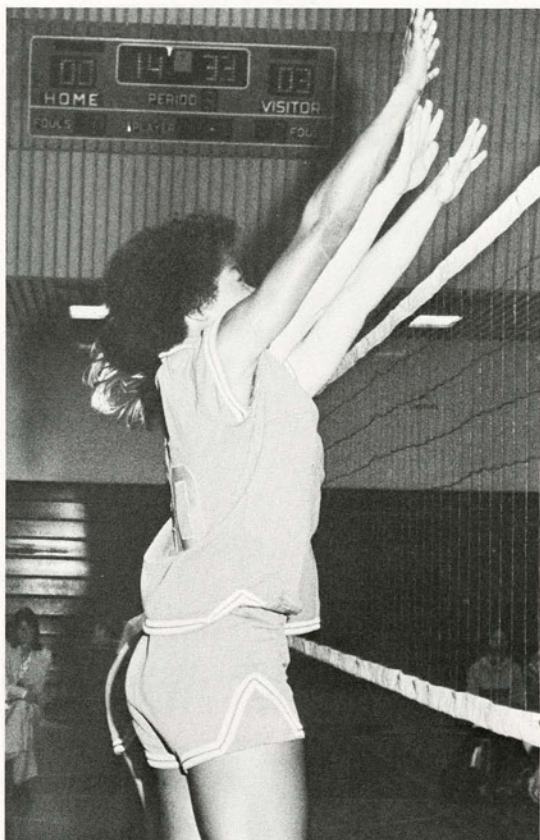

The title was won with a 6-0-1 record. A&I finished this season as the only undefeated team in the Division II South. They will move into TCSL Division I next year because of the division title.

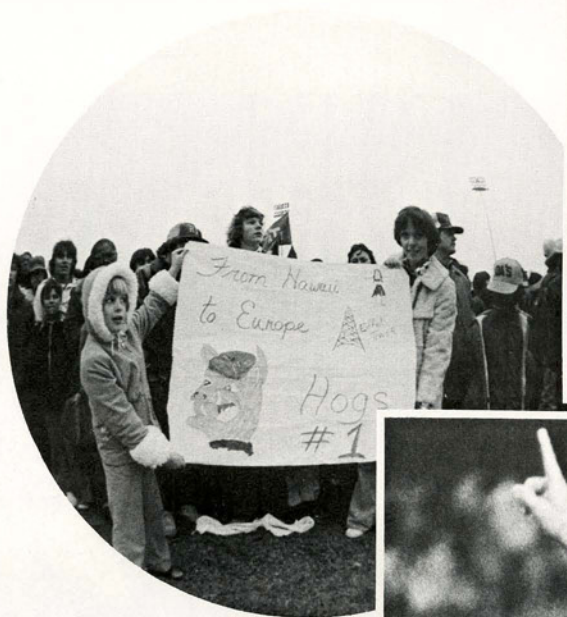


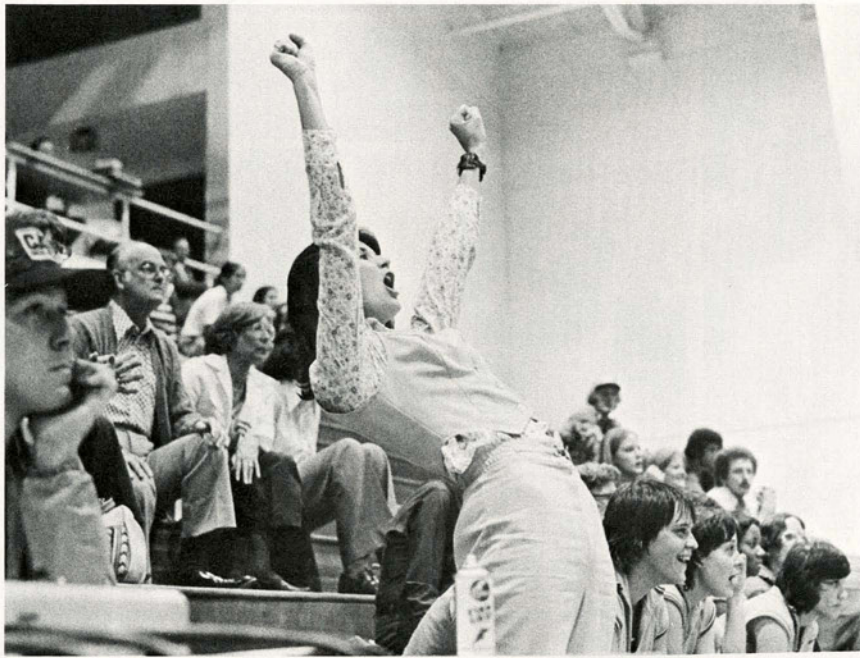
