Tours of 1909 King High School will be available during Art Walk

The King High Historical Foundation was formed in 2008 to implement the authentic rehabilitation of the 1909 King School.

Helen Kleberg Groves, granddaughter of Henrietta M. King, widow of King Ranch founder Capt. Richard King, started the fundraising efforts with a donation of \$1,000,000, along with donations from alumni groups and supporters.

A fundraising committee was formed under the chairmanship of Annette Peterson and members Sharron Farris, Sam Fugate, Kimberlee Garza, Toni Nagel, Cate Smith and Sylvia Woelfel.

Asbestos remediation has been completed and the inside of the structure has been totally cleaned out. The tile roof has been reconstructed with many of the original tiles used.

Demolition of the LASER building classroom on the south side of the school has been

completed. Graduates and many supporters feel that the rehabilitation of the original H.M. King High School, listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1966, and recorded as a Texas Historic Landmark with a marker erected in 1981, can become a reality with donations from people who treasure this unique building.

Tours of the building will be available to the general public on Saturday, Nov. 5 at 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. during the Downtown Art Walk.

Dolores Price, well renowned watercolor artist, has graciously donated a watercolor of the H.M. King School. Hall of Frames has contributed the framing for the beautiful watercolor.
